Dr. McGee received his B.A. at Central Bible College, M.A. in Religion at Concordia Seminary, M.A. in History at Southwest Missouri State University, and Ph.D. in Historical Theology at Saint Louis University. He is the author of This Gospel Shall Be Preached: A History and Theology of Assemblies of God Foreign Missions to 1959 (Gospel Publishing House, 1986) and has contributed articles to The Pentecostal Evangel, Paraclete, Assemblies of God Heritage, and International Bulletin of Missionary Research. In addition he serves as the co-editor of the forthcoming Dictionary of Pentecostal and Charismatic Movements (Zondervan, 1988).
