Frank Cole, Chairman of the Board of Directors of Northwest College and Superintendent of the Northwest District Council of the Assemblies of God. Rev. Paul Goodman, Vice Chairman of the Board of Directors of Northwest College and Superintendent of the Montana District Council of the Assemblies of God will give the inaugural prayer. An interesting note is that his father, the Rev. Earl Goodman (deceased), gave the Inaugural Prayer for Dr. D.V. Hurst, almost twenty-five years ago.

The Inauguration will be part of a series of activities for the weekend of September 27, 28 and 29, which in-

cludes the annual Alumni Banquet (see below), class reunions and other activities honoring President Davis.

### RECORD NUMBERS TAKE THE PLUNGE INTO 1990 SUMMER SESSION

The 1990 summer College Session successfully involved 188 students in a month of intensive study. The summer curriculum included courses of study in field ecology with emphasis upon Volcano, Ocean and Forest Science, the highly successful China Awareness Seminar, the study of the Doctrine of Man and Sin, Bible courses in Thessalonian Letters, Old Testament Law, Biblical Leadership and New Testament Discipleship, Greek English Studies, and General Education courses in History and Speech Communication. Thirty Northwest College Students were involved also in summer ministry internship programs.



Professor Stewart continued her overseas travel to Brussels, Belgium, to participate in an International Correspondence Institute (ICI) Project.

Professor Turner remained in the Philippines following the China Awareness Seminar. Dr. Turner served as the primary instructor for an Asia Pacific Theological Seminary extension in Cebu City, Philippines.

Dr. Frank Rice spent the month of June in Brussels, Belgium writing a course in Christian Classics for ICI.

Part time faculty member, Nil Molvik, traveled to Brussels, Belgium for an intensive six-week writing project. He created and adapted a mathematics course that will serve as a prerequisite for the ICI Natural Science and Church Business curriculum.

Dr. Dan Pecota and his wife, Esther, traveled to Germany to visit their son, Steve, and family in the context of their ministry to the German people.

# PRC Trip to Hong Kong

May 11, fourteen excited students with traveling Professors Dwayne Turner and Marjorie Stewart walked off the plane into the heat and humidity of Hong Kong. Two weeks of immersion in Chinese culture, opportunities for ministry, and challenges to respond to the needs of Asia best describe the first annual China Awareness Seminar sponsored by the Pacific Rim Centre. But the spiritual growth and deepening of commitment to building the Kingdom of God that resulted in the lives of the students and instructors can be measured only in eternal values.

Each day began with four hours of instruction in Chinese languages, history, culture, and religions. Early China missions was presented along with a look at Christianity in China today. The classes were taught by our own missionaries, Chinese professors and pastors, and by A/G English teachers brought out of China for the Seminar.



Sheri Gardner is one of 14 N.C. students who participated in the China Awareness Seminar in Hong Kong. Tours in the afternoons to temples, the markets, a camp where former drug addicts and prostitutes are rehabilitated and discipled in the Christian life underscored the classroom instruction. The most memorable afternoon was spent at a Vietnamese refugee camp. Eight hundred children gathered in a metal quonset hut in 90 degree plus temperature to listen to our students sing and give a skit on the Good Samaritan.

A highlight of the trip was the weekend in China. Never will any in the group forget worshipping in church on a Sunday morning with Chinese Christians inside China. The weekend concluded with a visit to a university on Monday to observe teachers teaching English as a second language.

#### ALUMNI RETURN TO TEACH

Two Northwest College alumni are returning to campus this Fall to join the faculty. James Lowell ('71) will be serving this year as Missionaryin-Residence, and Paul Melidona ('85) will be joining the Church Music faculty as part-time instructor.

James Lowell and his family have served as Assemblies of God missionaries to India since 1978. In addition to his degree earned at Northwest, Lowell holds a B.A. from the University of Washington, an M.A. from the Assemblies of God Theological Seminary, and is candidate for a D.Min. at the California Graduate School of Theology. As M.I.R., Lowell will teach courses in Missions and Religion, and will work closely with Dr. Dwayne Turner in all phases of the Missions programs on campus, including the Missions Convention held early in the Spring semester.

Since graduating from Northwest in 1985, Paul Melidona has served as music director in Assemblies of God churches in Salem and Bend, Oregon, and has taught at Zion Bible Institute in Barrington, Rhode Island. Along with his classroom teaching, Melidona will direct the Northwest Sounds (the College's traveling ensemble), coordinate instrumental music on campus, and offer private instruction in woodwinds. He will also be directing the music ministries at Renton Assembly of God.
