


Rev. C. C. Beatty, Rites Set Retired College For Rev. Dean, Dies Jam. (AMS) The Rev. C. C. Beatty,

Mr. Beatty was born in Knox, Ind., and had been in the ministry for 50 years. He was ordained in the Baptist denomination in 1901 and held pastorates for a number of years and conducted

evangelistic campaigns. Mr. Beatty helped to found the Northwest Bible College here and was dean of it for 15 years retiring two years ago. He also helped to organize the North Central Bible Institute in Minneapolis and served as dean there until he came to Seattle. He was assistant superintendent for the North Central District of the Assemblies of God in Minnesota and worked also as field superintendent in the district.

Mr. Beatty was an elder of Calvary Temple and assisted in the Sunday services. His home was at 802 E. 77th St.

He is survived by his wife, Hattie L., and a daughter, Genevieve Beatty, of Seattle.
