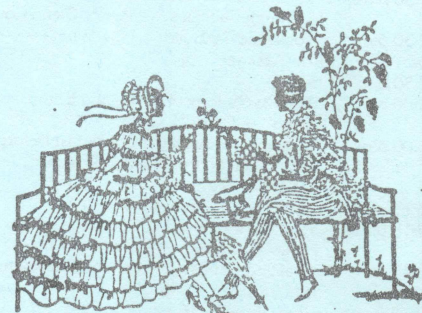


TAKE NOTE-
