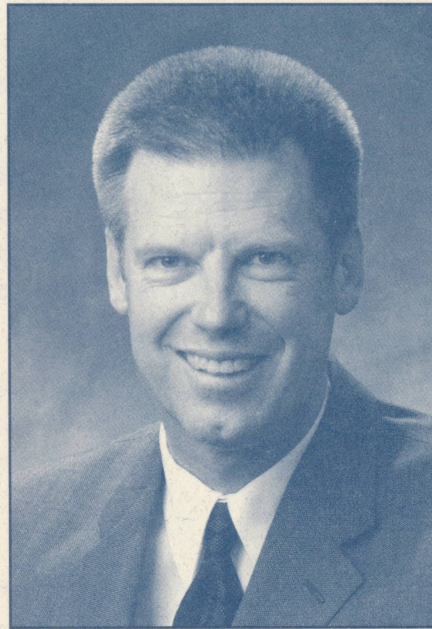
PRESIDENTIAL INAUGURATION

Dr. Joseph Castleberry earned a Bachelor of Arts degree from Evangel University in 1983, a Master of Divinity degree from Princeton Theological Seminary in 1988, and a Doctor of Education degree in International Educational Development from Columbia University in 1999. He is an ordained minister in the Assemblies of God, Northwest University's sponsoring denomination. He has lived and served extensively in Central and South America.

Dr. Castleberry served as academic dean at the Assemblies of God Theological Seminary from January 2003 to July 2007. He has wide experience as an educator, missionary, and pastor. He also has written and spoken globally on a wide variety of subjects.

As a missionary, he served as academic dean of the Assemblies of God Biblical Seminary in Quito, Ecuador (1997-2001) while also serving as the pastor of Centro Cristiano del Norte, which planted four "daughter" churches under his leadership.

He is also founder of the Freedom Valley Project, a community development ministry among the African-American people of Ecuador's Chota Valley Region. Before his ministry in Ecuador, he served as associate dean for Latin America at Global University,



as a missionary in El Salvador and as the Assemblies of God chaplain at Princeton University.

His publications include articles in *Rev. Magazine*, *Enrichment*, *Encounter*, *The Encyclopedia of Protestantism*, *The Encyclopedia of Pentecostal and Charismatic Christianity* and *Pneuma*. He has also written two New Testament Greek self-study textbooks (Global University Press) and a chapter in *The Spiritual Gifts in a Postmodern Age*. His current research interests include the intersections between globalization and Christian mission and the relationship between Pentecostal and postmodern thought.

"I believe it is within Northwest University's reach to become a world-class model of academic excellence that is loyal to the faith and spiritual power of our forefathers," stated Dr. Castleberry.

"I can foresee the continued deployment of Northwest University graduates around the world and an ongoing relationship with them that brings the world to the campus and takes the campus to the world. Given the Northwest region's rich heritage of foreign missions, such a vision is deeply consistent with our ethos and tradition."

Dr. Castleberry and his wife Kathleen have three daughters, Jessica, 18, Jodie, 16, and Sophie, 9.

PRESIDENTIAL INAUGURATION

HISTORY OF NORTHWEST UNIVERSITY

Northwest University was founded by the Northwest District Council of the Assemblies of God and opened to students on October 1, 1934. The District Presbytery appointed Dr. Henry H. Ness to be the first president. Northwest was housed in the facilities of Hollywood Temple, Seattle, Washington, for the first twenty-five years of its existence.

Dr. C.E. Butterfield succeeded Dr. Ness in 1949, and Dr. D.V. Hurst assumed the presidency in 1966 and served through 1990. He was succeeded by Dennis A. Davis, who served as the fourth president from 1990 to 1998. Dr. Don Argue served as the fifth president of Northwest University from 1998 to 2007.

Originally known as Northwest Bible Institute, its institutional name was changed to Northwest Bible College in 1949 and to Northwest College of the Assemblies of God in 1962. In January 2005, Northwest College officially became Northwest University. Each change represents a stage in its organizational development.

Academically, Northwest progressed from a three-year to a four-year curriculum in 1948, and in 1955, a liberal arts division was organized. A major milestone of academic development and progress was the

achievement of regional accreditation by the Northwest Commission on Colleges and Universities. Now, as a university, Northwest grants both undergraduate and graduate degrees.

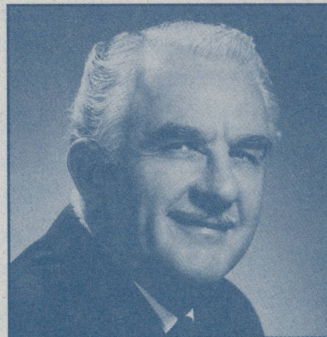
In 1958, Northwest secured a new thirty-five acre campus in Kirkland, in the greater metropolitan area of Seattle. Since then twenty-one more acres have been added to comprise the present fifty-six acre campus. Located at 108th Avenue NE and NE 53rd Street, just ten miles from downtown Seattle, the campus is an ideal setting for study, recreation, and inspiration. The campus is also near to area corporations, resulting in employment opportunities for students and alumni.

In May, 1992, Northwest University became the eighty-fifth college approved for membership in the Council for Christian Colleges and Universities, an association of one hundred five Christ-centered colleges and universities of the liberal arts and sciences.

Over the years, the University's alumni have engaged in full-time Christian service in professional, business, or vocational occupations in fulfillment of Northwest University's vision statement to *Carry the Call* with heart, head and hand.

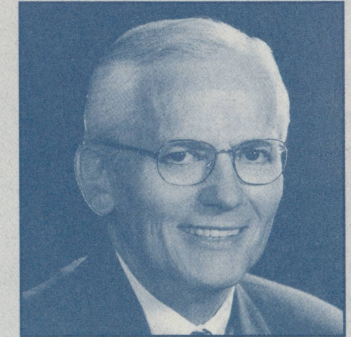
