




2000 Teens descend on our campus!

Mission of Mercy commits start-up funds for Nursing School!

Mission of Mercy has announced a grant of \$100,000 to launch the Mark and Huldah Buntain School of Nursing at Northwest College. The grant will fund expenses associated with starting the new nursing school, including faculty, equipment, and programs.

"This program is special," states **Dr. Don Argue**, President of Northwest College. "It is focused specifically to serve students who are pursuing nursing from a sense of calling. Every graduate from the Buntain

School of Nursing will be equipped to take nursing to a wide range of fields... from the suburban hospital, to the urban street clinic, to the most challenging third-world outreach.

"We are thrilled by Mission of Mercy's generous support. It is exactly what we needed to get the program started," said Dr. Argue.

"As soon as we receive the necessary approvals from the state and accrediting agencies, we'll begin to enroll students," reports **Dr. Marshall Flowers**, Senior Vice President.

"Our desire is for the first students to begin their studies in the Fall of 2000."

The program will award a four-year Bachelor of Science Degree in Nursing.

"Mission of Mercy is helping to meet the physical and spiritual needs of hurting people in poverty-stricken areas of the world," explains **Bob Houlihan**, President of Mission of Mercy. "Our partnership with Northwest College is more than funding. We have supported this vision from the beginning and eagerly anticipate the next steps."

We know that many young men and women choose a college based on the advice of a pastor, parent, or friend.


That is why the alumni and friends of this college are so important.

What is the goal of chapel?

The chapel service each day is the largest community event that the campus has.

We are also challenged by the men and women who speak in chapel. They do more than just talk. They *model* what it means to be a Christian leader.


I see the chapel service as being uniquely *formational* in the spiritual lives of our students.

What are your other duties?

I'm charged with teaching one class each semester. This semester it's "Pentecostal Doctrines", in which we discuss our movement and its strengths.

What really excites me about teaching is seeing the "aha" – that moment when a student suddenly sees something they never knew before.

In my entire life of teaching and ministry, I hope to have a significant influence on 50 students. To be there at critical moments in their lives and help point them in the right direction.



My office is in the **Pecota Student Center**. Every day I think about **Dan Pecota**, who was my mentor when I was a student. He exemplified what it means to be a Christian. He was deeply in love with Jesus, and was a disciplined academic force. He was the whole package. I hope to be like him.

So you deal exclusively with students?

No! Actually, the Dean of the Chapel is charged with serving the entire campus community, including faculty and staff.

This is just beginning to take shape, but it is very exciting.

What about outreach efforts?

I work with the elected student officers to direct and coordinate outreach efforts. This includes evangelism and missions efforts, as well as internships and relationships with local churches.

We are trying to maintain and strengthen the historic outreach efforts of our students—such as street evangelism in Seattle—even as we develop new ministries.

One of our most exciting outreaches is HOPE, in which our students visit children in hospitals. Sometimes they take puppets or clowns, other times they simply spend time with these ill children.

And there are dozens of other student ministries!


What has surprised you the most?

(The following information comes from an article *God's Protective Hand* in their **UPDATE** publication.)

Their truck was totally loaded with trunks (containing household items) including all the back seats. The only available seats left were the driver and passenger seats. So Kim and Jacob (3) were going to sit in the passenger seat for a short ride to their home.

A small pick-up pulled in front of them as they were exiting the gate at the Latin American Child Care (LACC) office. Two young men jumped out with weapons waving and demanded them to get out of the truck. They told Kim to get in the back seat, but thanks to the Lord, the back was full of trunks. She said "I can't! Look at the trunks." They agreed and told Kim and Jacob to get lost. Holding her son close she stepped back and away from the vehicle.

On Greg's driving side, one of them told Greg to get in the middle on top of the console. A weapon was put to his stomach and he was told "I will kill you right here." Greg got in and experienced the scariest ride of his life. They continued threatening with guns, and at one place they rammed right through a car.

The secretaries at the LACC office were calling the police and praying with Kim. Back in the vehicle, the two men were still threatening Greg's life, but as the traffic began to get heavier, they took a short cut through a gas station. At that time, Greg's secondary alarm system shut the car off because he had not disarmed it when the car was started. After more serious threats with the weapons, and much confusion, Greg realized prayers were working.

In a moment it was over and Greg was able to jump out of the passenger door and run. The men didn't follow.

Because of this terrible ordeal, and dealing with nightmares and fear, the Roanes returned to the States for healing and counseling. They have now relocated to a new field with LACC.

Just imagine it! Being in the Land of the Bible! Walking where Jesus lived and preached (Capernaum).
