

General Superintendent, Dr. G. Raymond Carlson, will be the featured guest during the year end activities. He will speak at the Friends and Alumni banquet Friday, May 30th and again in the commencement service June 1st.

General Superintendent Carlson served as Superintendent of the Minnesota District of the Assemblies of God from 1948 to 1961 and then as president of North Central Bible College for eight years from 1961 to 1969. He was elected Assistant General Superintendent in 1969 and served in that post until January 1, 1986 when he assumed the General Superintendency upon his election in the General Council, August of 1985.

Dr. Carlson's interest in the work of higher education in our fellowship runs deep. N.C. is pleased to welcome him back to campus so soon in his new role as General Superintendent.

LARGEST B.A. CLASS EVER

A total of one hundred twenty-four seniors have applied for graduation. This exceeds the previous largest number by twenty-one and reflects the large enrollments of the early eighties. In addition, eighty have applied for A.A. degrees (two year).

Most importantly, this represents a large contingent of trained workers heading for the whitened harvest fields. Jesus said, "Pray ye therefore the Lord of the harvest, that he will send forth laborers into his harvest."

This year's class is once again an answer to that prayer.

LINFIELD CROWDER TO SPEAK AT BACCALAUREATE

Alumnus evangelist Linfield Crowder will bring the baccalaureate address May 30th. Rev. Crowder has returned again and again to N.C. to speak whenever he is in the area or as a featured spiritual emphasis week speaker. He has been likened to a "modern Jeremiah," by those who know him best. As an alumnus he has represented N.C. around the world as an "evangelist at large."

DR. DEL TARR FEATURED


In the spring spiritual emphasis week Dr. Del Tarr, president of California Theological Seminary, and a missionary and cross cultural communications expert, was featured speaker. The week was partially sponsored by the Staley Foundation.

Dr. Tarr spoke on such topics as: "Meaning Making Like the Master;" "Prodigal Love;" "The Far Country at Home;" "Perfume, Tears and Dirty Feet;" and many more.

Not only was the substance of Dr. Tarr's messages of deep meaning to the students but his communication skills so in evidence served as an excellent model. Students saw "the way to do it."

This year has seen a resurgence of interest in Missions at N.C. Fifteen percent of the new students registering in the fall expressed intention to study for a degree in missions. This was up from the 10 percent of last year.

ALUMNUS EVANGELIST TO BE HONORED BY COLLEGE

"Do the work of an evangelist." The injunction of these words from the pen of St. Paul have expressed the life and the "pulse beat" of Northwest College graduate, Linfield Crowder, for over 33 years since his graduation from the college in 1953. The College will honor him with its highest honor, the honorary degree, Doctor of Divinity, at its 50th graduation on May 25th, it was announced at the College today.

The Reverend Mr. Crowder, whose home is in American Falls, Idaho, has been a five-time spiritual emphasis week speaker at the college. He is known as a missionary-evangelist throughout the Assemblies of God fellowship and is a frequent visitor to Israel and the Middle East. He is reknown not only for his frequent ministry and counsel on the campus but for his strong support of Northwest College on the field. Reverend and Mrs. Crowder have had four daughters attend the college including one who served on staff as Assistant Registrar for several years. He will be the first person to receive an honorary doctorate from the College whose ministerial life has been totally devoted to the work of evangelism. Reverend Crowder will be the baccalaureate speaker on May 24th.
