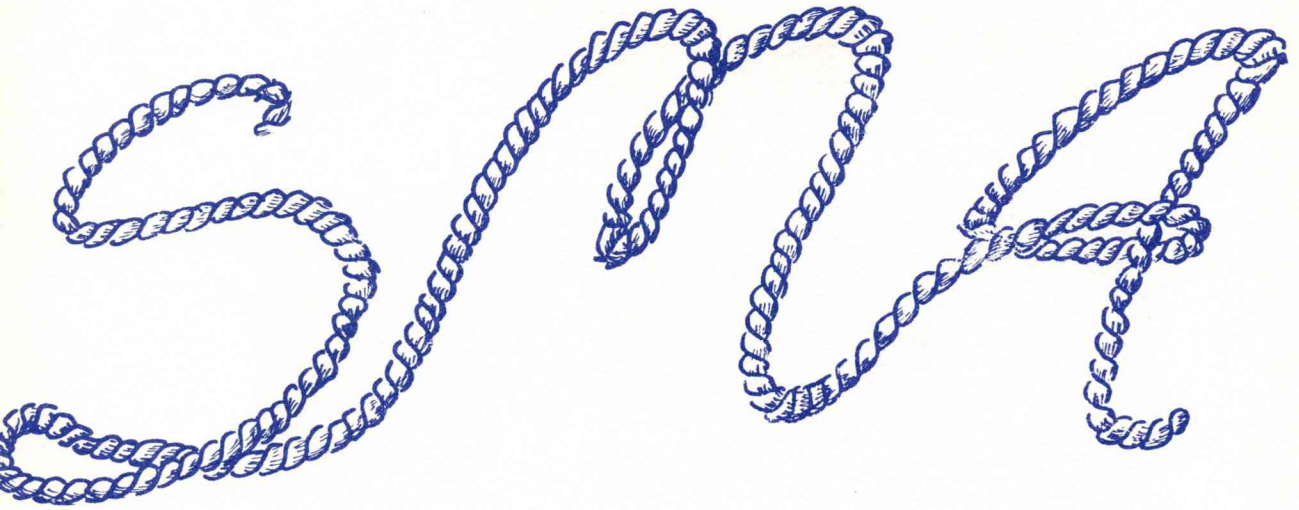

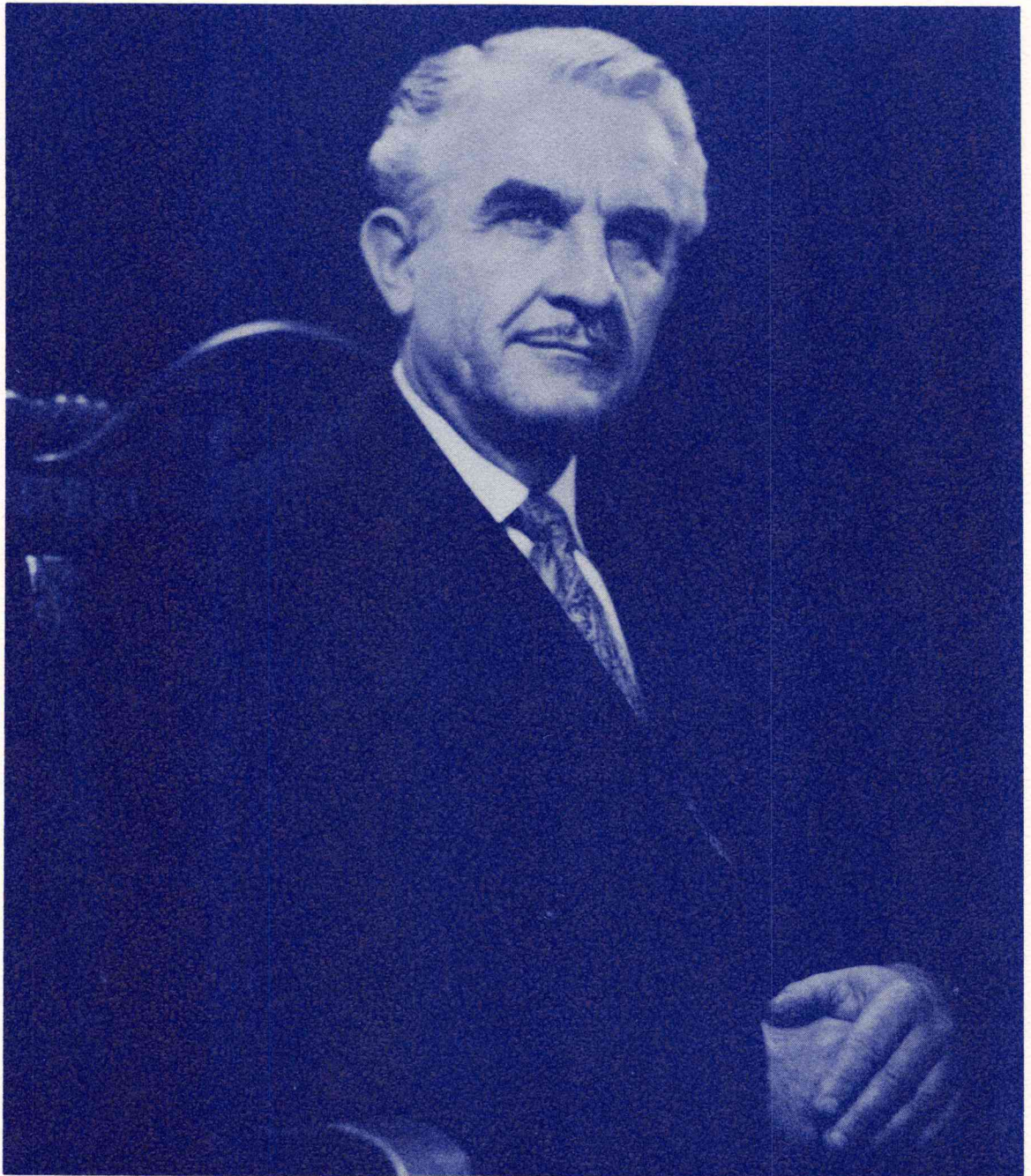
Gladly accepting Christ as the pilot of our lives, we have chosen the theme, "On Board Ship with Christ," for the 1954 Karisma.

## DEVOTIONS

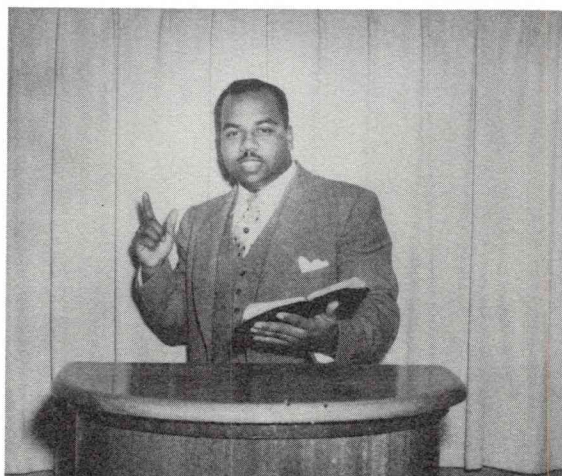

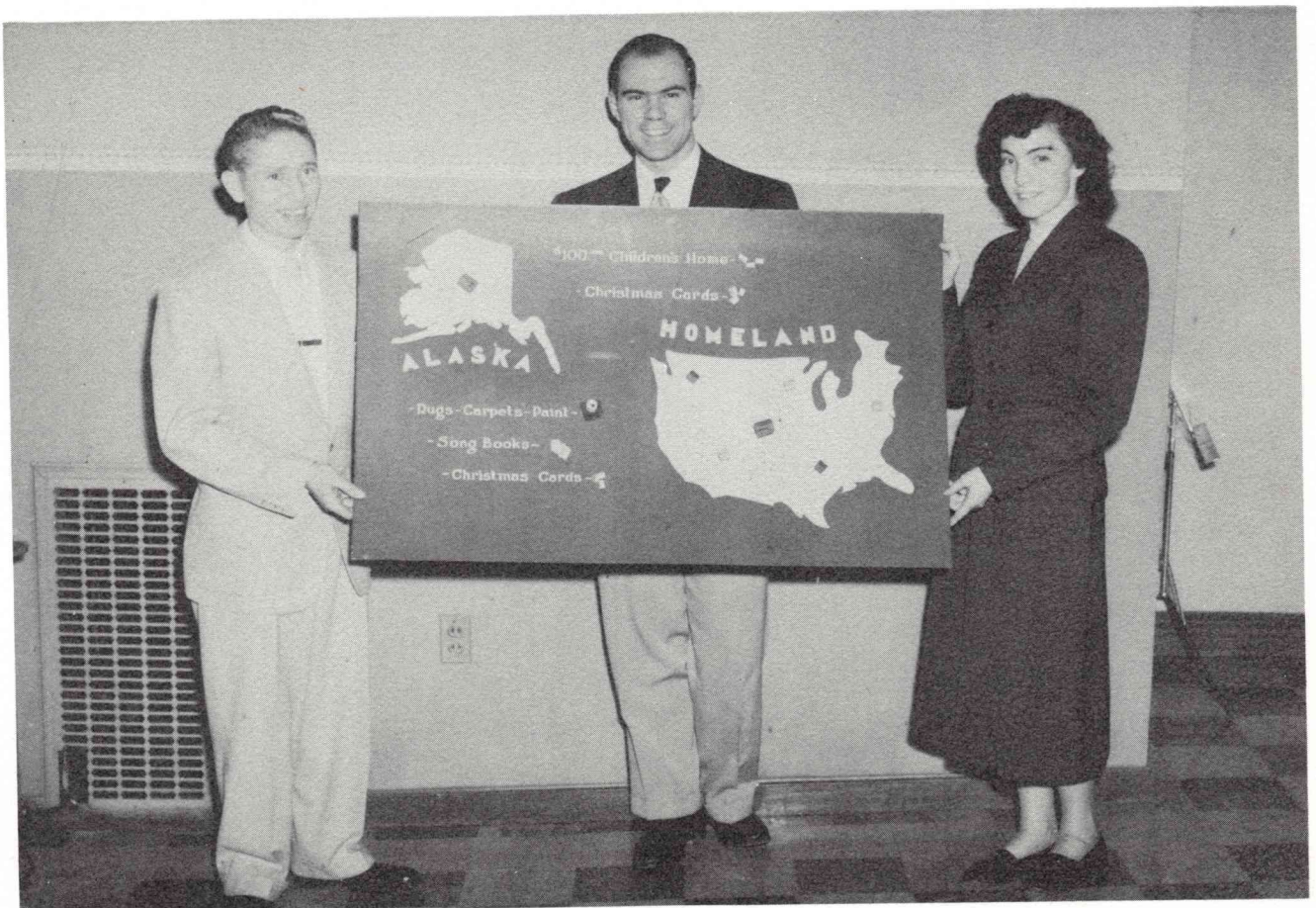
# HOMELAND AND ALASKA

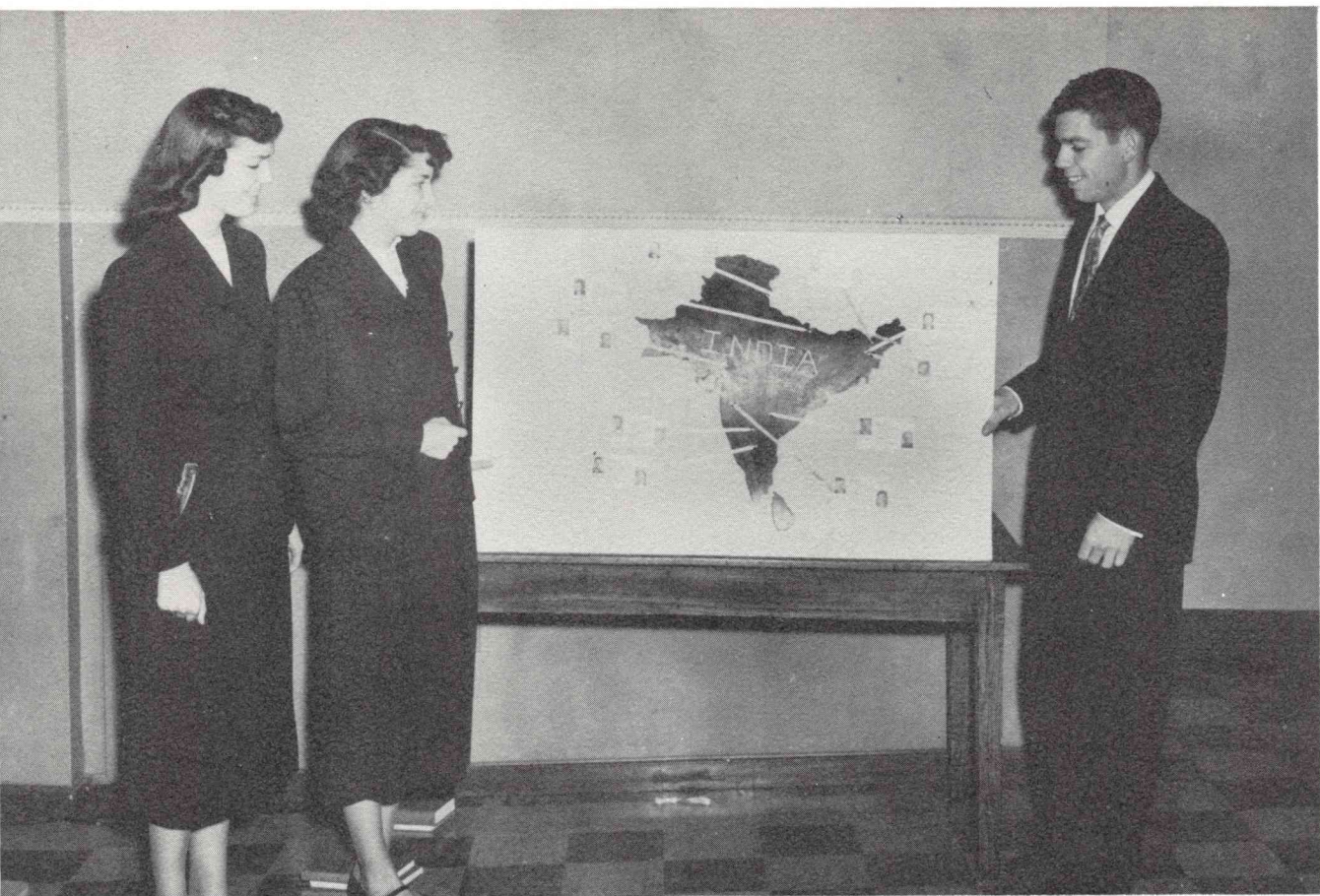
## ISLANDS OF THE SEA

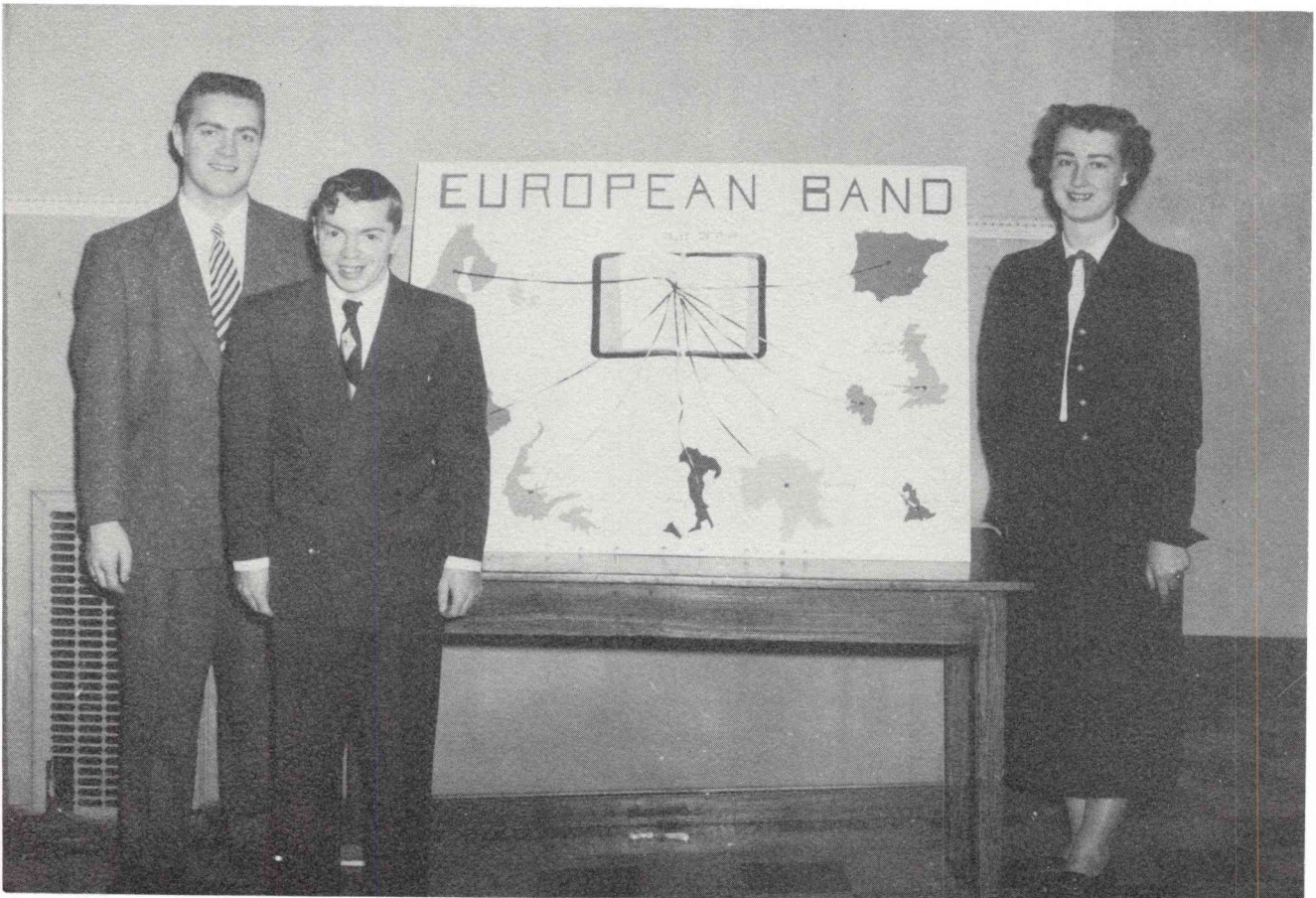
# EUROPE

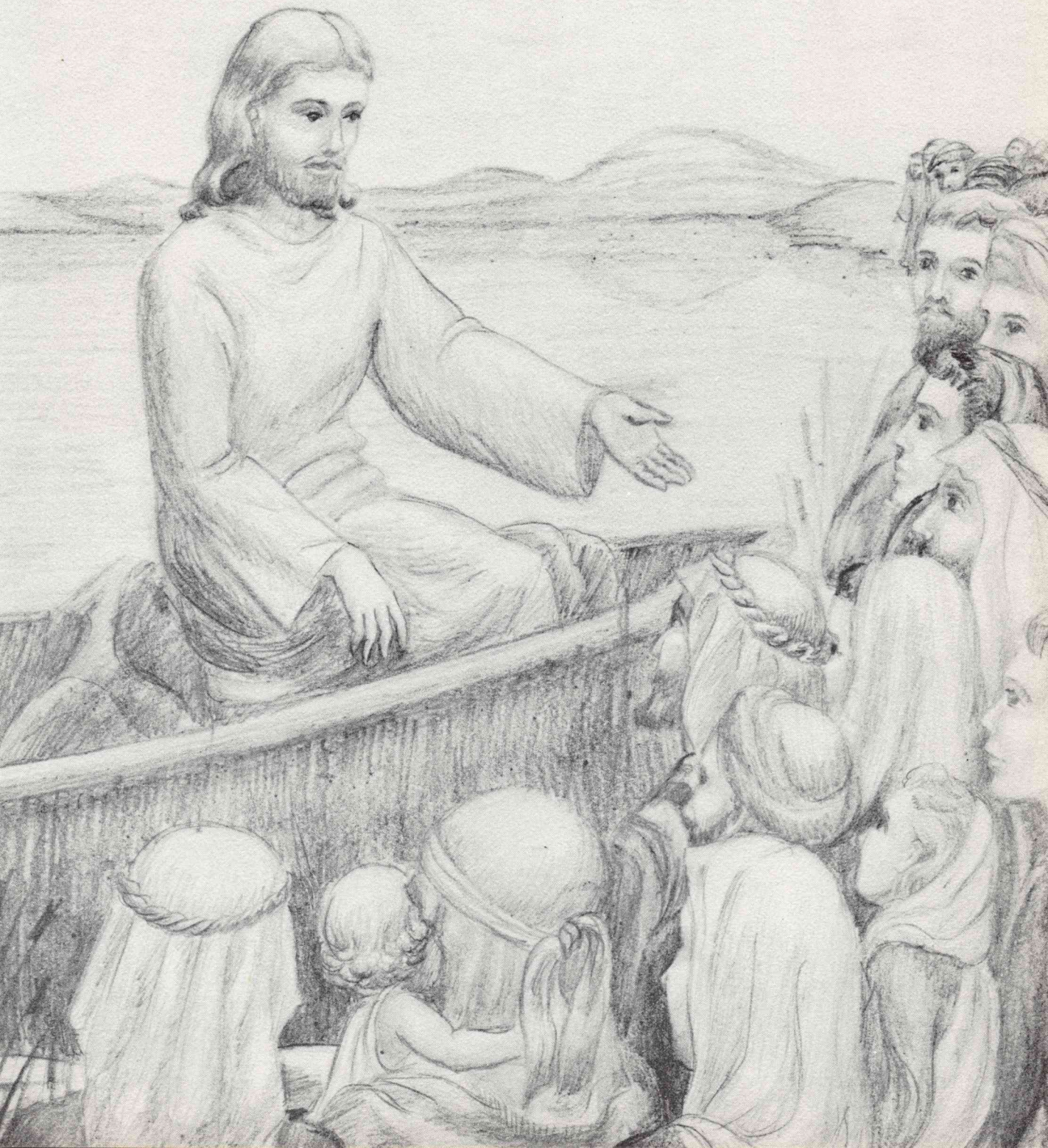
## LATIN AMERICA

# STUDENT COUNCIL



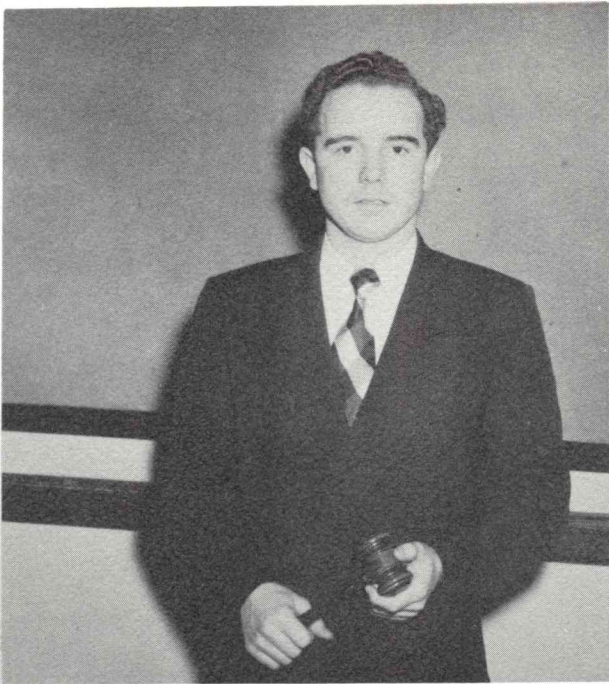

With thanksgiving to God for His blessings, the Student Council looks back on a year in which progress was made for N. B. C.



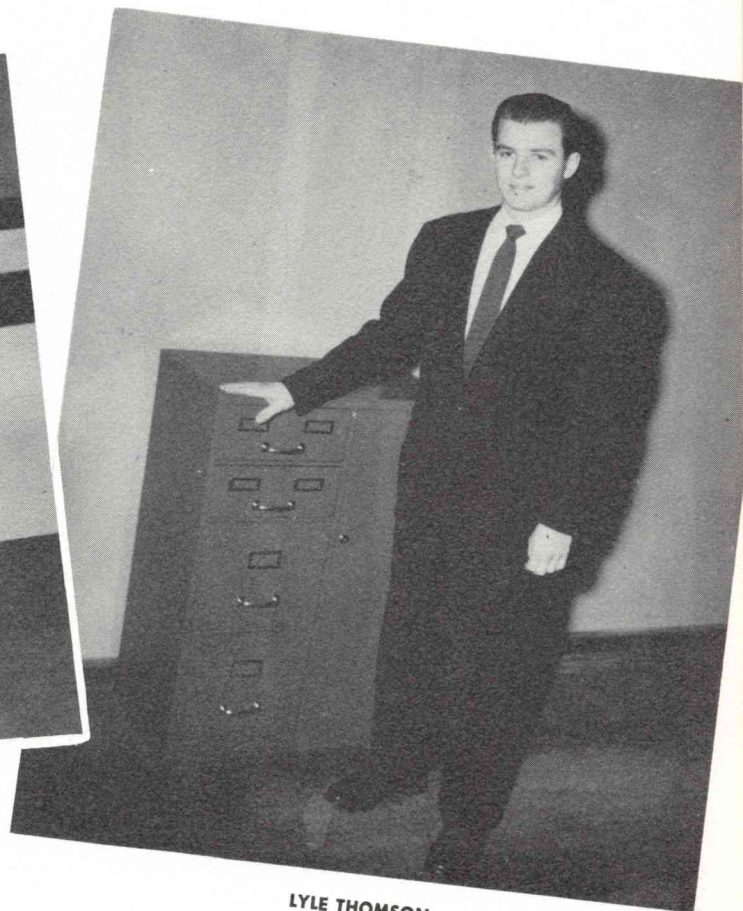

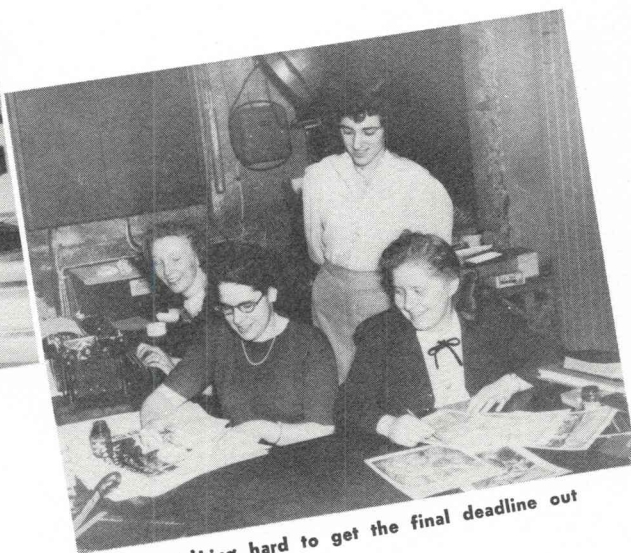
## KARISMA STAFF

The KARISMA, meaning "Gift of the Holy Spirit" is a map showing one year of our voyage with Christ.



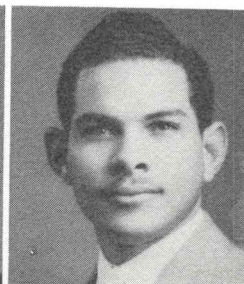

Practical experience, essential in the development of Christian workers, is given the student through Gospel team work. There is a constant demand for these groups, giving every student an opportunity to serve.



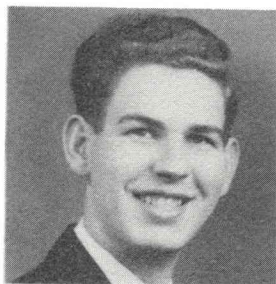

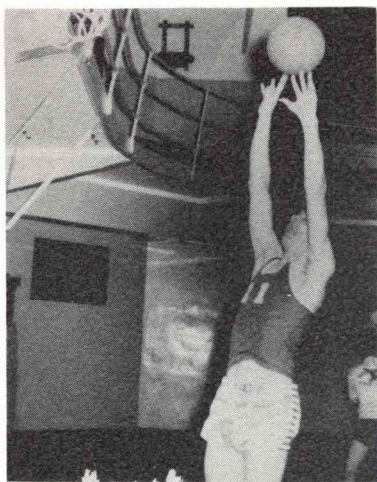
### BASKETBALL . . .
