ARE YOU CONSIDERING A FOCUS IN TESL? You need to know that the four TESL courses will be offered this summer during the month of August: English 410 (Introduction to TESL), August 10-14; English 411 (Method and Materials for TESL), August 17-21; and both English 415 and 420 (Teaching Reading to ESL students and Teaching Writing to ESL Students), August 24-28.
