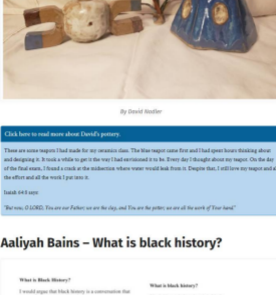

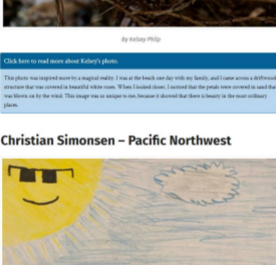
Bryan Nemeth – Daydream
