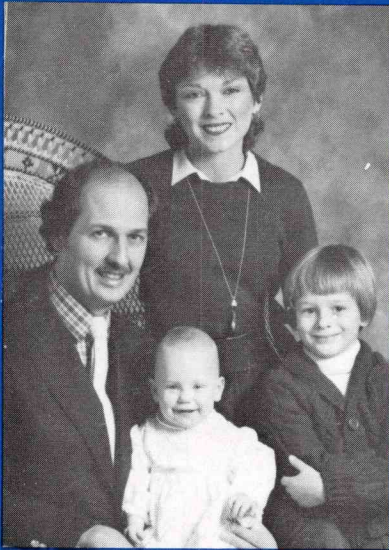


Professor Hobson Honored By Dedication

Campus Day Brings Students From All Over

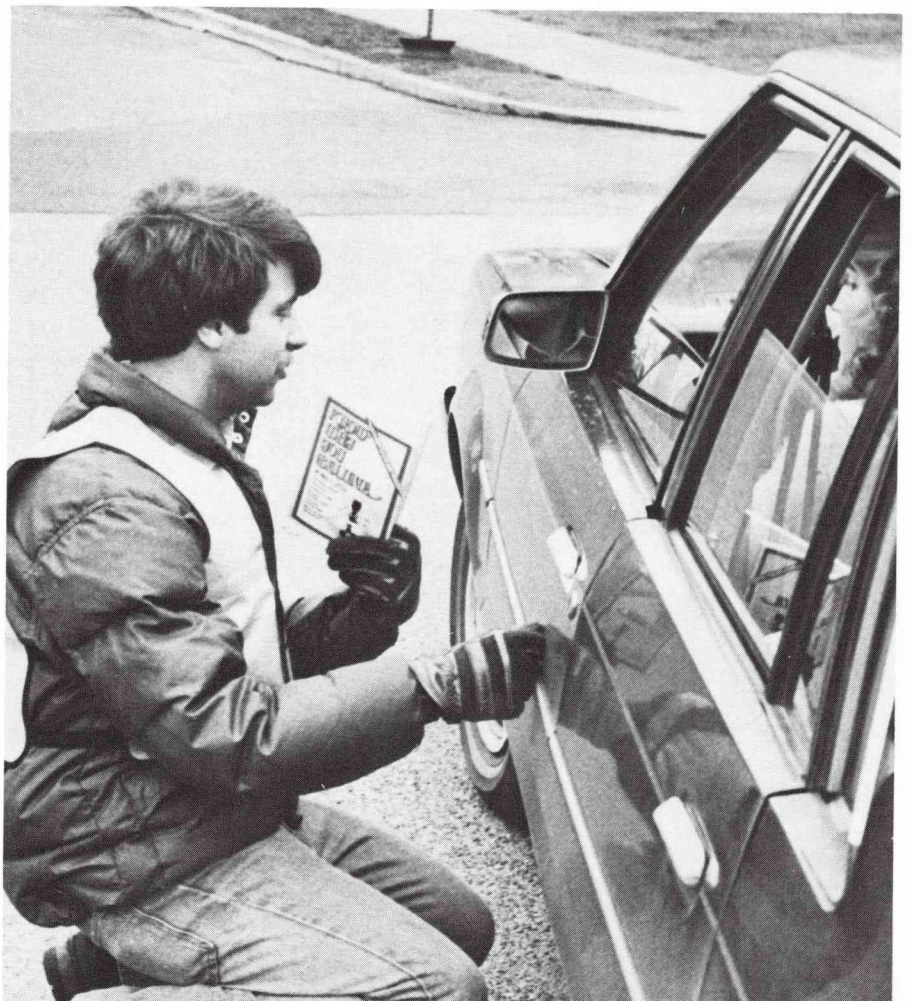

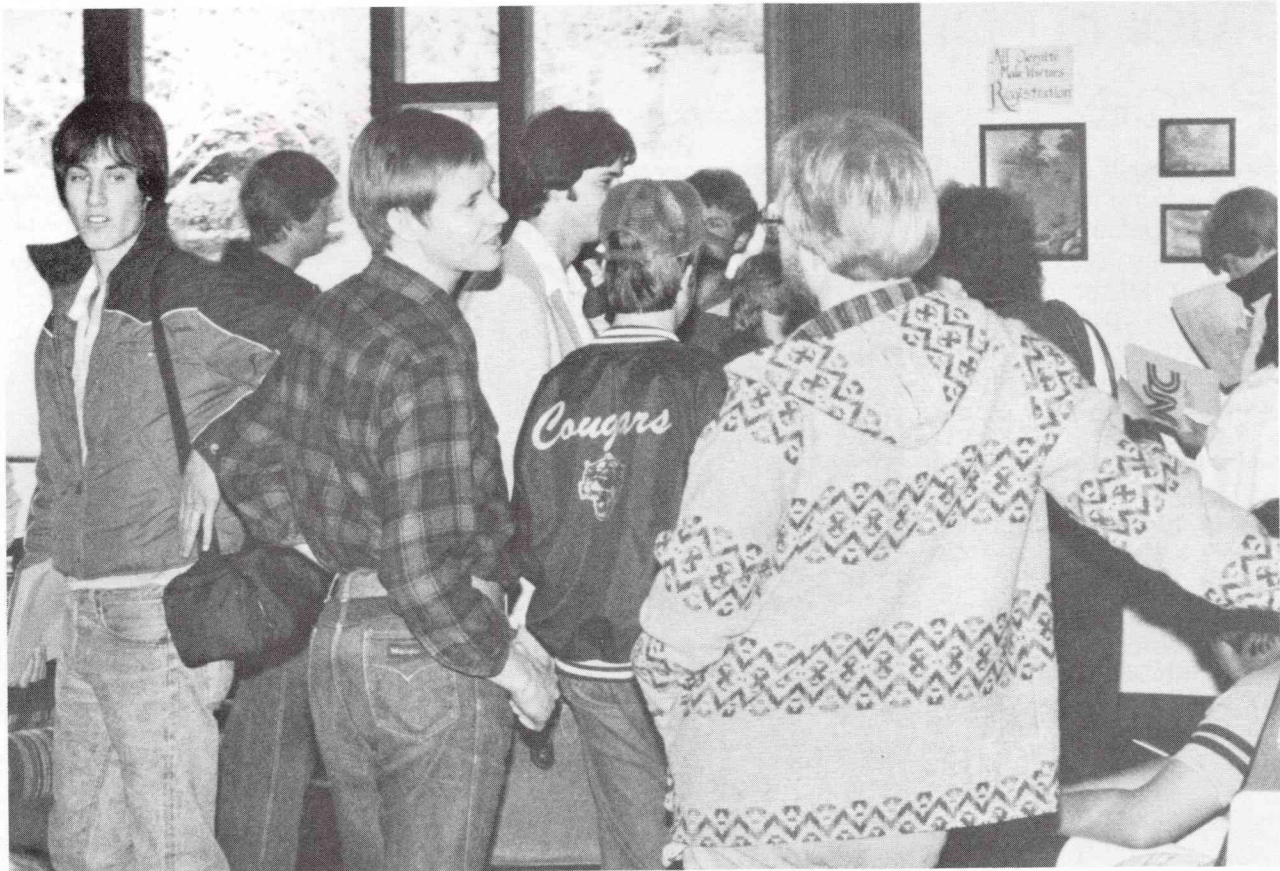

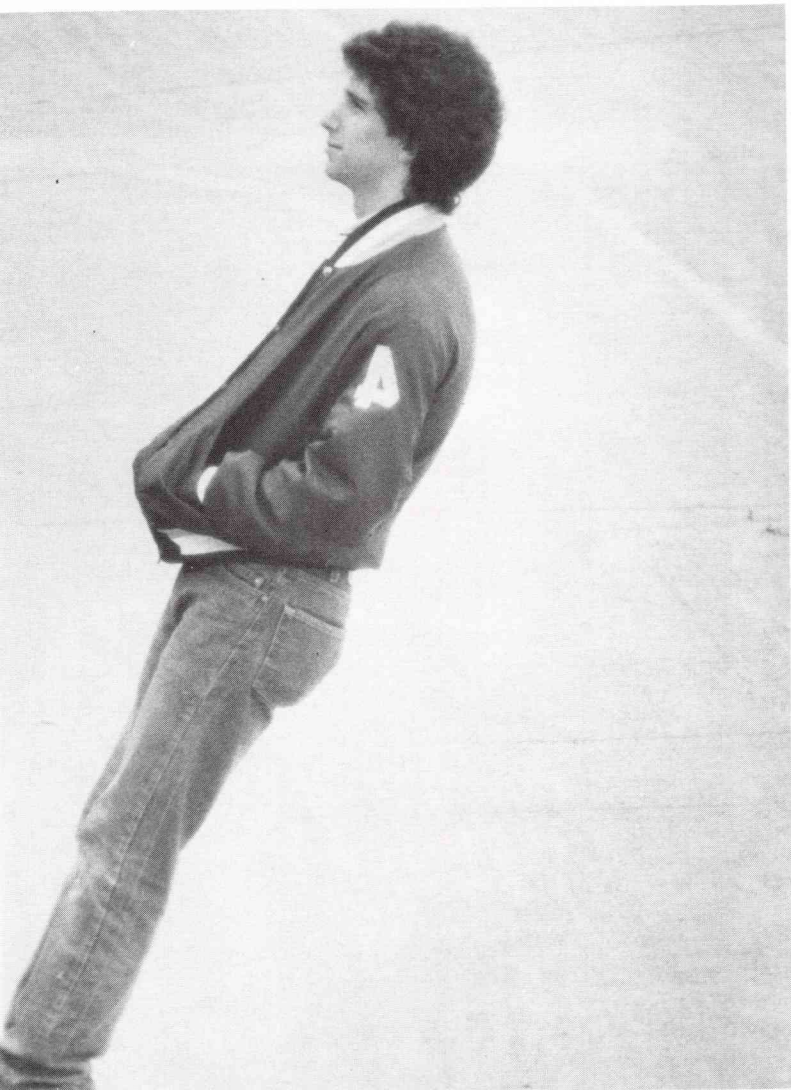

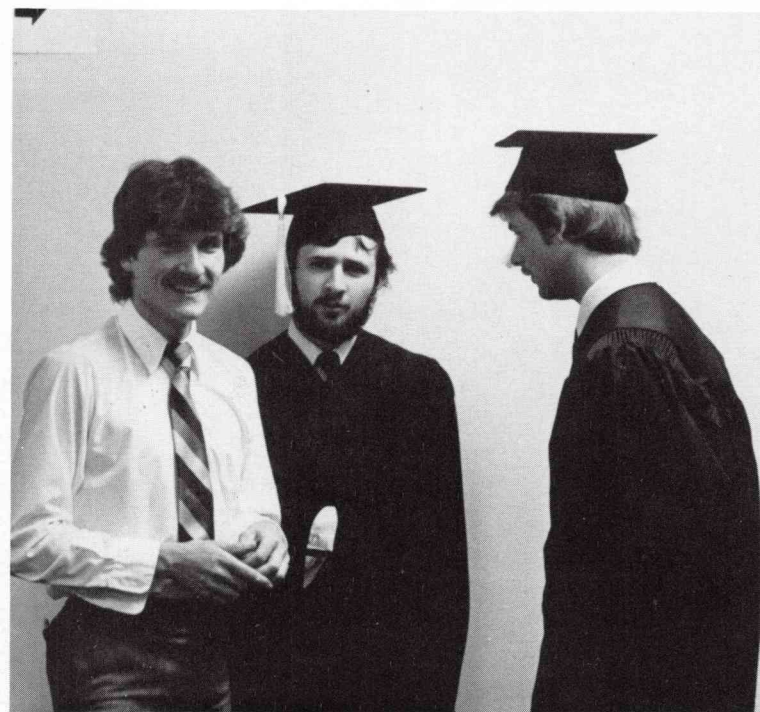

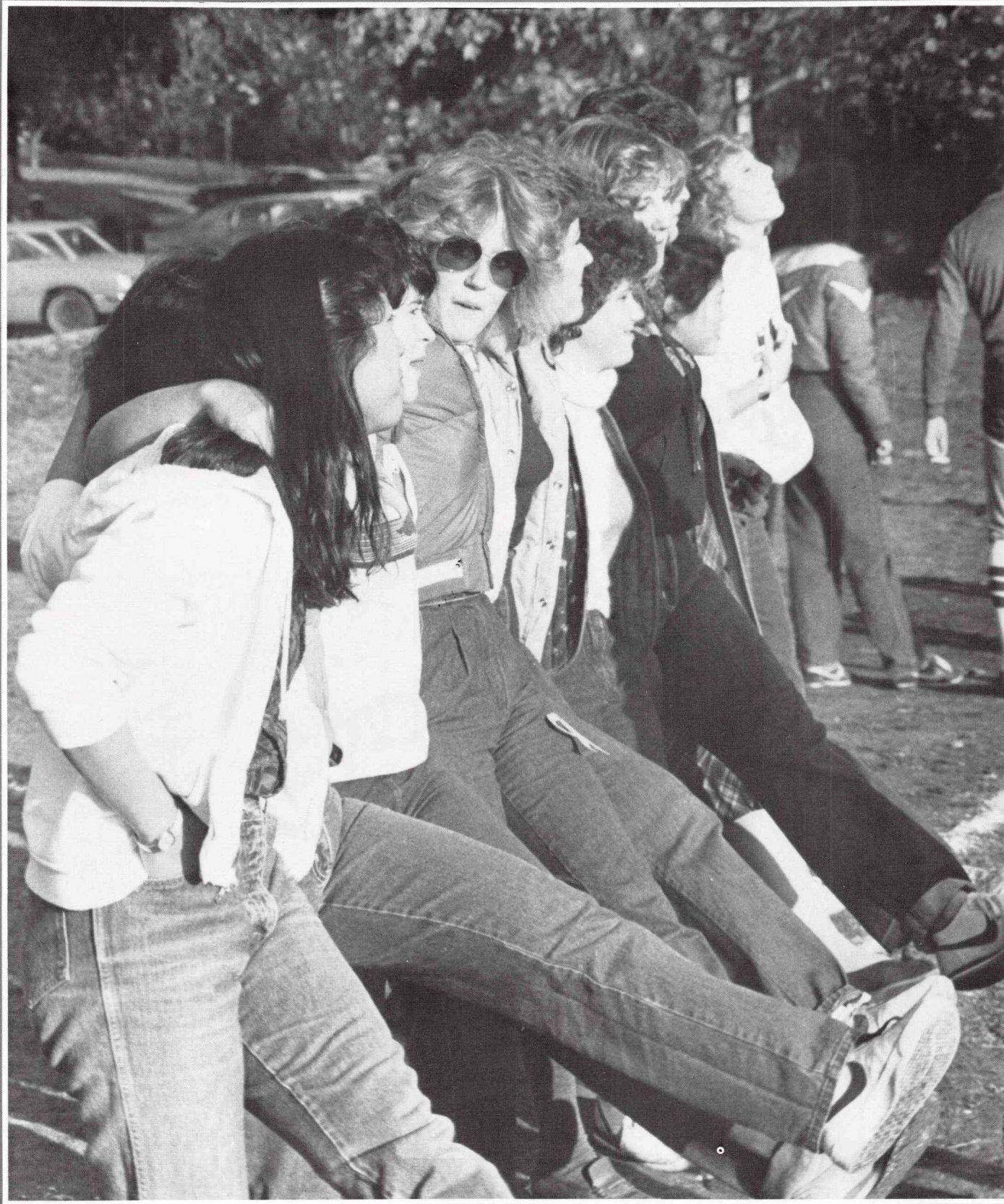

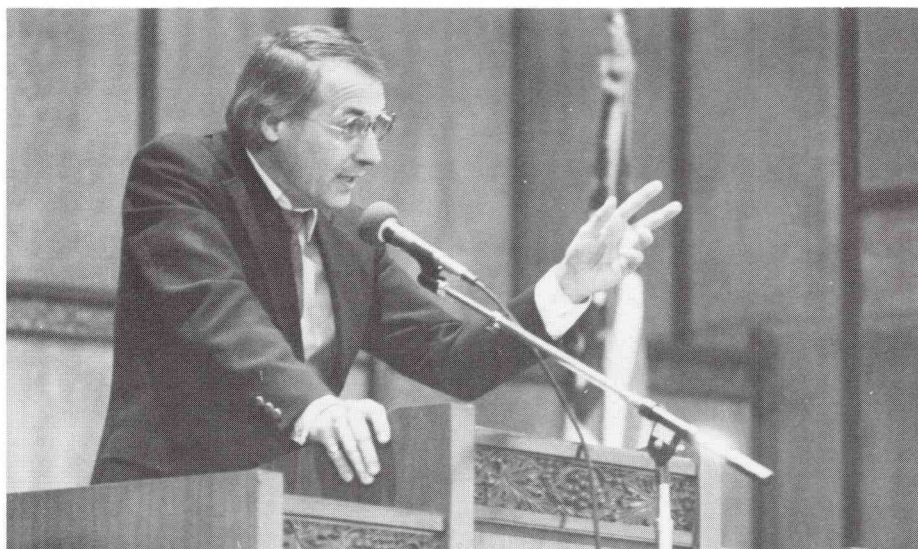
Spiritual Emphasis Week: "God Has All Power!"

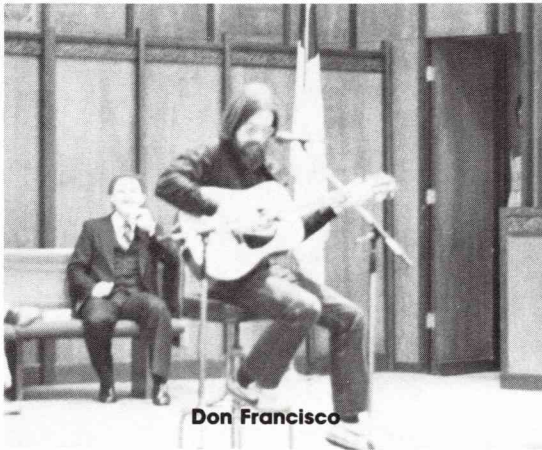

Reverend Johnson's love for the Word and our God came through as each night students wept at the altar. Praying, committing, and recommitting their lives totally to God and His purpose.

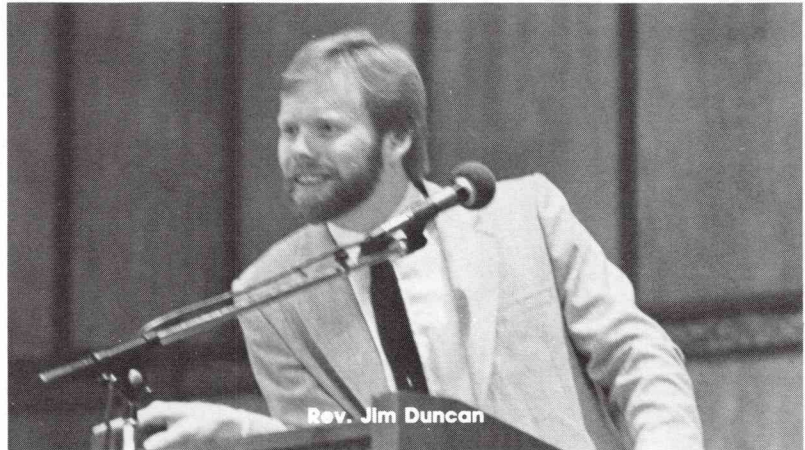

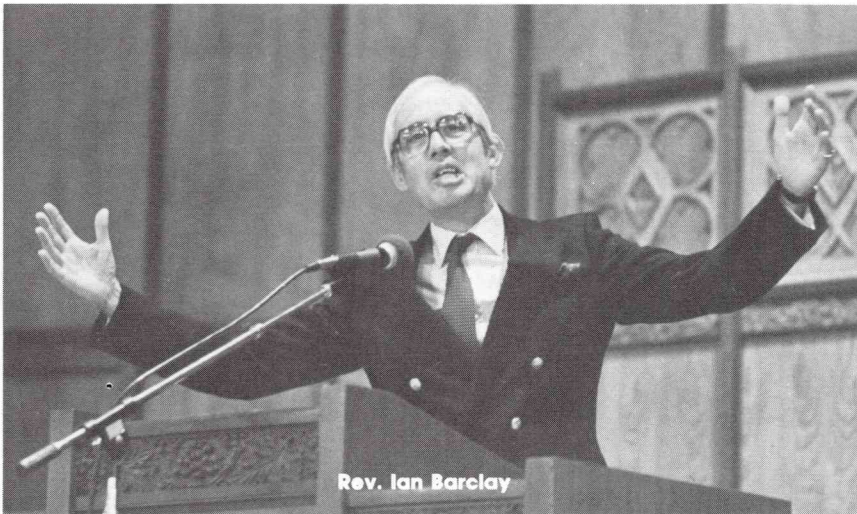

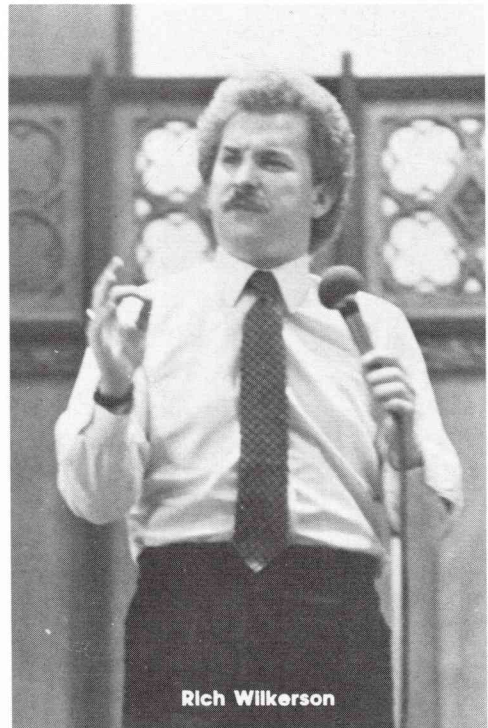

The big event of the year carried us back to 1957.

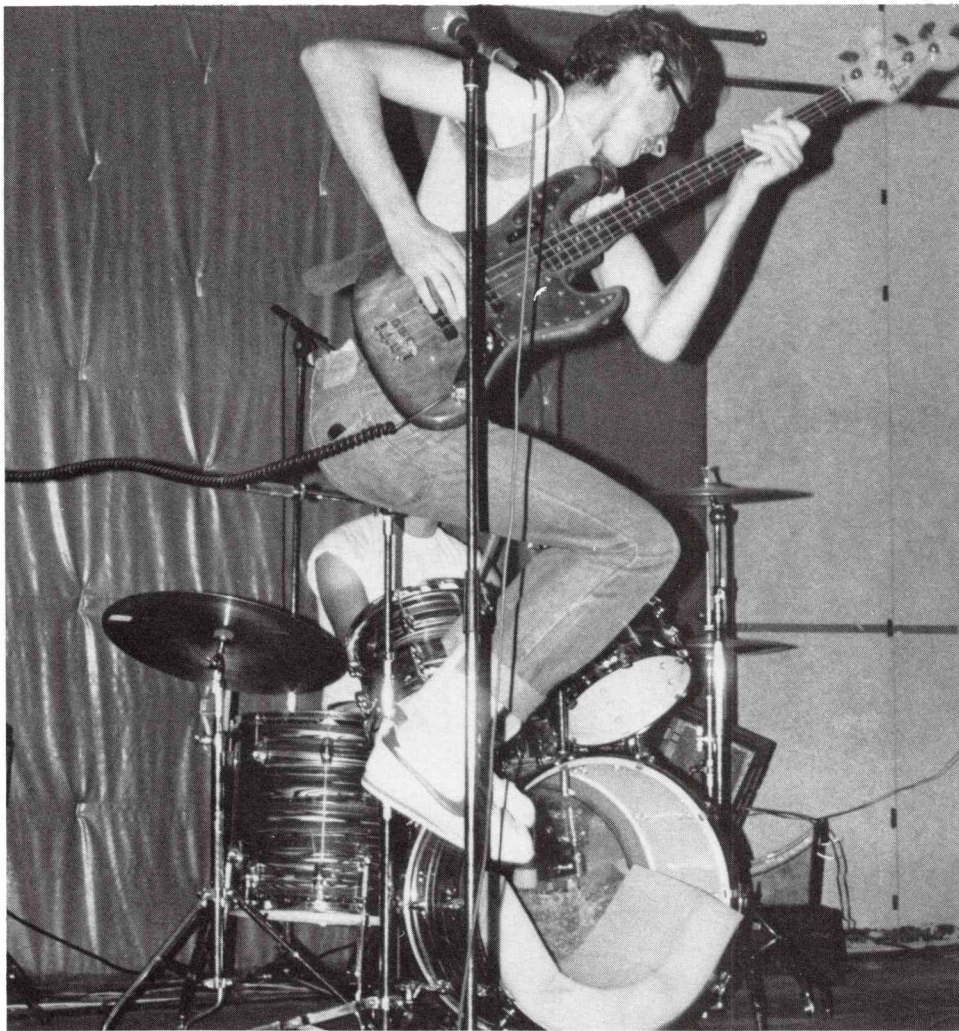
Every potential "Fonz" put at least half a jar of vaseline in his hair, and the girls must have spent all afternoon deciding what clothes to wear.

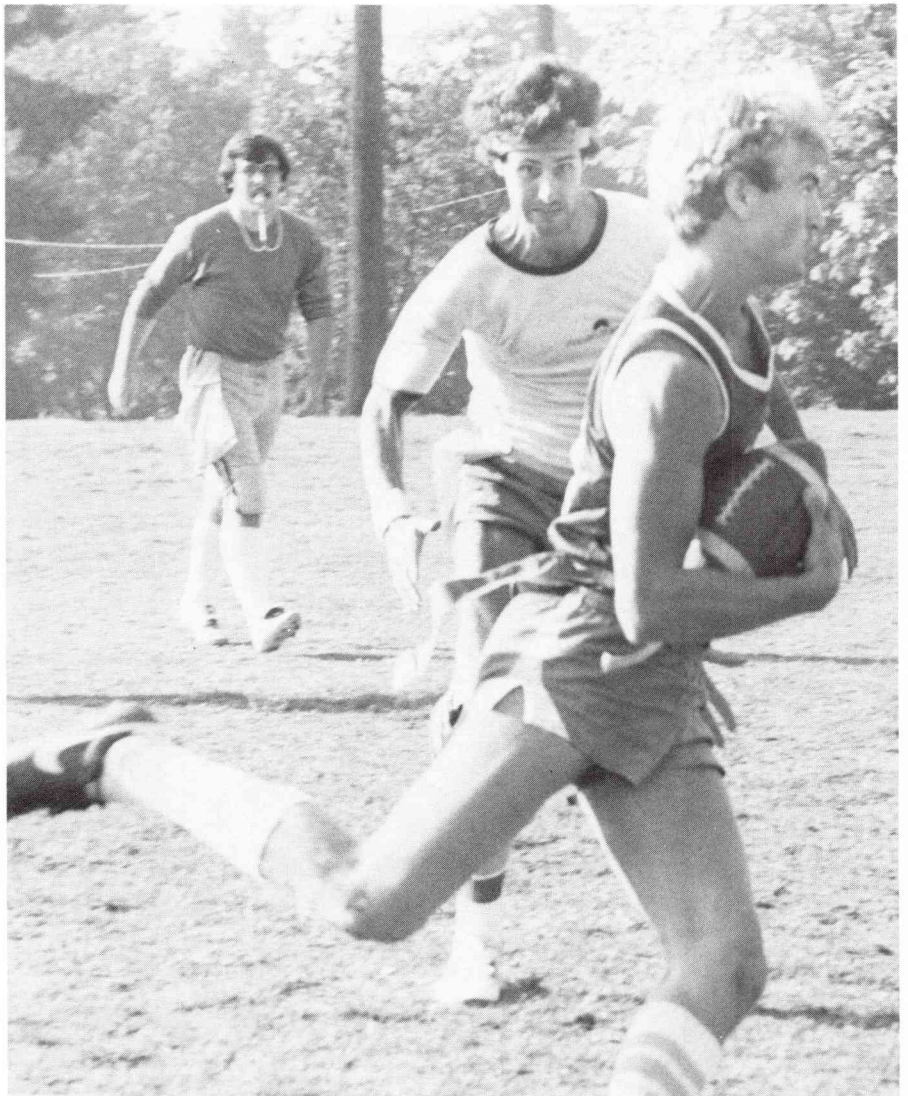
Intramural Football: A Season Of Surprises

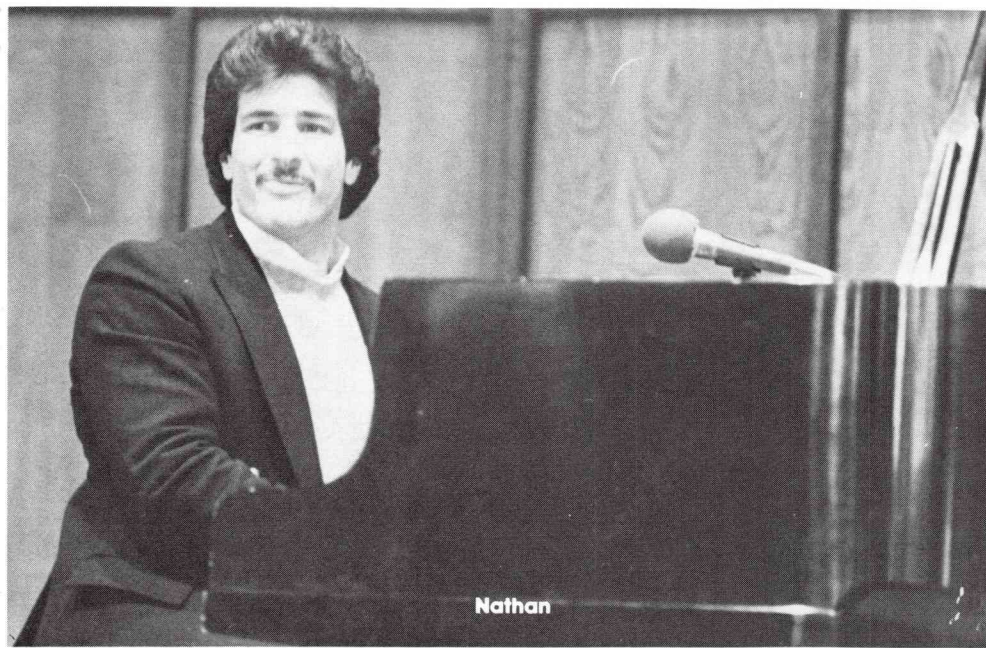
Winter Spiritual Emphasis: Jesus, The Cornerstone

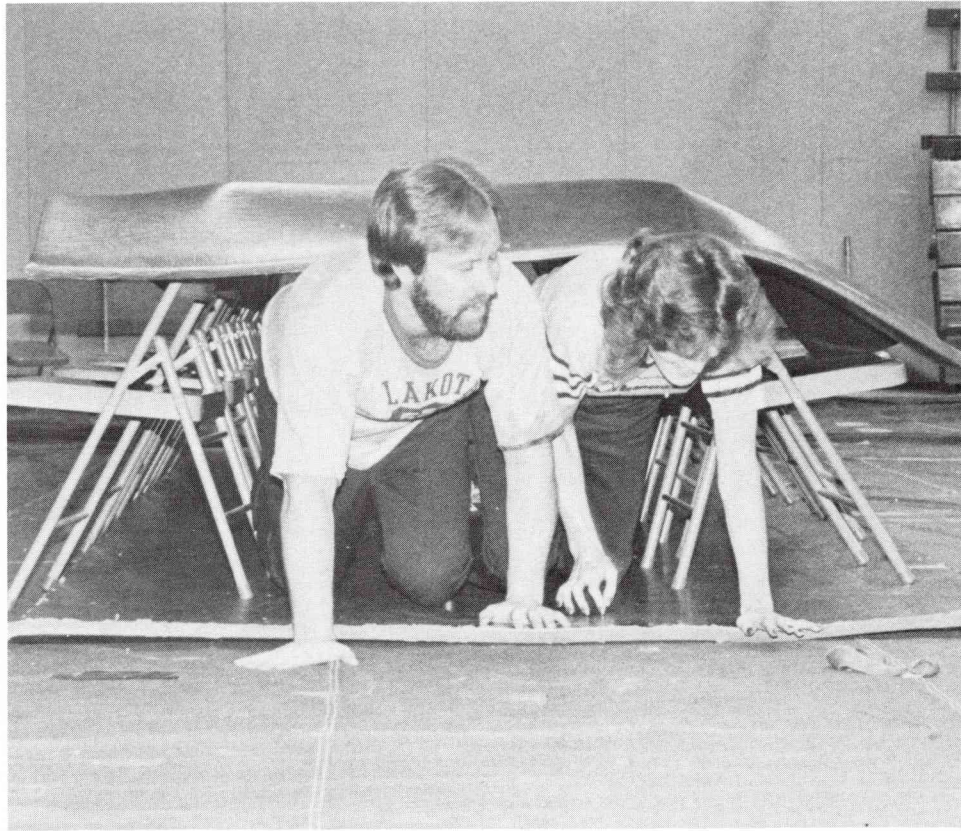
Homecoming: A Week Of Fun And Games

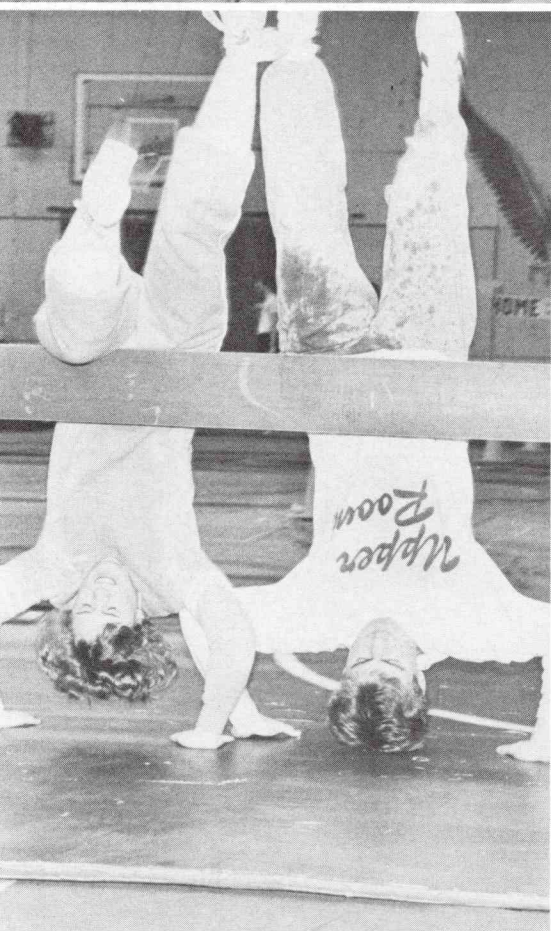

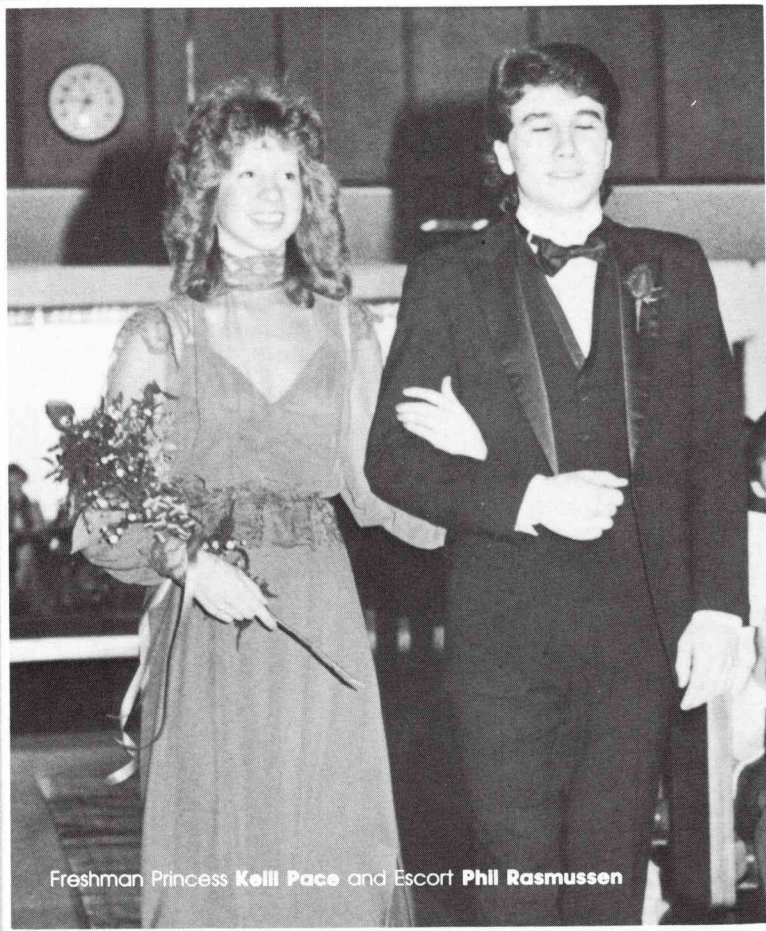

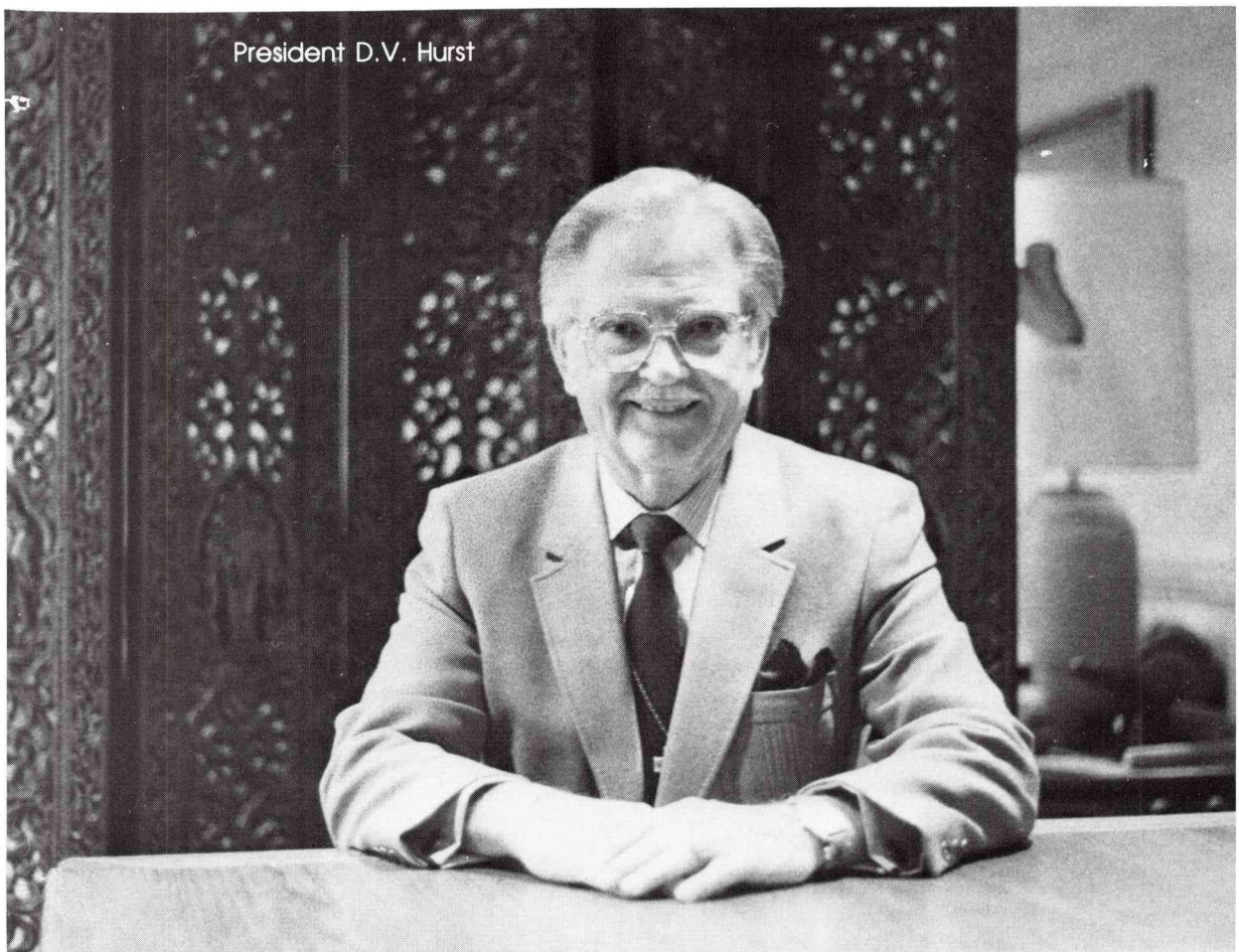
He identifies his enemy clearly and reckons his power — as the Prince of the power of the air . . . as principalities . . . and spiritual wickedness . . . as an adversary.

There are many goals within the WOM organization. One of the most important is to expose the students to a lost world that

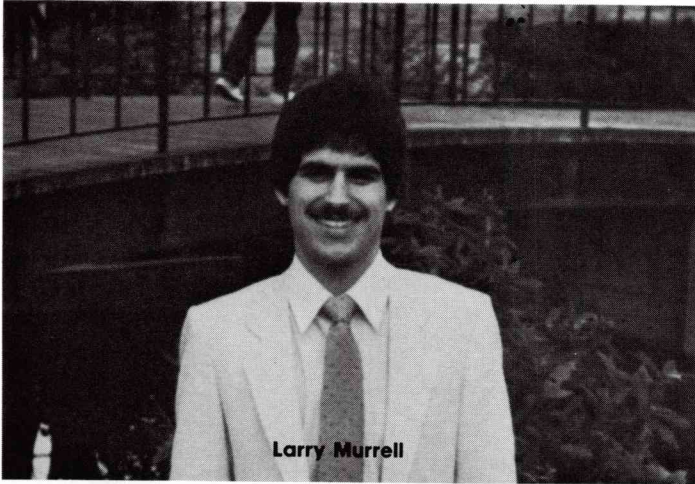

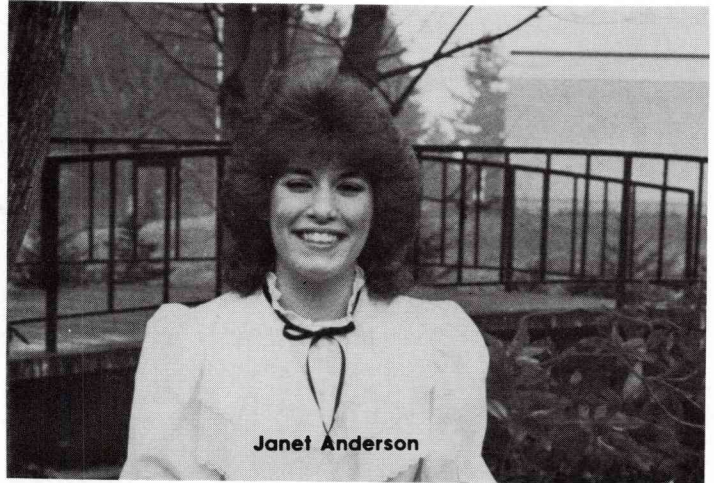
love are a few more. It is WOM's prayer that the students will, through involvement, gain a greater understanding of the World of Missions.

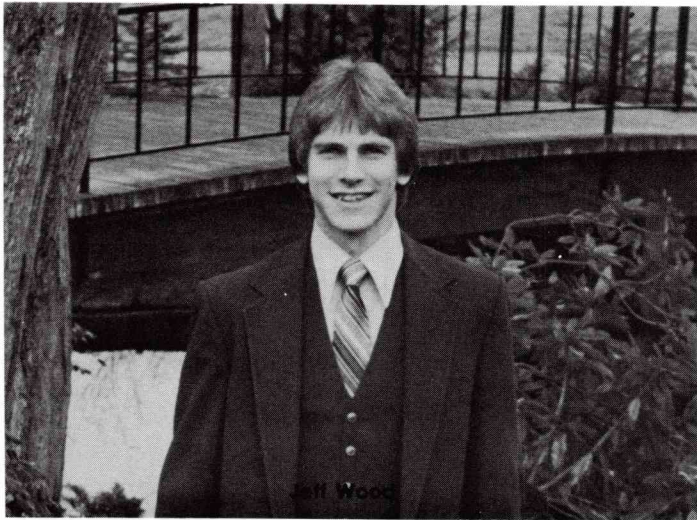

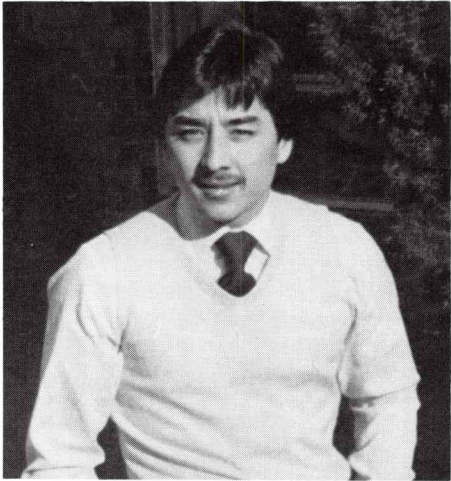
CHILDREN'S MIG: STARTING YOUNG

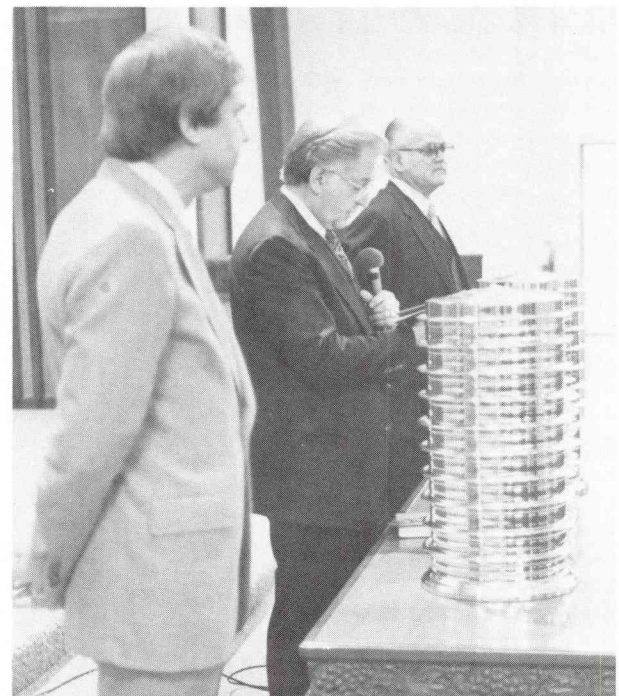
CAMPUS MIG: MINISTRY AT HOME

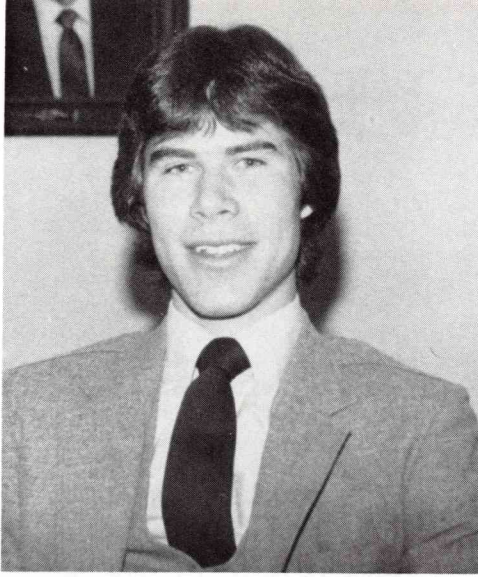

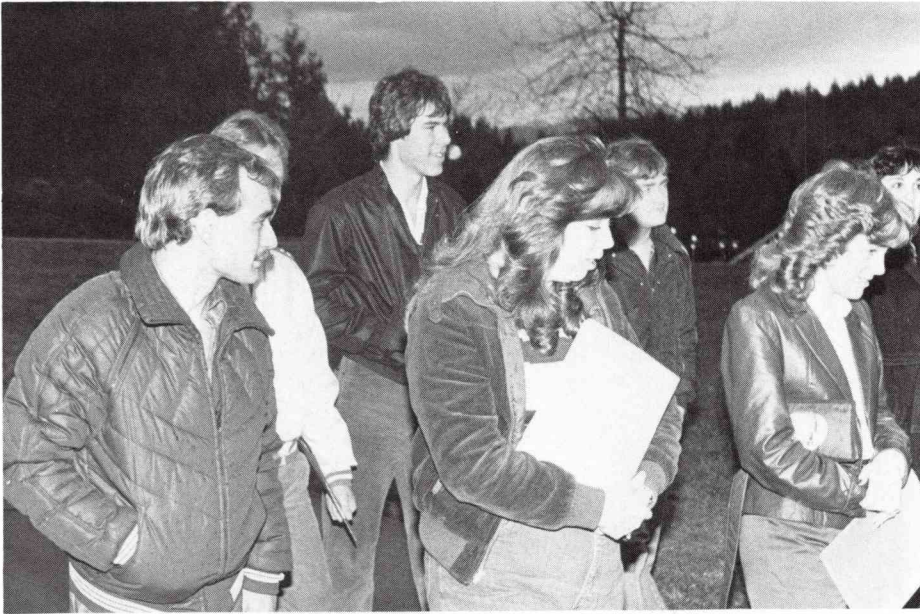

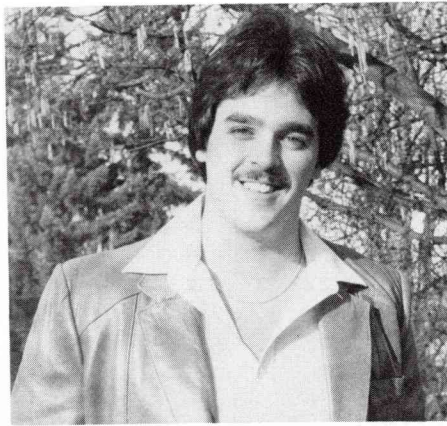

Through personal contact and the distribution of various tracts, souls were won for Christ.

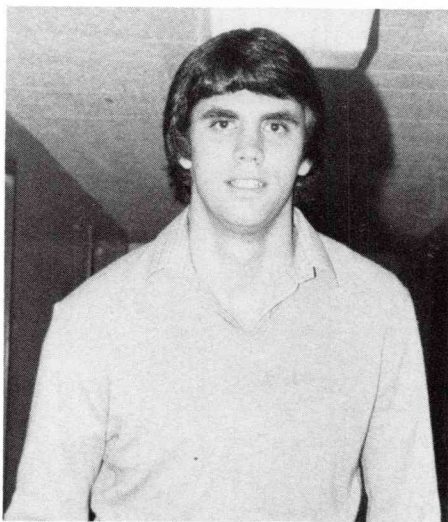


PUBLICITY MIG: CAMPUS COMMUNICATION

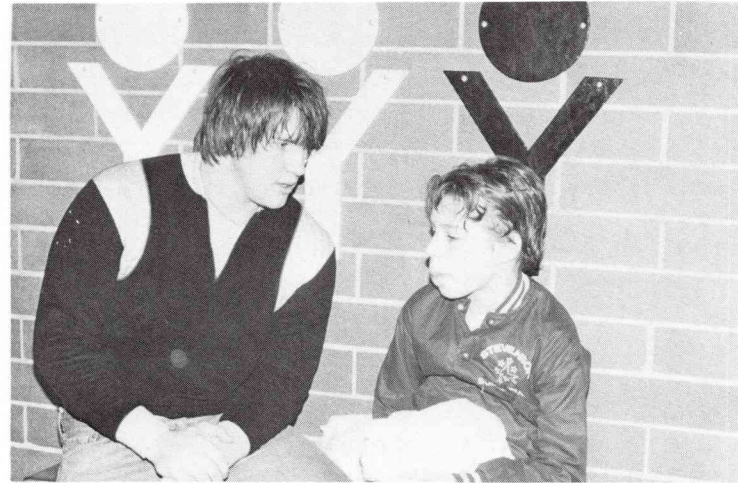

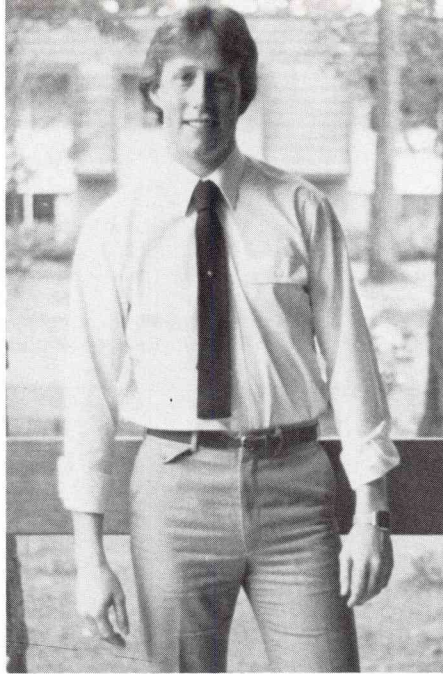

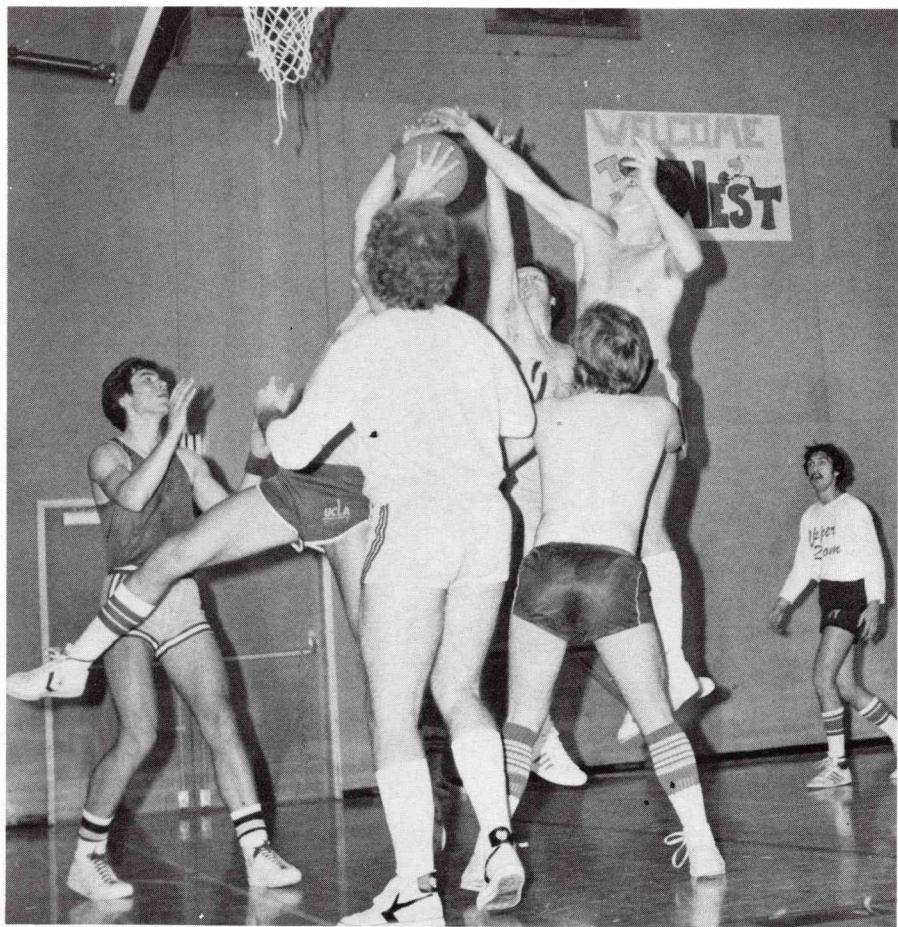
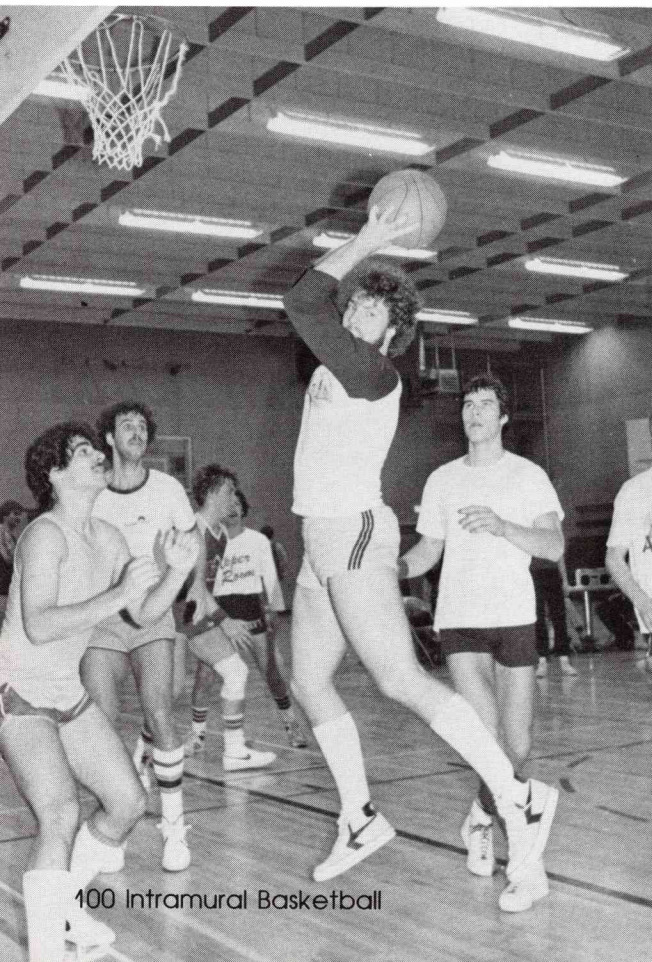
Intramural Basketball: Roundball For All
