Deborah Wilds currently serves as a program officer for education at the *Bill* and Melinda Gates Foundation, where her responsibilities include serving as the Foundation's liaison to the Gates Millennium Scholars Program, the Gates Cambridge Scholars, and the Washington State Achievers Program and developing other college access related programs for low-income and students of color. She is currently responsible for the early college initiative to create 70 new early college high schools across the country.

Prior to assuming her current position, Dr. Wilds served as the Deputy Director of the American Council on Education's (ACE) Office of Minorities in Higher Education, in Washington, DC. At the Council she was responsible for developing strategies and programmatic activities designed to increase and advance minority and women's leadership and achievement in postsecondary institutions. She also served as a Senior Research Associate in the Division of Policy Analysis and Research at the ACE.

Dr. Wilds has conducted extensive research in the area of college access for low-income students and students of color, and was the senior author of the Annual Status Report on Minorities in Higher Education. Prior to coming to the Council, she was the Co-Founder and Director of New Era Education, an independent school and pre-school located in Baltimore, Maryland.

Dr. Wilds was awarded her Ph.D. in Education Policy, Planning, and Administration at the University of Maryland at College Park. She received her M.S. degree in Education Administration from Howard University and her B.S. degree from the California State University, San Diego, in Speech Pathology and Audiology.

The Pageantry of Academic Regalia

The traditional academic attire originated in the middle ages. It began as the regular garb of scholars, whether cleric or lay. In the unheated buildings and lecture halls of the day, the robes, hoods and caps were very practical wear.

The GOWN, whether it developed from clerical or civilian dress, was useful outerwear. In addition, it provided a uniform dress that served to equalize class and wealth distinctions in the community of scholars.

Today, in the United States, the gown is customarily black, though it may be one of the colors of the school (especially of universities following a European model). The wearing of the gown open or closed, the sleeve style, and added trim serve to distinguish the degree levels of the wearers. Bachelor gowns are very simple and are worn closed, while masters' gowns are frequently worn open at the front, sometimes with the arms exposed below the elbows. The doctoral gown commonly has trim down the front and three velvet bars on the sleeves, in black or in the color of the degree field. The sleeve is bell shaped, close-fitting at the wrist.

The HOOD originated as a practical head covering. In modern times it is strictly decorative and ceremonial. The hood is commonly worn by those

holding master's or doctoral degrees and differs in length according to the degree (three and one-half feet, and four feet). The hoods are lined with the colors of the conferring institution, and trimmed with an edging (of three inches or five inches width) in the color of the degree field. The act of "hooding" is part of the traditional ceremony of conferral of advanced degrees.

The "Oxford" CAP or MORTARBOARD possibly developed as a ceremonial combination of a close fitting indoor cap and a soft square-topped academic cap for outdoor wear. (Some schools use a type of beret or tam for doctoral degrees.) The cap is topped by a button holding a tassel which may be black or the color of the degree field (gold for a doctoral degree in some schools).

The tassel is customarily worn on the left by degree holders, thus the bachelor's degree candidates wear the tassel on the right until the symbolic "moving of the tassel" at a climactic point in the graduation ceremony.



The College MACE is the symbol of authority of the faculty and is carried in the Commencement Processional by the official representative of the faculty, the Faculty Marshal.

The central emblem of the mace is the SEAL, which embodies the history, character and purpose of the College. The College Seal pictured on the cover of the Graduation Program contains nine elements: the legal name of the institution; its year of founding; the shield of faith; the centrality of the cross; the lamp of learning; the open Bible; and the small cross and crown denoting the temporal and eternal aspects of the Christian life; and underlying the crest is a ribbon in which are inscribed the first words of the COL-LEGE ALMA MATER, "let light shine out."
