

Masa left his hometown of Nara, Japan to attend college in America. As Masa pursued his associate degree at Edmonds Community College, he made some new friends who invited him to church. Though he was raised Buddhist, he began searching for answers to deal with his life and illness. After accepting Christ, Masa transferred to Northwest University to be part of a Christian community.

He was supported by family, friends, and acquaintances as over 1,500 people around the world prayed for him and his family when his kidneys began to fail in early January.

In memory of Masa, Northwest University has created a scholarship award of \$1,000 that will be presented to a Japanese student this fall.

The Pageantry of Academic Regalia

Traditional academic attire originated in the middle ages as the regular garb of scholars. In the unheated buildings and lecture halls of the day, the robes, hoods and caps were very practical.

The **GOWN** was useful outerwear, and it served to equalize class and wealth distinctions in the community of scholars. Today, in the U.S., the gown is customarily black, though it may be one of the colors of the school. Bachelor gowns are simple and are worn closed, while masters' gowns are frequently worn open at the front. The doctoral gown commonly has trim down the front and three velvet bars on the sleeves, in black or in the color of the degree field.

The **HOOD** originated as a practical head covering but today it is strictly ceremonial. It is commonly worn by those holding master's or doctoral degrees and differs in length according to the degree. Hoods are lined with the colors of the conferring institution, and trimmed with an edging in the color of the degree field. The act of "hooding" is part of the traditional ceremony conferring advanced degrees.

The "Oxford" **CAP** or **MORTARBOARD** possibly developed as a ceremonial combination of a close-fitting indoor cap and a soft square-topped outdoor cap. (Some schools use a type of beret or tam for doctoral degrees.)

The **TASSEL** is customarily worn on the left by degree holders, thus bachelor's degree candidates wear the tassel on the right until the symbolic "moving of the tassel" at a climactic point in the graduation ceremony.

Degree fields are identifiable from this commonly used color scheme: Business—Drab, Economics—Copper, Education—Light Blue, Fine Arts—Brown, Humanities—White, Journalism—Crimson, Law—Purple, Library Science—Lemon, Medicine—Green, Music—Pink, Nursing—Salmon, Oratory (Speech)—Silver Gray, Philosophy—Dark Blue, Physical Education—Sage Green, Science—Golden Yellow, Social Work—Citron, Theology—Scarlet.

The MACE is the symbol of authority of the Faculty and is carried in the Commencement Processional by the official representative of the Faculty, the Faculty Marshal. The central emblem of the mace is the University seal.

Northwest University Mission Statement

The University Seal

The Northwest University seal includes these elements:

- An open Bible, for our commitment to God's Word;
- The lamp of knowledge, for our tradition of scholarship;
- A dove, for our reliance on the Holy Spirit's leading and power;
- A cross, for the centrality of Christ in all we do;
- A braid, for the bonds of Christian fellowship;
- The year 1934, for the year of Northwest's founding; and
- The Latin motto, *Vocationem Dei Gerite*, which is translated "carry, carry out, and be characterized by God's calling." This phrase reconfirms the University's motto: Carry the Call, with heart, head, and hand.



Northwest University History

Northwest University was founded by the Northwest District Council of the Assemblies of God and opened to students on October 1, 1934. The District Presbytery appointed Dr. Henry H. Ness to be the first president. Northwest was housed in the facilities of Hollywood Temple, Seattle, Washington, for the first twenty-five years of its existence. Dr. C.E. Butterfield succeeded Dr. Ness in 1949, and Dr. D.V. Hurst assumed the presidency in 1966. In 1990 he was succeeded by Dr. Dennis A. Davis, who served until 1998. Dr. Don Argue served as president from 1998 to 2007 and currently serves as Chancellor. Dr. Joseph Castleberry was inaugurated in the fall of 2007 as the sixth president.

Originally known as Northwest Bible Institute, its name was changed to Northwest Bible College in 1949 and to Northwest College of the Assemblies of God in 1962. In January 2005, Northwest College officially became Northwest University.

Academically, Northwest progressed from a three-year to a four-year curriculum in 1948, and in 1955 a liberal arts division was organized. Regional accreditation was obtained in 1973 with the Northwest Commission on Colleges and Universities. Now, as a university, Northwest grants undergraduate, graduate, and doctoral degrees.

In 1958, Northwest secured a new 35 acre campus in Kirkland, in the greater metropolitan area of Seattle. Since then 21 acres have been added to comprise the current 56 acre campus. Located at 108th Avenue NE and NE 53rd Street, just 10 miles from downtown Seattle, the campus is an ideal setting for study, recreation, and inspiration. The campus is near area corporations, resulting in employment opportunities for students and alumni.

In 1992, Northwest University joined the Council for Christian Colleges and Universities, an international association of more than 181 Christ-centered, liberal arts and sciences colleges, universities, and affiliate institutions in 24 countries.

Over the years, the University's alumni have engaged in fulltime Christian service in professional, business, or vocational occupations in fulfillment of Northwest University's commitment to Carry the Call, with heart, head, and hand.
