## Perspective

Northwest College is a Christian institution of higher learning operated under the control of the District Councils of the Northwest Region of the Assemblies of God. We offer four- (or five-year) programs on the senior college level aimed at preparation for various forms of Christian ministry and careers, and two-year basic programs similar to those found in community colleges.

## History

NC was founded in 1934 in the facilities of Hollywood Temple, Seattle, under the direction of Dr. Henry H. Ness, the first president. The College was originally known as Northwest Bible Institute. In 1949, Dr. C. E. Butterfield succeeded Dr. Ness and, at the same time, the College's name was changed to Northwest Bible College. Then, in 1962, the present name, Northwest College of the Assemblies of God, was adopted, representing a new stage in its development. The College progressed from a three to a four year Bible curriculum in 1948, and in 1955 a Liberal Arts division was organized. In 1966, Dr. D. V. Hurst assumed the presidency of Northwest College.

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## Philosophy

NC's concept of education is distinctively Christian in the evangelical sense. We recognize the authority of the Bible as a divine communication of truth. We view man as having been created by God with intellectual, physical, social, and spiritual potentialities which require development if he is to be a whole person whose life is useful, complete, and satisfying.



## Accreditation

Northwest College is unique in that it is an accredited member of both the Northwest Association of Schools and Colleges and the American Association of Bible Colleges.

NC is approved by the Washington State Department of Education for the training of veterans and elementary education teachers; Department of Justice, for the training of foreign students; U.S. Department of State for participation in the Exchange Student program.

## MC Up Close

## Campus

NC has a beautiful semi-wooded tract of fifty-five acres. The modern campus has nineteen buildings including the married student apartments, dorm residences, classrooms, administration offices, Student Union Building, library, gymnasium and the Chapel.

## Location

NC is one of America's most beautiful small college campuses, overlooking magnificent Lake Washington and the Olympic Mountains, fifteen minutes from Seattle, Washington, at the freeway crossroads of the Great Pacific Northwest.

## Student Body

NC is small enough to be very personal yet large enough to offer a full, well-rounded program. The Fall 1985 enrollment was nearly 700 students. These students come from approximately twenty-five states and a dozen countries, representing sixteen denominations.

## Atmosphere



## Academics




NC's alumni serve Christ around the world with over 15% of all its graduates receiving missionary appointment.




## Division of General and Professional Studies



# 10 Ministry

## **Placement**

NC is most anxious to help the graduate find his place in ministry. As a service to the B.A. graduate, a placement bulletin is made available to the pastors within the region so that their prospective employer may know something about the graduate who is wanting to find a position. Many have found this service to be very helpful. Hundreds of NC grads are scattered around the world fulfilling God's call on their lives.

## Practical Experience

The World Outreach Ministries (WOM) organization provides many opportunities for students to become actively involved in ministry. This organization consists of Ministry Interest Groups (MIGS): world outreach, Gospel teams, campus, children, youth and music, evangelism, community service, drama, and servicemen. Instruction and practical experience in Christian service are provided through these opportunities.

The full development of an individual's ministry can only come about as practical experience is made available. For example, pastoral students learn by doing: mock weddings, baptismal services, speaking in class and chapel, serving communion, and the list goes on and on for each of the major emphasis at NC.



## Commitment

NC is wanting everyone to find his or her ministry. Ministry is doing whatever God has called us to do for His honor and glory, whether it is mowing the campus lawns, teaching a class, typing a paper, leading a cell prayer meeting, counseling with a friend, singing a song, preaching or giving a cup of cold water in His name. All of this and much more is what NC and ministry is all about.

The men and women of NC are committed to helping you find your place of ministry, whether it is in full-time Christian service or in an ordinary everyday job. Where the Lord places you can become your field of ministry. We want to help you find that place in His kingdom!

## **Financial Aid**



## Money for College

Money is available to help you finance your education! We are here to assist you in any way we possibly can to find those resources. We believe that you can meet your educational goals if you work hard and carefully plan your financial resources with which to pay for your schooling. Planning ahead should involve you and your family in active saving for college expenses well ahead of your actual enrollment in college. These resources, along with financial aid used to help you pay for college expenses you cannot cover, will help you achieve your educational goals.

Financial aid includes grants and scholarships, student loans, and earnings from employment. The Financial Aid Office at Northwest College stands ready to help you apply for financial aid and to give you guidance concerning the type(s) of aid for which you may qualify.

## Types of Financial Aid Available

Approximately half of our students receive financial aid from at least one of the three basic types of financial aid available:

1. Grants are gift aid awarded on the basis of financial need, no repayment is required. The federal government sponsors the Pell Grant and Supplemental Educational Opportunity Grant awards. The State of Washington sponsors the Washington State Need Grant for residents of the State of Washington. Non-residents of Washington should check with a High School guidance counselor or financial aid officer of a college within their state of residence regarding state aid. (Most states will not provide aid to a student attending an out-of-state institution.)

Scholarships are available to NC students for outstanding academic performance in high school or for service to NC. Tuition discounts are also available to dependents of ministers and missionaries, student spouses, ministers, missionaries, and their wives

2. Loans will offer you the opportunity to defer the cost of your education until the completion of your college program. At that time you will be

responsible for repayment of the loan at a reduced interest rate. These include: National Direct Student Loan (apply through FAF), and Guaranteed Student Loan (apply through separate GSL application). Loans are also available to parents of dependent students (called PLUS or ALAS loans). The state of Alaska provides a low-interest loan for Alaska residents. Attendance at an out-of-state institution is allowed and applications obtained from the Financial Aid Office (FAO) at NC or FAO at a local college in Alaska.

3. Employment opportunities are plentiful in the greater Seattle area for NC students. Some on-campus jobs are available. State Work Study jobs are also available off-campus for NC students. Regular off-campus employment opportunities can be found through our Job Search office. Students who desire to find employment can. Persistence is the key.

Eligibility

Eligibility for financial aid is determined by establishing proof of financial need by completing the Financial Aid Form (FAF) and the Financial Aid Supplement, both available in the Financial Aid Office. The FAF is published by the College Scholarship Service and can also be obtained from your high school guidance counselor.

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
