Dr. Fee joined the Gordon-Conwell faculty in 1974 after five years as associate professor of Bible at Wheaton College, Illinois. He had previously taught New Testament for three years at Southern California College, Costa Mesa, California.

Ordained to the ministry after earning his B.A. and M.A. degrees at Seattle Pacific College, he pastored the Assembly of God Church, Des Moines, Washington for four years. He received his Ph.D. in New Testament from the University of Southern California.

Dr. Fee's field of specialty is interpretation of the New Testament. He has published widely in his field, including a recently published study guide on First Corinthians. Currently he is collaborating with Old Testament Professor Douglas Stuart in writing a book on interpreting the Bible, which is soon to be published by Zondervan.

Dr. Fee is best known for his enthusiasm in the classroom, combined with a deep love for Scripture as the Word of God. During his Wheaton years he was chosen Senior Teacher of the Year for 1973. He has frequent engagements in churches and missionary contexts, as well as on college campuses, having held Staley Lectureships and Spiritual Life conferences at Wheaton, Taylor University, Eastern College, Evangel College, Seattle Pacific University, Asuza Pacific College and Southern California College.

He and his wife Maudine live in South Hamilton, Massachusetts. They have four children: Mark and Cherith have recently graduated from Wheaton; Craig is currently a junior at Wheaton; and Brian is now attending Boston University after a semester at Bethel College (Minneapolis).
