Returning students, note: Some changes have been made in library circulation rules for this year; we trust they will be beneficial to you. First, the regular loan period for books has been changed from one to weeks. This also applies to pamphlets, visual aid stories, and maps. Second, a two-hour-reserve category has been added. These books will be kept at the library desk; after signing them out you may take them anywhere you wish but they must be returned within two hours. If taken out within the last two hours the library is open, they may be kept overnight and in that case are due the next morning the library is open (including Saturday) within one hour after opening time (by 8:15 weekdays, 10:30 Saturday). Fines on 2 hour reserves are 20¢ per hour for the first 4 hours overdue, and 10¢ per hour thereafter.
