REGARDING WINTER ACCOUNT AND FINAL EXAMINATIONS:

If your winter account will not be Paid In Full by March 9, a promissory note must be signed to be cleared to take examinations. Make an appointment with the receptionist to sign a note with the Business Office.

REGARDING SPRING QUARTER . . .

Students should review their finances before entering classes in the spring quarter, to be sure they have adequate finances to cover.

- 1. Students enrolling and attending spring quarter must have their account paid in full or will not be permitted to take final examinations.
- 2. The College cannot co-sign for students for summer loans or promissory notes, or any unpaid spring balance (Board of Director's action)
- 3. Students must anticipate and take the initiative to arrange for their finances (parents, relatives, bank, loans, etc.).
- 4. If a student cannot arrange for adequate finances for spring quarter, they are encouraged to seek full-time employment for the spring and summer months to assure adequate finances for fall quarter.

 (It is not too early to apply for Federal Aid for Fall 1984.)
- 5. Any student, registered for spring, but not returning, should officially withdraw at the Office of the Registrar.



ABOUT THE MINIATURE GOLF COURSE ---

Over the years the MSA has operated as a student service organization. Our projects have included food and money for needy students, clothing, library resources, socials, seminars, having single students over for dinner, films and a variety of other activities. This year MSA decided to sponsor a drive for a miniature golf course.

The idea has been building over the last 4 or 5 years as different students and faculty have commented about it. MSA decided the time was ripe to see if the idea would go. Last fall the idea was presented to the MSA members and also to the college administration. The ASB executives were informed that MSA was acting as sponsor. The

procedure is in four phases.

Phase one was a feasibility study. A number of students were informally polled and a number of formal contacts were made. It was decided that the idea was sound and would be beneficial to student recreational life.

Phase two (just completed) was a contest to solicit student involvement in the designing of individual holes. A committee was formed to guide this involvement and to judge the entries. Prizes were donated by the NC Bookstore and Sunshine Pizza Exchange. At this point no student funds have been spent except MSA has covered the costs of the fliers advertising the contest.

Phase three is next and is a little more difficult. The Campus Planning arm of the Administrative Council will be given a detailed plot plan. We can rest assured that there will be no building on campus that has not been thoroughly checked and approved by this Committee. We are all very proud of what God has given us and desire to keep everything at a very high standard. The selected designs will be drawn up in a detailed plot plan. Everything must be easy care, durable, attractive, and made to blend into the natural environment.

Phase four is the expensive stage. There are no student or college funds allocated for the building of the course. A complete list of materials and costs will be made up from the final plot plan. We will then seek permission from our Director of Development to contact businesses, friends and/or alumni for help. We will also approach ASB executives for permission to present projects to any student group that may be interested in sponsoring. We will even have workdays and dig in the dirt together. There will be absolutely no pressure allowed. MSA undertook the sponsorship of this drive strictly within their tradition of service to others and we will not allow a project like this to become a taskmaster. MSA receives no 'glory' from this; our name will not even be on it. We are interested in you.

As you can see, the hard part is yet to come, but we'll give it our best 'shot'. Please pray with us for His direction and provision in this project. Thank you
