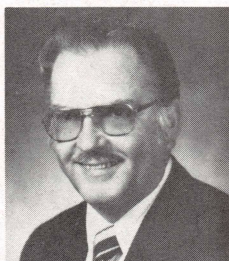

It is a record again-627! The previous all time high for a fall quarter was last year-552. This year Northwest College grew 75 students.

In fact, this is a fifth consecutive quarter of all time high enrollment. It is good to be growing.

The inside story, however, is even more interesting and exciting than it first may appear. The freshman class this year is 18 larger than last year. The sophomore class is 4 larger. But the junior class is 29 larger and the senior class is 24 larger! The senior class grew almost 50 percent and most of the growth this year is in the upper division!

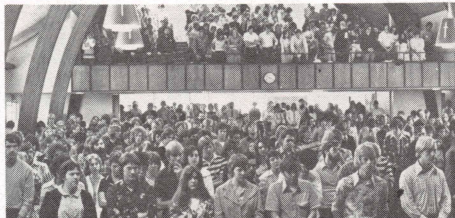
Furthermore, the growth is primarily in numbers of young men! In fact, we normally expect to have about three young ladies to every two young men in residence in the single residence halls on campus. Of course, the over-all student balance is changed by the many married men (about 20 percent of the student body) and the commuter students, and has long included more men.

This year it is even more in evidence. As school started, the single residence hall balance shifted to men-205 men, 199 ladies.

So, the inside story on enrollment is this: The junior college enrollment has held steady: The Bible college enrollment has grown and the growth is men and in the third and fourth years.

I remember saying a few years ago, "I hope we will soon be graduating at least 75 seniors per year." Someone asked me if we as a church could absorb that many and I replied with an emphatic "Yes!" Now, I believe we will be doing that regularly and even more.

Winter Quarter Spiritual Emphasis Speaker

Rev. Otis Keener

The Reverend Otis Keener, pastor, evangelist, missionary, author, will be the Spiritual Emphasis Speaker during Winter Quarter. Annually, this winter week of meetings has a missionary emphasis. Our speaker this year is one of the leading missionary evangelists in the Assemblies of God. January 19-23 should prove to be a most exciting and meaningful time as students gather for this spiritual emphasis.

Reverend Keener has a rich background in pastoral service. He has pastored churches in Pennsylvania, Washington, Oklahoma, California.

He is in demand as an evangelist, having held crusades throughout the United States, and in many key cities overseas. In 1970, he was one of ten protestant clergymen from America officially invited to conduct evangelistic services in the historically Roman Catholic nation of Portugal. The following year, he was invited back for a further time of ministry. In 1972, he was invited by 100 Presbyterian churches to conduct the annual city-wide stadium crusade in Pusan, Korea. Regularly, the Keeners are scheduled by Pastor Cho Yonggi in Seoul, Korea. This largest church in Asia (over 30,000 members) calls them their "evangelists at large".

Since 1973, the Keeners have been on special assignment to open an English-speaking ministry in Hong Kong. In two years, they established a unique, thriving English-speaking work in the 32-story Intercontinental Hotel in central Hong Kong. This "body of believers" continues to grow and expand. While the Keeners were, "giving birth" to this work in Asia's key city, they also conducted a "good news crusade" in Saigon and a one-week "retreat" for missionaries and national workers in Viet Nam. The Keeners have the privilege of conducting Dr. Cho Yonggi's first missionary convention in Seoul, Korea, where \$60,000 (U.S. value) was raised for missions.

We feel honored to have such an outstanding speaker and missionary conduct our Winter Spiritual Emphasis.

8. Our switchboard operator can answer your questions about calendar events. She also has a record where most staff and student body members may be reached.

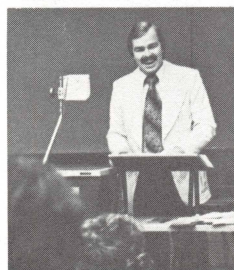

Another speaker in one of Stan Drews classes is Rev. Dave Sjostrom. Dave is minister of Youth and Busing at Everett.

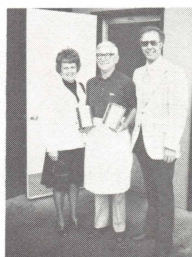
