





Herb Crowder Honored At Retirement



This year we must say good-bye to an outstanding man who has been at Northwest College for nearly thirty years. Herbert W. Crowder came to N.C. in 1955 as an assistant to the President in fundraising and then in 1957 became the Business Manager. In 1966, **Rev. Crowder** became the Director of Development, the position he has held since. As Director of Development, **Rev. Crowder** spends most of his time off campus, traveling to churches in N.C.'s supporting districts to raise the necessary funds for the college's development.

Before coming to Northwest College, **Rev. Crowder** held business and sales positions in several companies, including Zellerbach Paper Company and Johns-Manville. He received a diploma from LaSalle Extension University.

Being involved in the training of ministers and lay people at N.C. is not something new to Rev. Crowder, as he was himself a pastor for some 18 years in Washington churches, including churches in Auburn and Colfax. He was licensed by the Northwest District of the Assemblies of God in 1932 and ordained in 1935. While living in Tacoma, he served on the board of Youth For Christ. He was also the vice president of the board of Morning Cheer Radio Broadcast several years ago. Currently, Rev. Crowder is a member of the Kirkland Kiwanis and a member of the board of the Chamber of Commerce. He and Dolly, his wife of eight years, are members of Bellevue Neighborhood Church. The newest dormitory facility, Crowder Hall, is named in honor of him. This year Rev. Crowder is officially retiring from his position at N.C., but we shouldn't be surprised if we see him on campus periodically. After all, it would be difficult to break a habit of almost 30 years! Perhaps, though, in his retirement he will have more time for his other passion, golf, and other things he enjoys - his daughter, two grandchildren, two areatgrandchildren, and hunting. Rev. Crowder, we thank you very much for your tremendous and faithful contribution to Northwest College over the years - we really do appreciate you and will miss you!



Over the years, members of the faculty and administration have been honored for a variety of noteworthy reasons. This year **Rev. Sherman "Skip" Bennett**, a motivated and hard working young man

Skip Bennett is a man of many abilities and responsibilities. As the Director of Public Relations of Northwest College, he is responsible for new student recruitment: all printed promotional material that goes out from the college; the training and scheduling of the Summer Ministry Teams; assistance in planning various activities, such as Parent's Weekend and Campus Day; and advising the Karisma on Business matters.

Although this is only **Skip's** third year as PR director, Northwest College is not an unfamiliar place to him. **Skip** attended N.C. from 1962-1966. Public relations is not a new thing to him either, as he was a member of the traveling choir and of a PR group, the Conquerors, while he was here as a student.

It is very evident to us at N.C. that Skip has a very special place in his heart for young people. Gale, his wife, told us that he always said he would die a youth pastor. After leaving N.C. in 1966, Skip was minister of youth and music at the Church by The Side of the Road in Seattle, then at Yakima Stone Church, at Angle Lake Neighborhood Church, and finally at Spanaway Assembly of God. Skip, we thank you very much for your contribution to Northwest College and to Karisma. We really do appreciate you. Oh, yes, we will "keep smiling!"


Mrs. Stewart Honored For Her Many Talents

"Mr. G" Honored For 18 Years Of Service





et light shine out in the great Northwest'' — that's the opening phrase of Northwest College's alma mater. For fifty years this light has been penetrating, increasing in intensity far beyond the earliest dreams of the College's founders.

The record is impressive. Over ten thousand students have passed through these halls. More than three thousand graduates — pastors, teachers, missionaries, leaders, associate ministers, lay persons — a veritable army encircling the globe. The light has penetrated to the far corners of the earth.

Foundational Years: 1934-1949



he early sparks that ignited this vision were almost lost. From unsuccessful attempts at beginning a school in the Centralia area, no sustained flame was realized. Then the light began to kindle in the vision of a pastor in Fargo, North Dakota, Henry H. Ness. A Presbyterian pastor was praying in those days for a Bible School in the Green Lake area of Seattle. He later acknowledged that Northwest Bible Institute was the answer to that prayer.

Founded under the auspices of the Northwest District Council of the Assemblies of God, Northwest College opened to students on October 1, 1934. Dr. Henry Ness - then pastor of Hollywood Temple — became the first president (initially referred to as the principal), and the school was housed in the church facilities. Although helping to fan the early flame, the District assumed no financial obligation for keeping the flame burning.

Eighteen students formed the first class, and the first student to register was Edithora Glew (nee Owen). Through the years this first student not only became a part of the ministry herself, but now points to a son-in-law, Richard, and a grandson, Kevin, also graduates of Northwest College in full-time ministry. The light has reflected from heart to heart. The story has been repeated numerous times.

The early years of the school found a largely voluntary faculty and staff; great emphasis was placed on practices and prayer. Instructors included E.V. Bronson, J.A. Bogue, Delbert Cox, P.S. Jones, and Helen Giles. Serving as matron was Mrs. A.B. Christenson. First full-time Dean was C.C. Beatty, whose rendition of "40 Years Ago" will long be remembered by scores of early students. Fondly, students referred to Brother Beatty as "Grace" and




to **President Ness**, of a bit stronger disposition, as "Law." Both men, from their giftedness, left a profound impact on the students.

The first graduating class from Northwest Bible Institute was the class of 1937. It was forty-five strong, with twice as many ladies as men. **Harry Pennington**, the class president, was one of the first among nearly 350 missionaries who received their training at Northwest College — an enviable record. There was a great "togetherness" in this early

student body, as evidenced by the send-off of the **Tangens**, missionaries to the Far East. The whole student body was present dockside to see them off.

The forties brought the war years and growing enrollment — 258 student total at the beginning of the decade. "Johnny came marching home again," and scores of veterans swelled the ranks of students to a high of 382 in 1946. That total would not be surpassed again until 1965.










The year 1949 was a significant year for Northwest College. Its founder and President, **Dr. Henry Ness**, resigned to accept appointment as Chairman of the State Board of Prison Paroles. The year also marked the beginning of four-year programs in the College curriculum.

The Developmental Years: 1949-1966.





od had a man prepared to fill the presidency during times especially challenging to the College. Henry Ness had aiven birth to a vision; now a new era of development was needed. Charles E. Butterfield, after years of successful pastoring in Everett, Washington, came to the helm of Northwest College (then Northwest Bible Institute), and the light spread. The Board of Control of the College was regionalized to include other districts within the Assemblies of God: Montana, 1951; Southern Idaho, 1957; Alaska, 1967; Wyomina, 1975. In 1953 the College received accreditation with the American Association of Bible Colleges. In 1955 a liberal arts division was organized.

Perhaps the highlight of the Butterfield years is found in the now-famous "Miracle Story." The conditions needed to get this property; the raising of monies; the absolute miracles that happened; the tireless work of men such as R.J. Carlson, H.W. Crowder, H.J. Secrist, President Butterfield, and the planning commission are chronicled elsewhere. Suffice it to say, Northwest Bible College had a new base from which its light would shine, and the intensity grew. Ground-braking took place in 1958 and seldom has the sound of construction ceased since.

The original plan called for a campus to service four hundred students; enrollment has sometimes doubled that in recent years. Since completion of the new campus, enrollment has climbed steadily. In 1966, after many years of dedicated leadership, C.E. Butterfield stepped aside as President of Northwest College.

A new freeway planned for the city of Seattle threatened and eventually eliminated the old Hollywood Temple, then occupied by the College. The congregation

of Calvary Temple, formerly Hollywood Temple, had built new facilities across the street from the old building.


Thus, property search was begun. In God's providence and timing, choice acreage became available as government surplus in Houghton, Washington (since annexed to Kirkland). President Butterfield, sensing God's leading, knelt on one of the old foundations (this had been a war housing project) and claimed it for the College.







he Midwest was again to provide leadership for Northwest College. D.V. Hurst, who had served at national

leadership levels with the Assemblies of God and who had attended North Central Bible College in Minneapolis, Minnesota a model in the early days for became the third President in Northwest College's history. Under his articulate and competent administration, the College has continued to expand and its "light" to burn brighter than ever. A master plan has been adopted and numerous buildings added to the campus. Guy Hall was completed, Gray and Crowder Halls built to accomodate the growing student body, the dining hall enlarged. More classrooms were needed, so the Learning Center was built. The Library was moved from the basement of the Chapel to a building contructed purposely to house the growing collection of books. Plant facilities, curriculum have all expanded, a new level of academics reached without sacrificing the original intent of the College. In 1973 Northwest College became regionally accredited with the Northwest







Association of Schools and Colleges. Northwest College had come ''of age.''

Children's MIG






Evangelism MIG


year and so it was cancelled. However, a new activity,



Graduation



With thoughts of the future, the forty-seventh graduating class of Northwest College participated in the Commencement exercises on Memorial Day weekend.


Commencement speaker **G**. **Raymond Carlson**, Assistant General Superintendent of the Assemblies of God, challenged the graduates.






Open Dorms



All-School Bonfire










Intramural Football


Mens Basketball



The married students are having a great year by keeping themselves busy with a variety of activities. Watch out N.C. — the married students are alive and well this year!




Summer Ministry Teams
