
NC'S FIFTY-FIRST COMMENCEMENT

The College's fifty-first commencement held on campus on May 2nd, was a milestone event in a number of ways. It was the first "Saturday" commencement in the history of the College. It was also the first commencement under the College's new semester calendar, concluding the school year about one month earlier than the quarter calendar, making it the earliest ever in the history of NC.

Of more importance was the highlight event in the college careers of the 121 graduates in the class of 1987. Of these graduates, eighty-nine were awarded B.A. degrees; twenty-six, A.A. degrees, one diploma, and five with the new one-year certificate.

The graduating class included persons from Australia, the Far East, Pacific islands, as well as Washington, Oregon, Montana, Alaska, Idaho, Wyoming, and many other states of the union.

Another "first" was the identification of majors completed by the B.A. graduates as their degrees were awarded. Included were graduates for the third year in Elementary Education and Behavioral Science majors. A dominant 70% of all B.A. grads completed majors in Bible and fields of ministerial studies.



The robed graduates, Faculty, Administration and Board followed the colorguard to the college pavilion, which was filled to capacity with parents, friends, and other participants.

Bringing the commencement address was the Reverend Robert Pirtle, Executive Director of the National Home Missions Department, for the General Council of the Assemblies of God.

Two long-time retiring board members were honored. The Reverend Dr. Earl Book, retiring District Superintendent of the Oregon District of the Assemblies of God, received the Delta Tau award.



It was noted that a third generation graduate was among the graduates of the class of 1987 – Mr. John Brewer, son of NC almni Roy and Arlene Brewer and grandson of NC alumni, Walter and Geneveive Wheeler, whose graduation can be tracked to the pioneer days of the college.

It was also noted that among the three members of the family of Leslie and Earlien Martin, missionaries to Singapore, that every member and their spouses, with one exception were either former students or graduates of Northwest College. Family roots among NC grads run deep and reach long to the present day, it was noted by President Hurst at the Commencement.

HONORARY DELTA EPSILON CHI

Six alumni were given honorary membership into the honor society Delta Epsilon Chi for their significant contribution to the work of the Lord. The missionary with the longest continuing service record was given this honor posthumously, and in fact, was selected by the College Awards and Honors committee to be honored just weeks before he was suddenly taken home to his eternal award. He was the Reverend Paul Williscroft, graduate of the class of 1937. On hand to receive the award in his behalf was his widow, Gladys Williscroft.

Highly regarded in his community, Dan is the radio announcer for the local high school sports events in addition to his mainline work as pastor.

Representing the many alumni who have served so effectively in lay ministries throughout the country was Gene Casper of Renton. Gene came to NC with the express purpose of preparing himself for lay ministry and has received high recommendation from his Pastor Darrell Stott.

Selected to represent the several hundred active NC missionaries on the foreign mission field was Leslie Martin (represented by his son, Pastor Bruce Martin of Concrete, Washington). Leslie and Earlien are ICI Directors in Singapore.

Selected for the great impact they have made in founding and directing the FOCUS ministries for Christian singles were Frank and Agnes Schneider, who are highly acclaimed and appreciated by singles throughout the Pacific Northwest and the nation for their contribution to a needy and growing field of ministry to singles.

Thus the story of awards to alumni tells the story of what NC is "all about", observed President Hurst, and "is an appropriate part of the commencement occasion which honors its current grads who will someday come back to tell stories of ministry as have their predecessors".


