The View from Ground Zero

Meetings that were planned months ago took me to New York City and Washington, D.C. in recent weeks.

I am still processing the sights, smells and sounds; my thoughts have been dominated by the destruction I witnessed and by the conversations I had with our leaders.

At The Pentagon

My first visits were at the Pentagon. The damage there is sobering, and the mood in D.C. is very tense.

I had a 40-minute meeting with the Chief of Naval Operations, **Admiral Vernon Clark**. (He is the son of **E. M. Clark**, a great man and mentor with whom I served in the 1970s.)

Vern has a total of 186,000 people under his command!

We had an in-depth time of prayer and scripture reading.

I believe his heart is still heavy: he lost 42 staff in the Pentagon attack.

At The Justice Dept.

Attorney General John
Ashcroft invited me to the
Justice Department for lunch.

(He and I have been friends since we were young boys. Our friendship grew when I was at Evangel College where his father, **J. Robert Ashcroft**, was president. Our friendship has deepened significantly in

the last 15 years during an annual retreat we attend.)

We spent a meaningful hour together. Despite the pressure of his position – or perhaps because of it – John has grown tremendously.

In fact, *The Washington Times*, on October 11, 2001, carried an article that took one-quarter of a page and had a headline that read, "John Ashcroft has become a Statesman."

John and I had a powerful time of prayer together.

Are We Ready?

Here is what struck me most after my time in D.C....

Both the Admiral and the Attorney General caused me to wonder if our nation is really ready for a War on Terrorism.

I was left wondering if we will forget about this tragedy.

I was also left wondering about what continues to happen behind the scenes. I'm wondering what further tragedy our military, FBI, and other government agencies have already averted.

In New York City

A week after my trip to D.C., I found myself in New York City, including three hours of work alongside ministers and counselors at Ground Zero.

Here are the things that struck me most in New York:

• The vacant sky.

I have flown to New York City scores of times over many years.

(Right after I finished college, my wife Pat and I

We cannot forget our many blessings!

Even as I was saddened by the devastation in Washington, D.C. and New York City, there were incredible blessings as well!

Our newest grandchild, Christina, is an answer to prayer – literally. She was in serious jeopardy at birth, but she is now doing fine.

Our new duplexes are now fully occupied with staff and faculty. These beautiful units – 14 in all – are the first new buildings on our campus in nearly 20 years! served at *Teen Challenge* in New York with **David Wilkerson**; I've been there many times since.)

Seeing the skyline has become natural to me... but this time it was very unnatural to see the gaping hole in the skyline where the WTC once stood proud.

Vulnerability

If two non-military planes (no guns, no bombs) could cause this much destruction, how vulnerable are we? Rubble

Although there is a great deal of rubble, it seemed miniscule to what I expected from these immense buildings. I thought I would find a piece of concrete to take with me as a reminder of the tragedy, but there was not a single fragment to be found. No glass. No concrete.

Just mangled steel, ash and dust... lots of dust.

The glass, concrete, and plaster were all reduced to a cloud of ash and dust in mere moments.



One Place; Two Purposes

The work is going very slow because Ground Zero is both a crime scene and a sacred burial ground.

During my time there, only two dump trucks left the site.
And it seems eerie.

I'm told that it continues to burn below the surface, a furnace heated to over a thousand degrees.

While I was there a large shaft of orange flame burst from the rubble, accompanied by thick, acrid smoke.

Yes, the site was sanctified by those who were murdered there... but it also seemed like Hell on earth.

A Time to Refocus

My experiences of the past few weeks have caused me to refocus on what is really important.

So what *is* important?
This is a great day for the gospel. This has been a wake-up call to our nation, and many are finding their way back to God.

People are realizing that their lives are built on shifting sand; we can invite them to join us on The Solid Rock.

Invest in People

Buildings and other emblems of our prosperity won't stand.

Thankfully, most will fall to time and normal wear, not terrorism. But fall they will.

Our focus must be on people.

For example, are you praying everyday for our leaders (1Timothy 2)?

Invest in Eternity

Some say that the American people invented philanthropy.

We have demonstrated that again with the outpouring of support for the families of the 9/11 victims.

Many friends close to the College have been telling me that recent events have caused them to reprioritize.

We must invest in what matters most; we must invest in eternity.

A Good Investment

Northwest College is a good investment.


God is doing a profound work in the lives of our students as they prepare to *Carry the Call*.

These times present a fantastic opportunity for our graduates to show Christ's love through hands of compassion.


