#### AN URGENT NEED . . .

Northwest College urgently needs its new permanent Library building. There are now over 38,000 volumes in the Library, requiring 3,327 feet of shelf space. The present shelving space will hold no more than an additional 3,000 volumes at 85% capacity. (This is the normal ratio to allow for check-in and check-outs and the addition of new volumes.) Currently, the Library is adding approximately 3,000 volumes per year. At this rate, during the 1973-74 school year all present shelf space will be used. By 1983, all present floor space will be required for book stacks alone!

#### TARGET DATE--APRIL 1976

The target date for ground-breaking is April 1976, during Lay Council! This date can be met! And even moved up! if all who are interested in Northwest College will participate sacrificially. # **CAMPUS DAY TOPS 900**



"The biggest ever" are familiar words that were apt ones to describe the annual Northwest College Campus Day held on March 30th. The college threw open its doors and hosted 920 registered guests. Two-thirds of the guests were high schoolers of whom over one-third were high school seniors. Pastors and pastors' wives—many of whom were alumni—made up 114 guests while youth sponsors, parents, and visiting young people in other categories made up the guest roster.

Upon welcoming the guests in a thronged chapel, College President, Dr. D. V. Hurst, invited visitors to indicate their points of origin. Among the places represented were Puerto Rico, Alaska, Colorado, with appreciable numbers from Oregon, Montana, Idaho,

and Washington state.

Visitors were given tours of the campus with student guides, and opportunities to visit classes and to take in workshops on curriculum, admissions, and finances. Highlighting the day was the special chapel service featuring the College's King's Choralons under the direction of Professor Dorothy Amundsen, and a Campus Day message by Northwest District Youth Director, the Reverend Allen Baunsgard. He addressed the guests on the subject of "Alternatives to Confusion", a message dealing with some of the youth problems of the day and their Biblical solutions.

Campus visitors were hosted to entertainment which included an exhibition basketball game played between the Northwest College Eagles and the Puget Sound College of the Bible from which the Eagles emerged victors. An evening singspiration featured the College Public Relations Musical teams in a variety music concert. The evening's service, which was sponsored by the Associated Student Body included a somewhat dramatic feature when the "old" Northwesterners, a popular musical travel team, made its last public appearance with 1972 NC grad, Jerry Gillock, who in turn, introduced the new Northwesterners, which now include Mr. and Mrs. Dale Lidstrom and Mr. and Mrs. Paul Brown.

Public Relations Director Ron DeBock, who coordinated the events of the day, announced that the Campus Day date for 1974 has been set for March 29.
