Dr. Russell P. Spittler is a noted educator, author, and professor of New Testament at Fuller Theological Seminary. Having served at Fuller since 1976, his most recent leadership assignment has been as the director of the David du Plessis Center for Christian Spirituality.

Dr. Spittler began his commitment to Christian higher education as a professor at Central Bible College in 1958, after completing the M.A. degree at Wheaton Graduate School, and the B.D. (or more commonly known as the M.Div.) degree from Gordon-Conwell Theological Seminary. He accepted a faculty assignment at Southern California College in 1967. He received the Ph.D. degree from Harvard University in 1971. In 1973, he became the academic dean at Southern California College; a position he held until his departure to Fuller Theological Seminary.

His publications include The Corinthian Correspondence, Gospel Publishing House; Perspectives on the New Pentecostalism, Baker Book House; and God the Father, Gospel Publishing House. Among recent articles published are titles such as "Maintaining Distinctives: The Future of Pentecostalism," and "Charismatic Pastoral Care." New commentaries on 1 and 2 Thessalonians and 1 Corinthians are soon to be released.

Dr. Spittler is an ordained minister with the Assemblies of God and a Chaplain in the U.S. Naval Reserve. His wife, Bobbie, is a fourth grade teacher at Valley Christian School in Sun Valley, California.
