



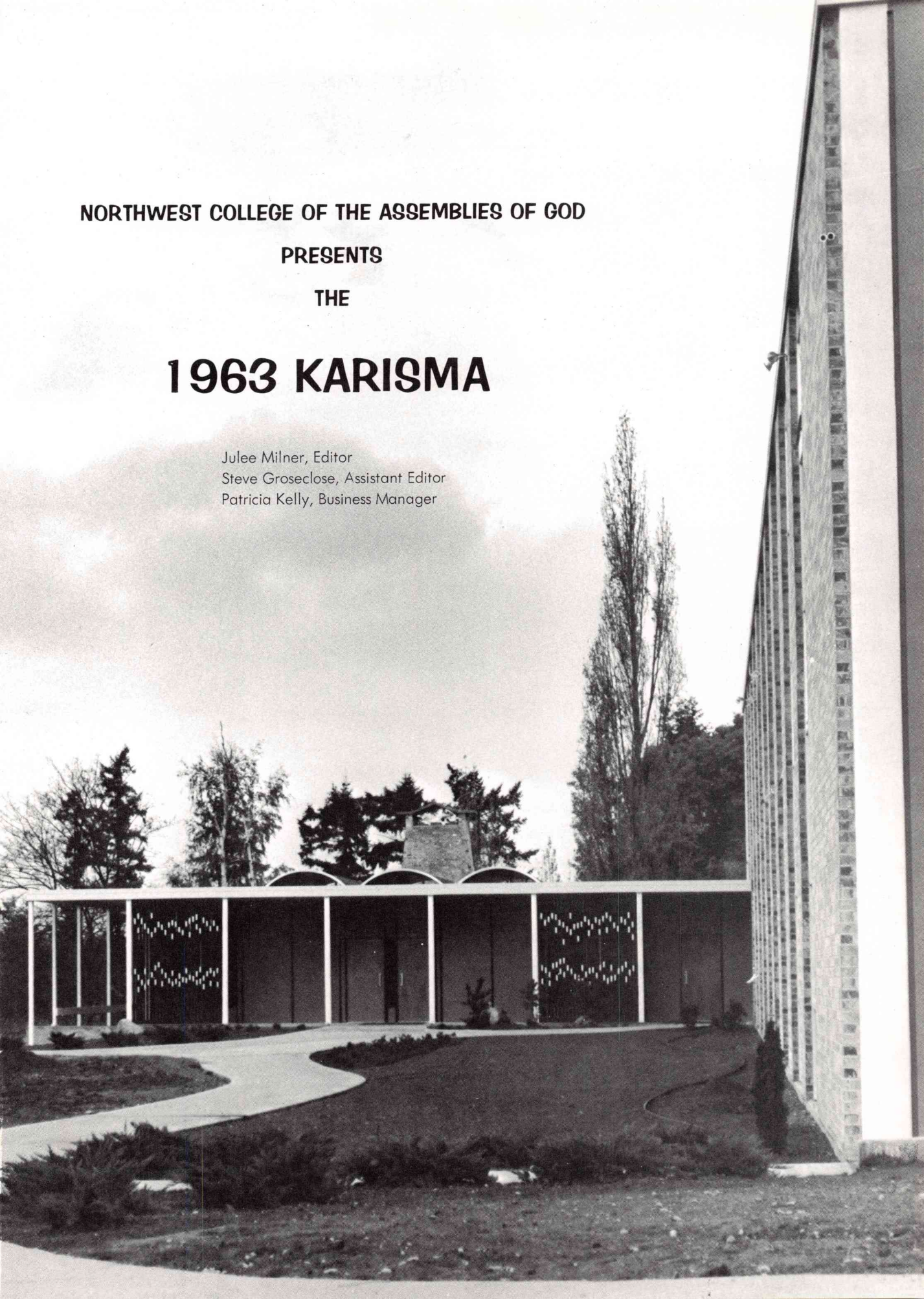

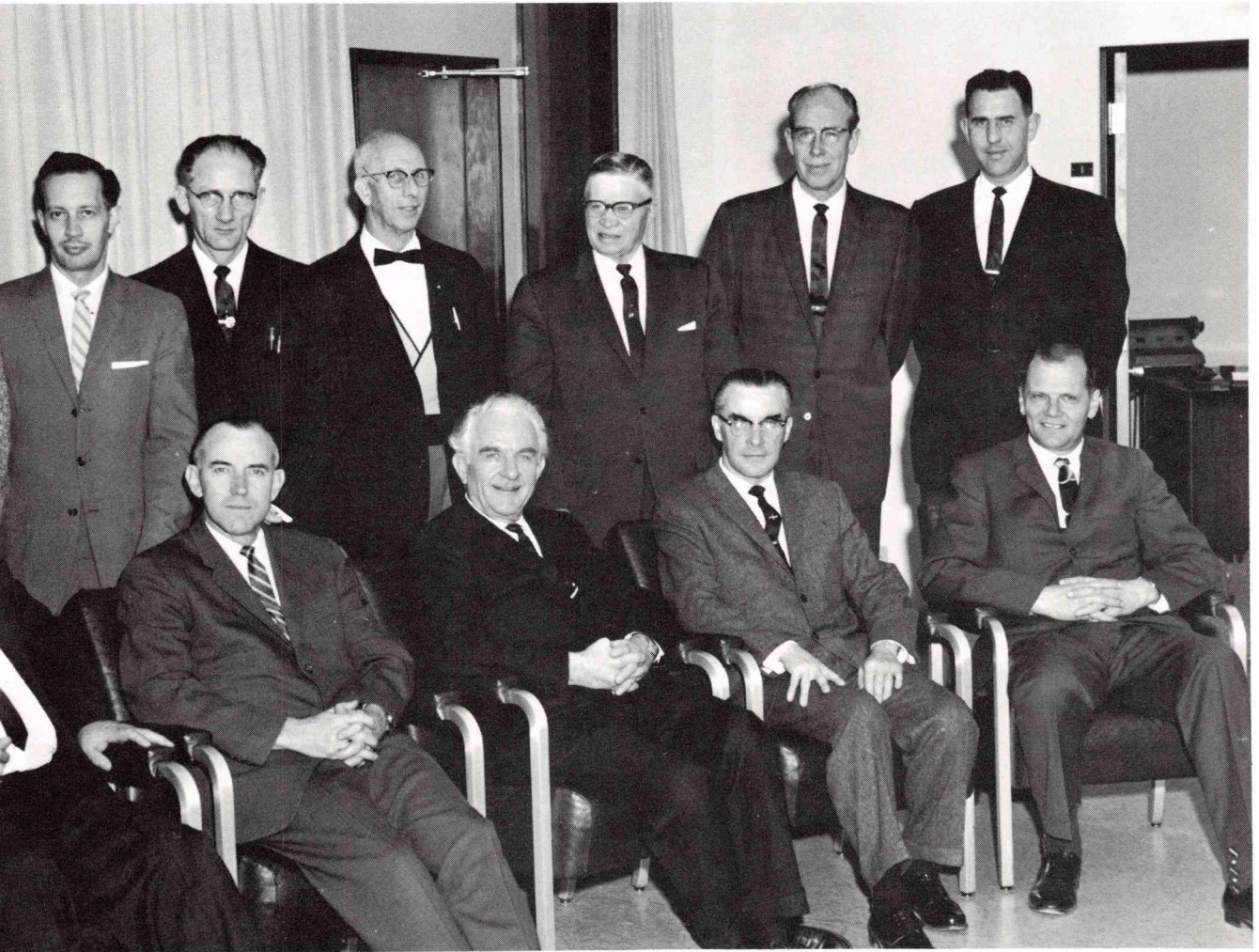

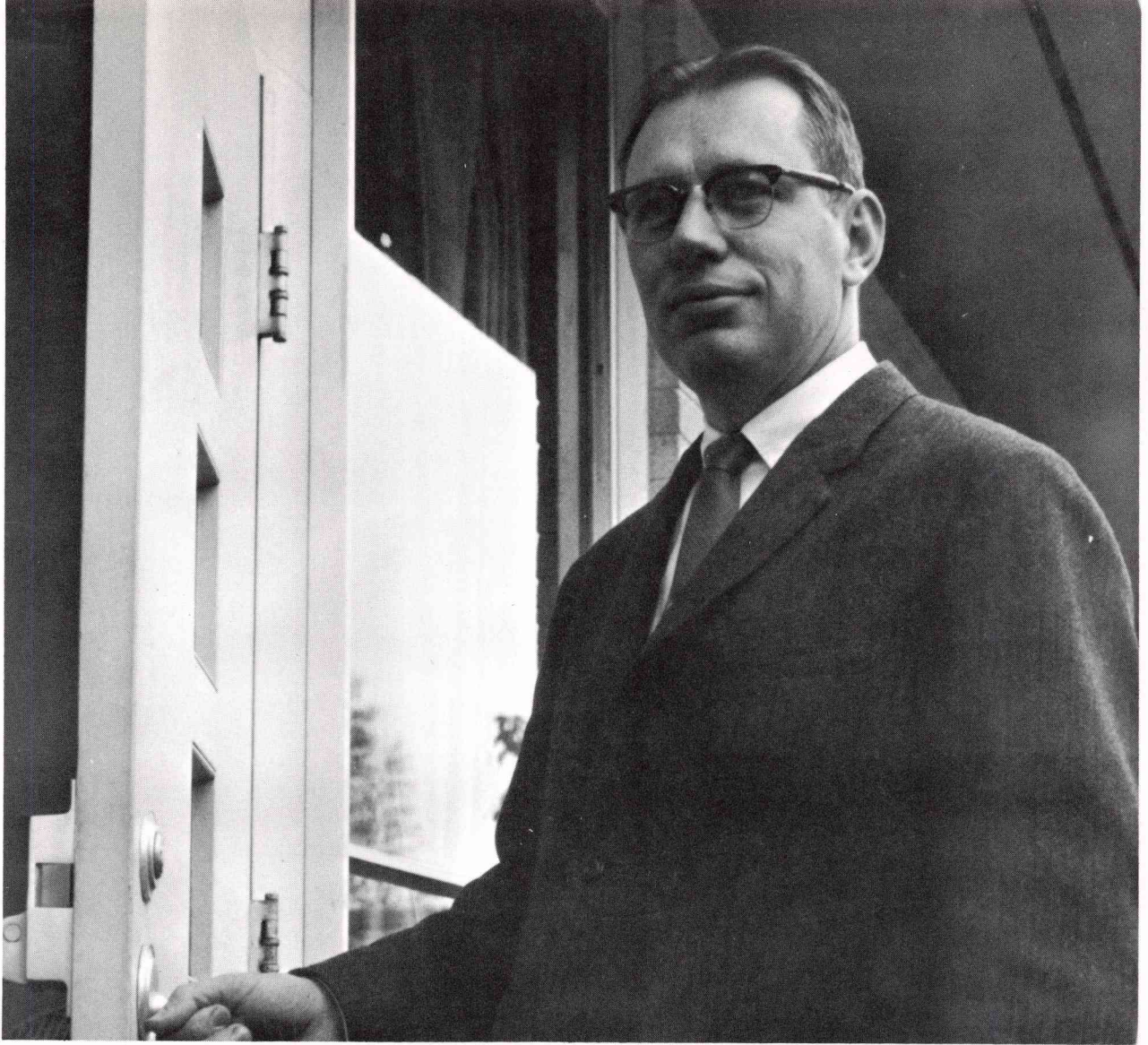
"Thou art worthy, O Lord, to receive glory and honour and power: for thou has created all things, and for thy pleasure they are and were created." Revelation 4:11. The voice heard in heaven clearly establishes the purpose of God in creating man — that is, His own pleasure. The fall of man confused and destroyed the purpose of God for his life.

Man's redemption through the atonement of Jesus Christ reconciled him to God and re-established God's original purpose of creation — His pleasure. No Christian may live for his own pleasure, but God's. It is not a matter of God having a claim on his life. His life IS God's. No longer his own, which is the isolated state of the fallen, the believer must do his Father's will. God's will becomes the life of the believer, his meat and drink.

The CALL of God is to become God's child, to be born of His Spirit. The vocational aspect of the CALL of God is not the Bible emphasis. All believers are to do God's will, and to be at His continuous command. This is a divine law — the law of discipleship.

Being conscious of this divine law for all believers, we yield to the leadership of the Holy Spirit in His direction concerning the specific purposes of God for our lives. A complete submission of our lives to God's purpose is the important thing. Working out of individual services and ministries is the fruit of that dedication.

It is God's stated earthly purpose for His Church as a body and every member in particular to preach the Gospel to every creature that they might be saved; reconciled to God; to do His will. Thus the purpose of creation is fulfilled, and God is pleased. God said of His Son, Jesus Christ, "This is my beloved son in whom I am well pleased." We too, as sons, may be well pleasing in His sight, "For it is God which worketh in us both to will and to do His good pleasure."

THRUST US OUT

Our Lord left but one prayer request with his disciples during his earthly ministry: "Pray ye . . . the Lord of the harvest that he send forth laborers into his harvest" (Matt. 9:38). The picture presented by these words is graphic: they portray vast fields of ripe, whitened grain in need of harvesting. In contrast with the vastness of the harvest he pictured the labor-force as "few." In the face of such urgency, Jesus uttered these words which imply that the means of recruiting laborers for the harvest begins with prayer. The harvesters must be divinely called and qualified for their task by God. In answer to this prayer God purposes to call and "send forth" (lit. "thrust forth") laborers of his choosing and endowment.

In harmony with these words of Jesus, our alma-mater song significantly expresses our institutional purpose: "O thrust us out, and lead us on to promised victory!" My prayer for Northwest College is that it shall ever be a place from which the Lord of the harvest shall call and send forth laborers into his harvest.

The Council consists of the executive officers, the advisor and the officers of the five Missionary Prayer Bands. The Council is the executive body directing the activities of the Missionary Society.

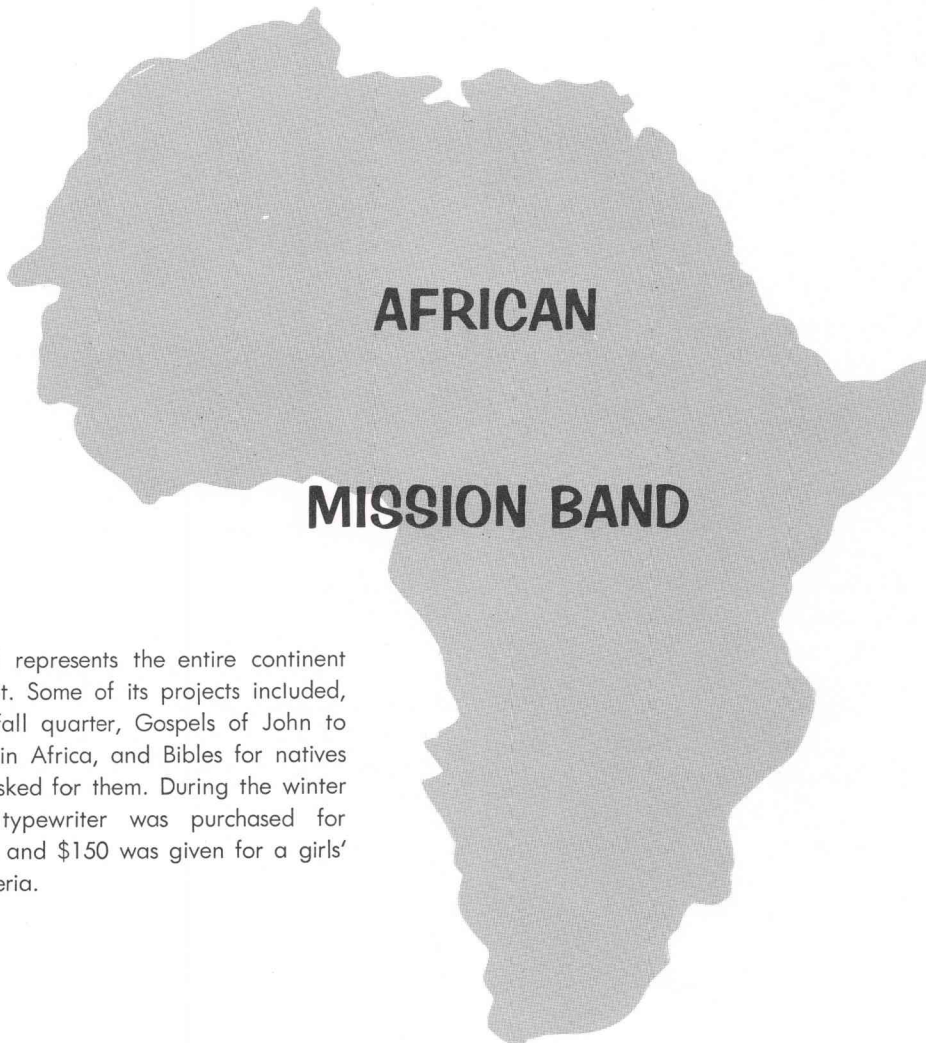
Missionary Society

The Society is made up of the entire student body composing five Missionary Prayer Bands. The objectives of the Society are twofold:

1. To stimulate student interest and giving by means such as:
 - Missionary Banquet — or one activity per quarter for the entire student body.
 - Special Missionary Chapel Speakers
 - Missionary Band projects — in which the students are made aware of missionary needs and, through prayer and offerings, help to meet this need.
2. To organize student missionary endeavor such as:
 - Missionary internship
 - Vacation Bible Schools
 - Indian Work

The band represents the entire continent except Egypt. Some of its projects included, during the fall quarter, Gospels of John to three areas in Africa, and Bibles for natives who have asked for them. During the winter quarter a typewriter was purchased for Lillian Bach, and \$150 was given for a girls' dorm in Nigeria.

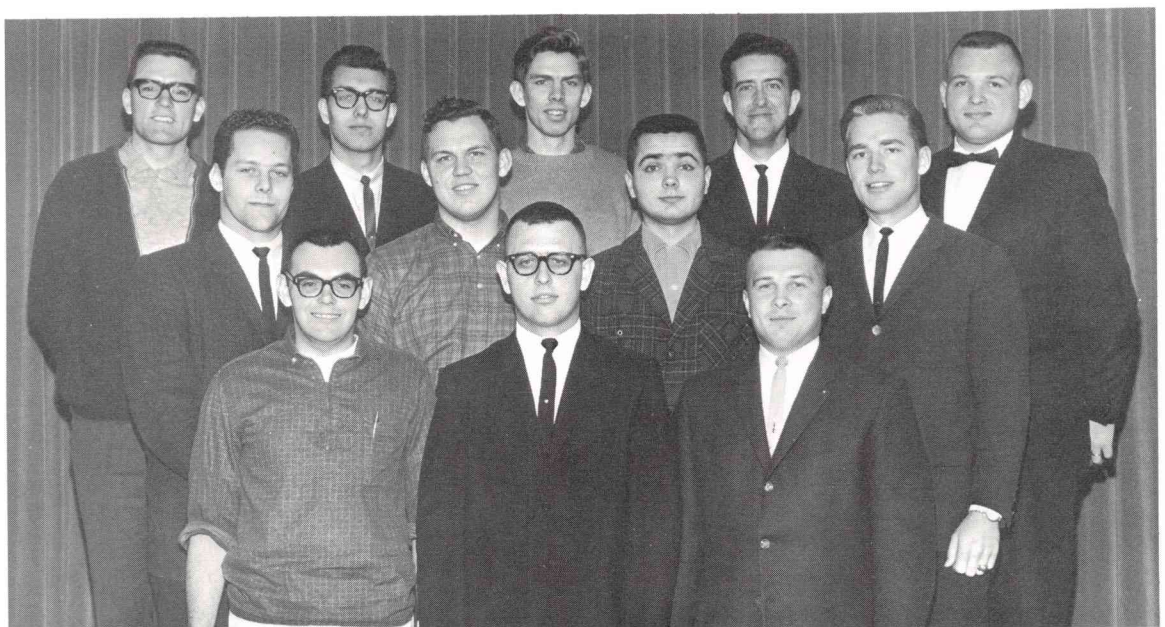

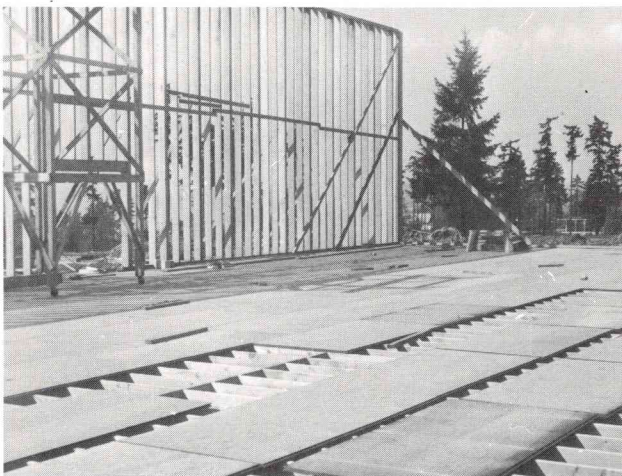
We at Northwest College have long been looking forward to the day when we could have our own gymnasium — one which we could use at our leisure and without conforming to the schedule of any other school.

As the pictures on this page portray, we will soon have our own gymnasium. This will truly add much to our campus, in providing recreation facilities for all of us.

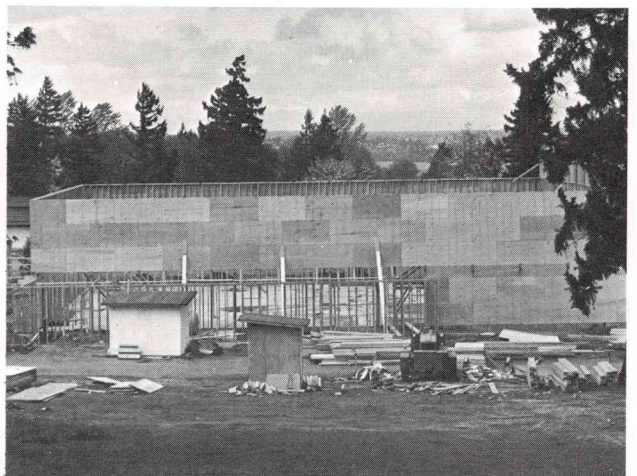

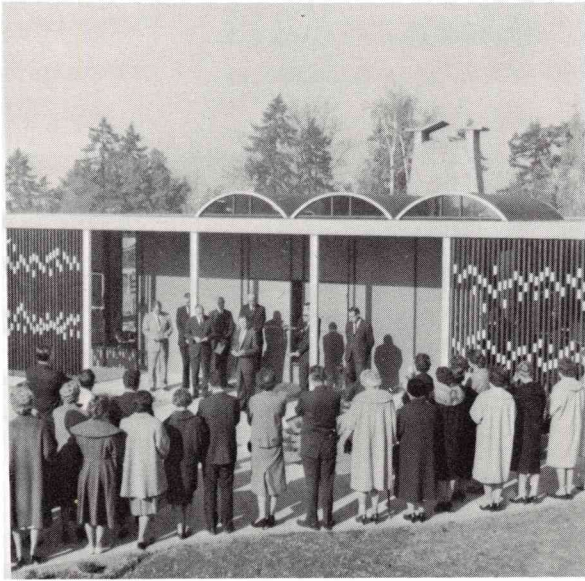

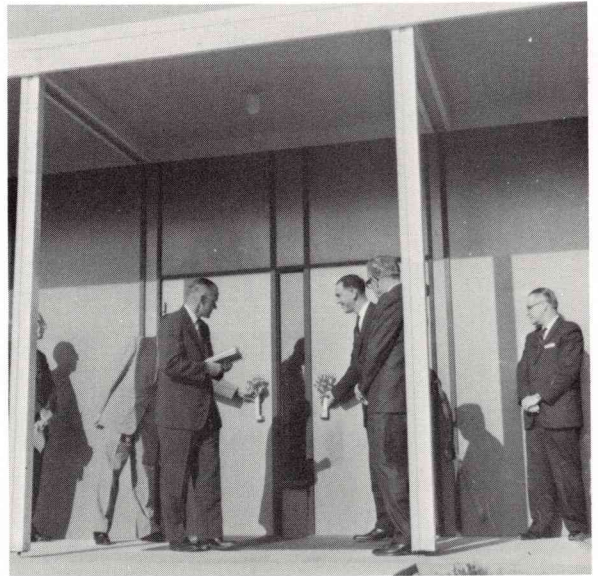
Outside Men's Residence

On Friday, November 2, 1962, the dedication service for the new men's residence and the new cafeteria building was held.

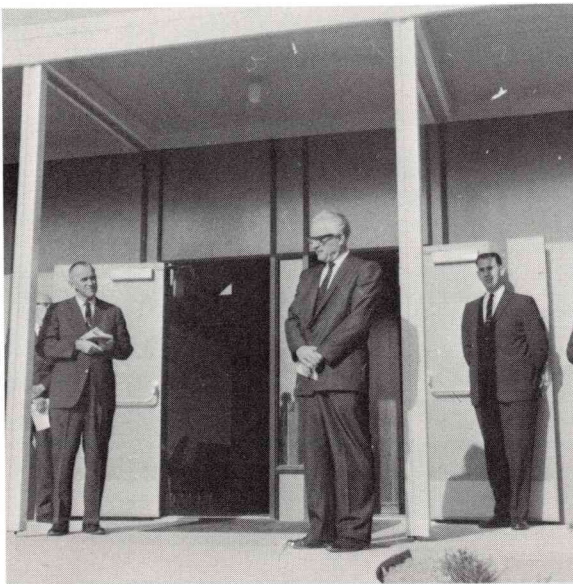
The men's residence will house approximately 100 students in addition to its apartment facilities. It also has a spacious lounge in the reception wing.
