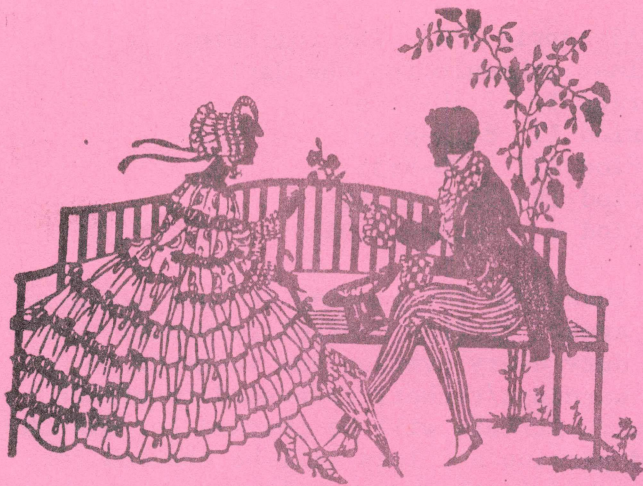

Evangelism MIG--First time this quarter will go out this Friday night. Meet in the SUB at 6:30 and we will leave at 7:00 p.m.

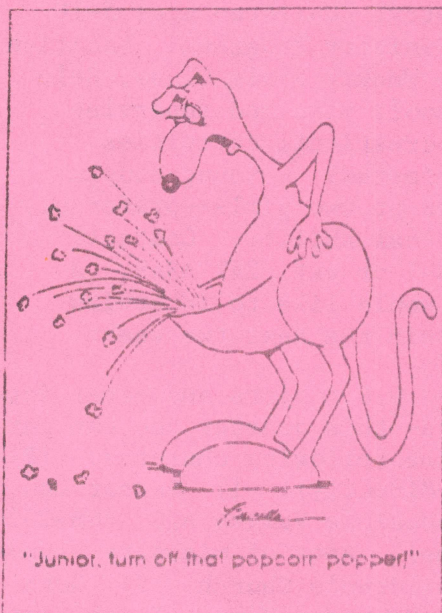
SUMMER C.E. INTERNSHIP AVAILABLE!!
