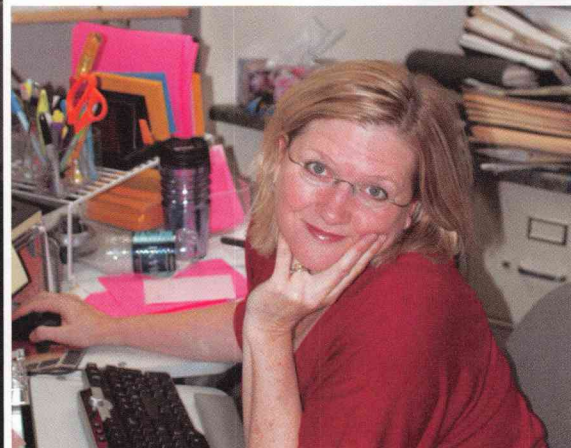
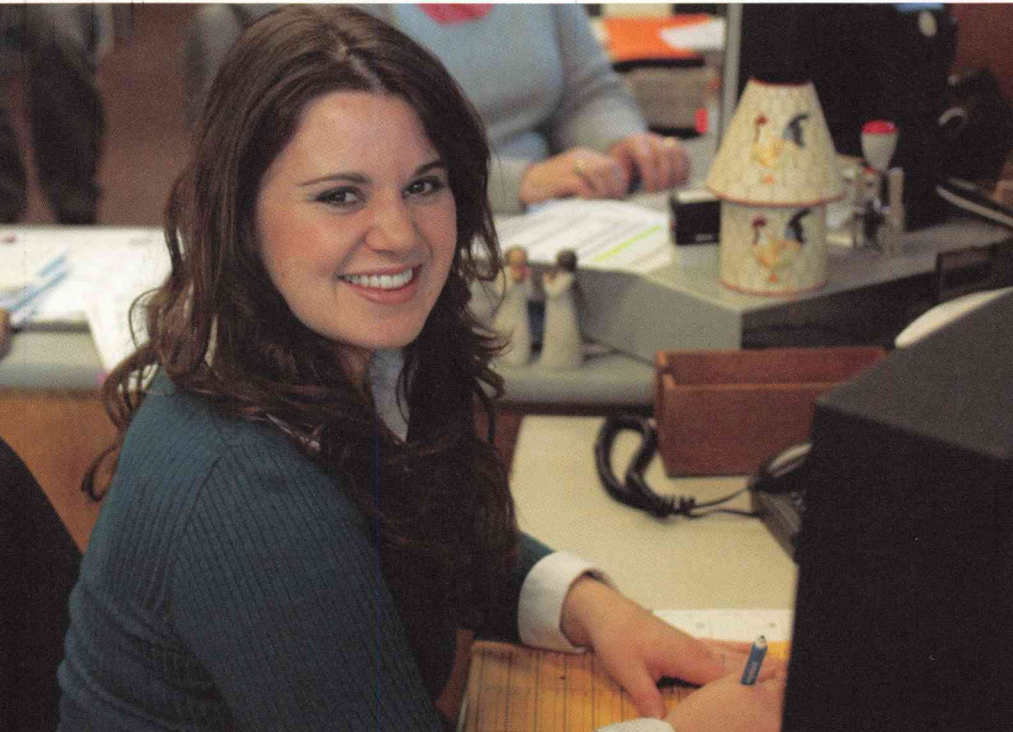
school of nursing
