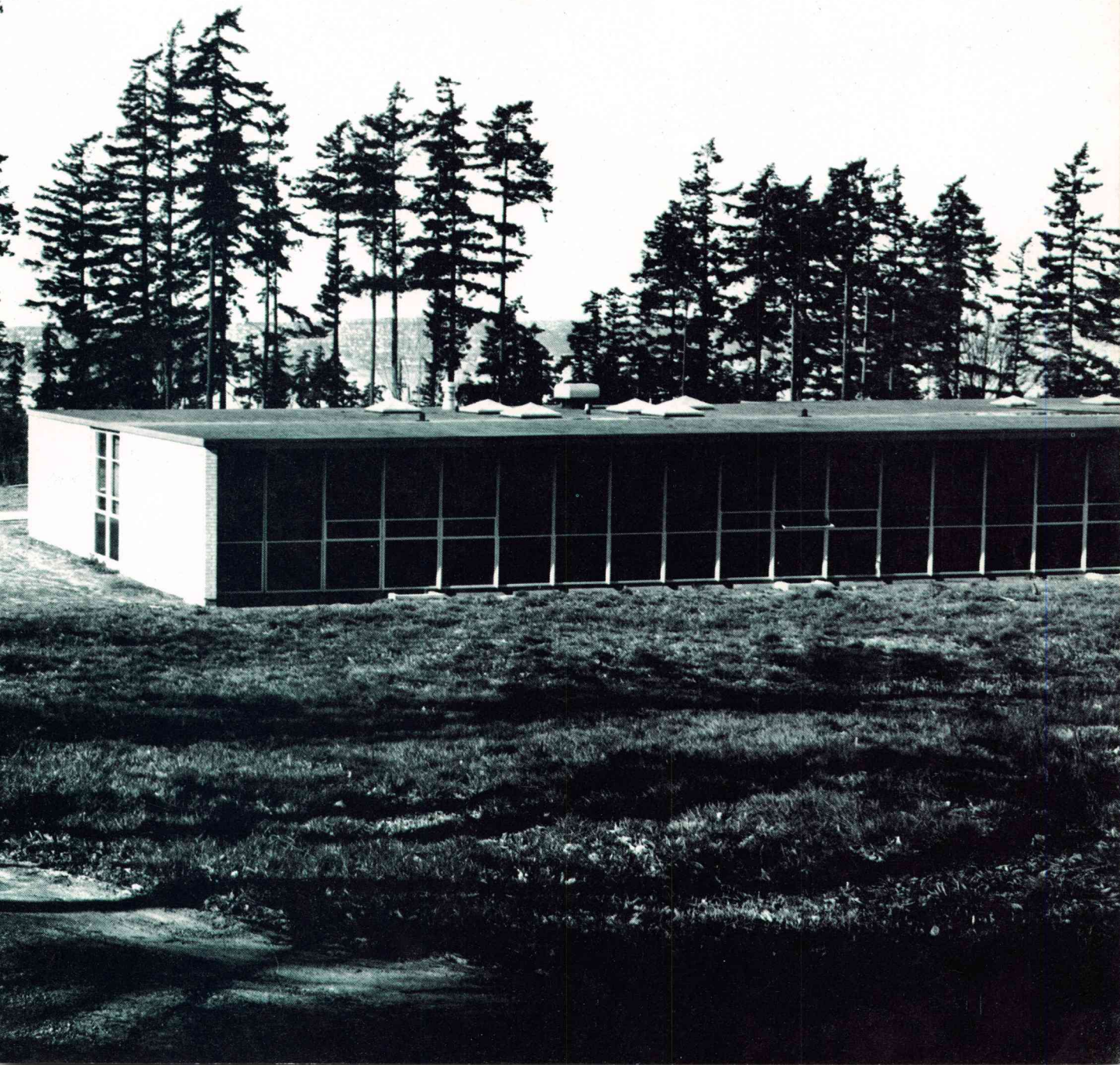

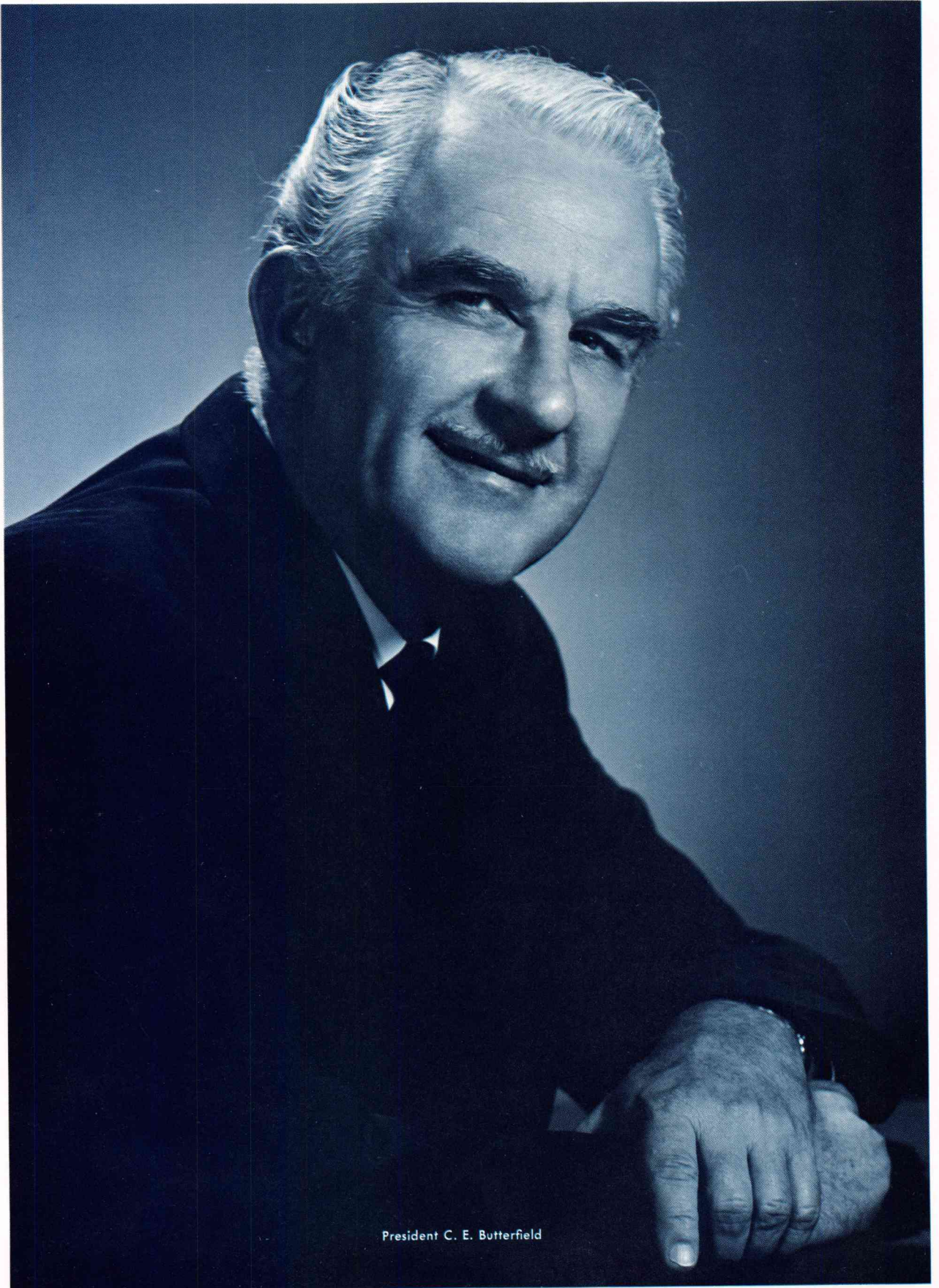

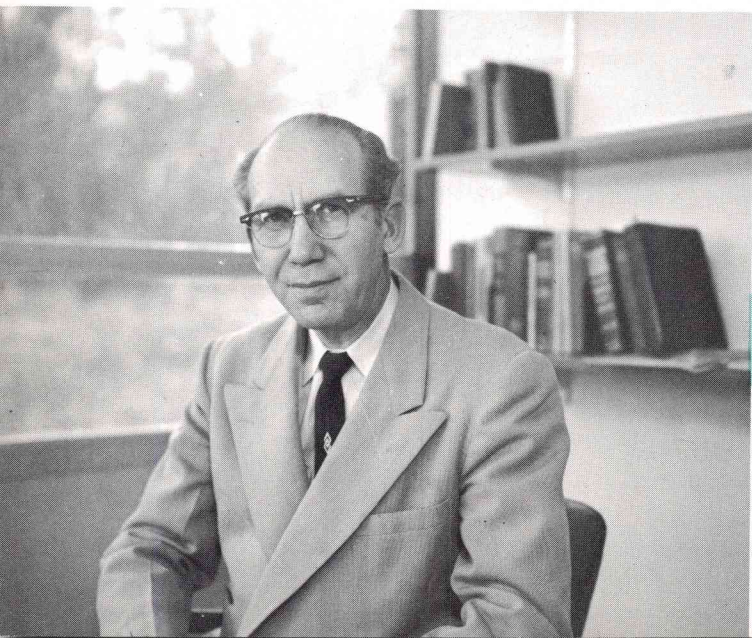


### ROBERT DALTON

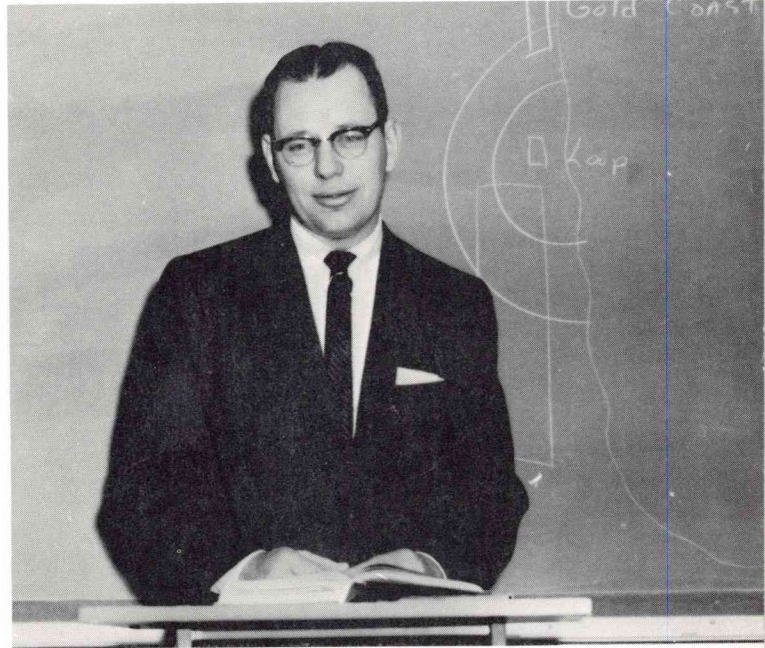

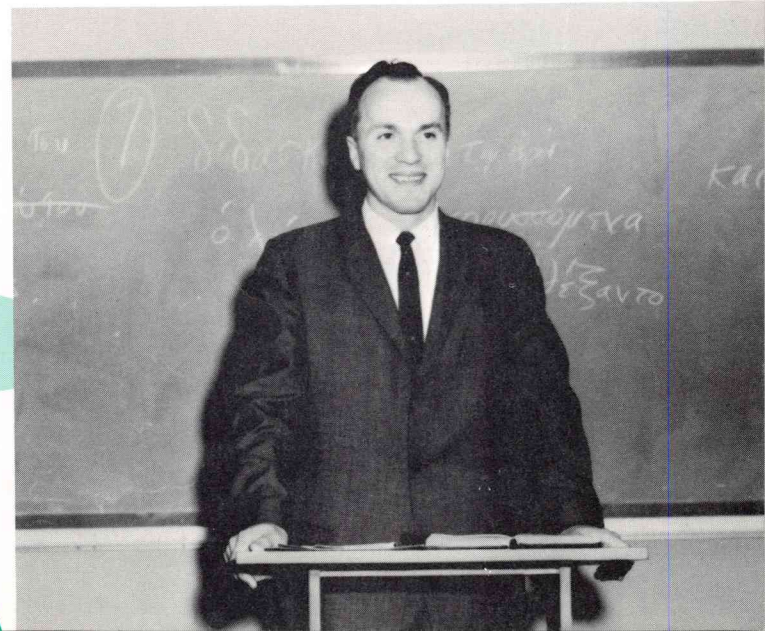


## DANIEL B. PECOTA

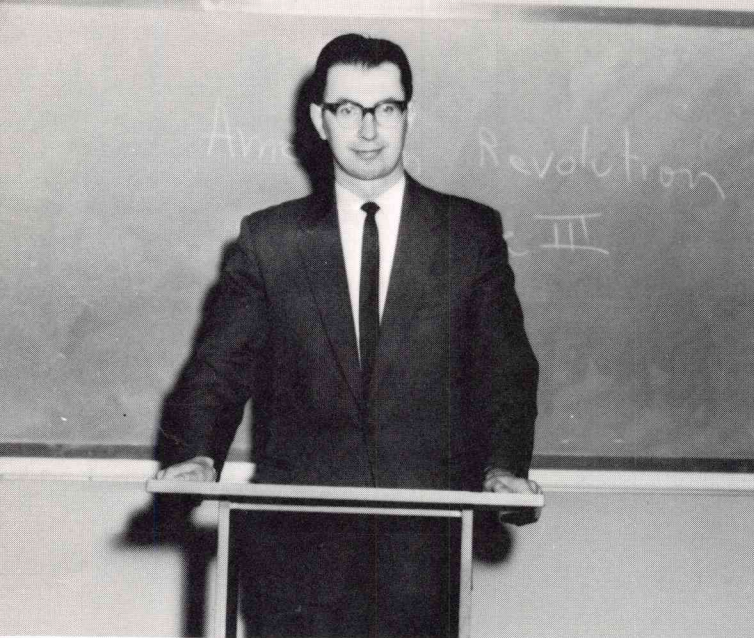
New Testament Greek Bible.

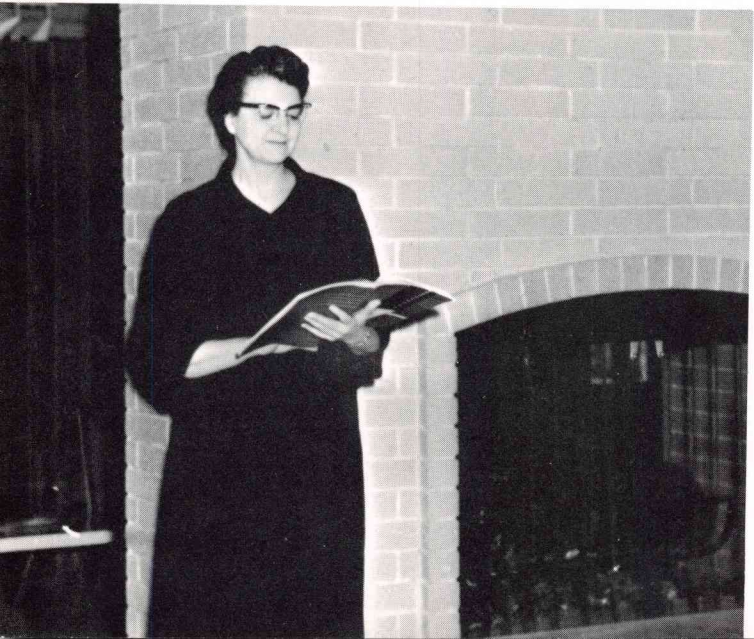


#### JOHN W. SIMPSON

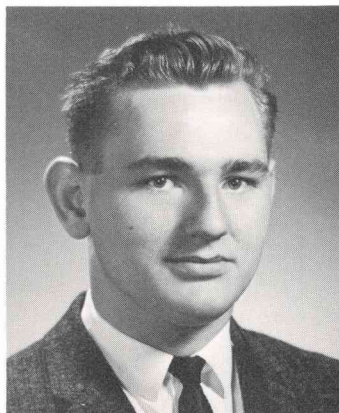
## Missions

Northwest Bible College not only provides academic training but also affords the student opportunities in applying what has been learned in the classroom in actual Christian service. The old adage, "Experience is the best teacher" still holds true today. Booklearning cannot replace the experience of the practical application of accumulated knowledge. N.B.C.'s CHRISTIAN SERVICE DEPARTMENT is actively engaged in providing the students an actual ministry in various denominational church services, youth rallies, local nursing homes and other avenues of service. The teams, individually consisting of a team leader, speaker, and vocal or instrumental combination are systematically assigned to these various outlets of ministry upon the request of pastors and youth leaders. A gospel team is designed to be a synchronized effort to present the gospel in word and song. Usually eight to ten teams are in operation throughout the school term. Comprehensive questionnaires given to the team leaders before the date of assignment allow the team and the host pastor to evaluate the team's ministry. At the present we meet twice a month with our team personnel to point out areas of improvement and efficiency.

Not only do we have gospel teams serving in these various capacities but also many more students are engaged as assistant pastors, Sunday school superintendents, teachers, directors of children's church, and pianists. The college concert choir goes on tour at least once each school year and several gospel teams itinerate through the Northwest area during the summer months. All these make a valuable contribution to the cause of Christ.

The success of our Christian Service Department is evidenced by the pastor's reports expressing thanks and appreciation for our students and their ministry. These young people have been instrumental in leading souls to Christ and in encouraging others in a deeper experience with God. With an eye to the future our department is developing an efficient follow-up program designed to encourage new converts in maturing spiritually. As can well be seen our Christian Service Department is another component part of our expanding Christian institution, Northwest Bible College.

We are truly grateful to coach Cole for the help he has given our team this year. The following is a schedule of our past season:

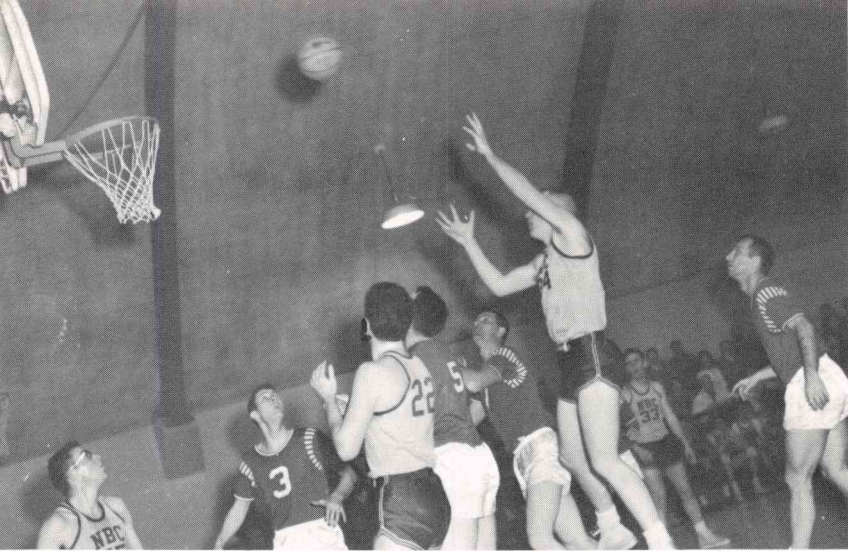
