Dr. Bill Menzies is a noted author and educator currently serving as a Professor in Biblical Studies at Evangel College in Springfield, Missouri. He has been an ordained minister of the Assemblies of God since 1956.

Dr. Menzies received B.A. Degrees from Central Bible College (1952) in Springfield, Missouri, and from Wheaton College (1953) in Wheaton, Illinois. He also earned his M.A. from Wheaton (1957) and a Ph.D. from the University of Iowa (1968).

After pastoring five years in Michigan, Dr. Menzies spent twenty-six years in Springfield, Missouri in various faculty and administrative positions at Central Bible College, Evangel College, and the Assemblies of God Theological Seminary. He also served one year as interim president of the Far East Advanced School of Theology in Manila, and as vice-president for Academic Affairs at California Theological Seminary in Fresno, before returning to the faculty at Evangel College.

Dr. Menzies has authored *Anointed to Serve*, a history of the Assemblies of God, *Understanding the Times of Christ, Understanding Our Doctrine, Philippians: The Joyful Life*, and many contributions to other books and numerous magazine articles.

Bill and his wife Doris have two sons, Glen and Robert, who are both licensed Assemblies of God ministers.
