Coaching Staff

Bill Taylor is the Head Cross Country and Track Coach at Northwest College. The 2000/2001 season marks Bill's seventh year at Northwest. In 1994 he created the Men's and Women's Cross Country programs and in 1996, the Men's and Women's Track and Field programs. All four programs have been on the rise ever since their creation. In just six years of Cross Country and five years of Track and Field at the NCCAA and NAIA level, Coach Taylor's teams have produced 25 National qualifiers, 3 National All-Americans and 13 Cascade Conference Champions. In each of the past two seasons, the women's Cross Country program has been ranked in the top ten of the NAIA and the top two of the NCCAA. In 1999 they brought a second place team finish in the Cascade Conference Women's Cross Country Championship... the highest ever conference finish for any sports team at Northwest College. 1999 also brought a fourth place finish at the NCCAA Women's National Cross Country Championships, the highest team finish for any sport at NC since moving up to NCCAA I.

Prior to beginning the Cross Country and Track programs at Northwest, Bill was an assistant and head coach at the high school level (Lake Stevens H.S., Overlake H.S., and Mountlake Terrace H.S.). He competed collegiately for Bellevue Community College and Westmont College in Santa Barbara, CA.

Bill is assisted by his wife, Tabetha. They live in Kirkland, WA.



During his career at NC, Nicholson has increased the win record from 5-24 (1998) to 13-16 (1999), just missing the Cascade Conference playoffs. Under his leadership in 1999, two players were named to the Volleyball All-Conference team, a first for the volleyball program. Nicholson previously worked as the Director of Operations for the Club Vertical Volleyball Association and coached various teams during the 1996-1999 USAV seasons. He is a 1996 graduate from Evangel University in Springfield, Missouri, in History Education. While at Evangel, he competed four years for the men's club volleyball team and was the first Assistant Women's Volleyball Coach for two seasons. Nicholson is completing his Master's Degree at Seattle Pacific University in Physical Education Sports Administration.




Stephanie Baller Assistant Coach

Jake Woolman is also an assistant coach for the volleyball team.









John Van Dyke Head Coach

Garth and his wife Holly have been married for five years.





Coaches Profile

When asked to write this biographical sketch about myself, I was reminded of the early years of my childhood. As a young girl I always had a passion for sports, so much so, I chose to participate on a boys baseball team. Understand that in the late fifties, this was not acceptable, but because there were not enough young men in our small town I was allowed to play. In high school the closest I could get to a game was as a fan. I knew then that teaching physical education was one of the only ways to be involved in sports. As a freshman in college, I was able to participate in organized sports for the first time. While attending Centralia Community College, I played field hockey, basketball and tennis. I finished my college career at Central Washington State and there I played field hockey and basketball, and in the summer participated on a semi-pro softball team.

I began my teaching and coaching career with two years in Orting Washington. My next job was in Bellevue, Washington, where I spent twenty-eight years teaching and thirty years coaching. In those years I coached swimming for nine years, placing at state in seven of those years. I also coached volleyball and track and field, but my main emphasis was in basketball. In basketball we made twelve state tournament appearances, winning two state championship titles.

When I look back and reflect over those years, it is not the trips to state or even the state titles that I remember, but rather the lives of all those young women that passed through our program. I was blessed to have been raised by wonderful parents who taught me the value of family, and I have carried that with me in all I do. I have always felt that the teams that I coached were simply an extension of my family. The greatest gift I have received is the gift of salvation which came to me at the age of twenty-nine. From then on my desire

was to share that gift with as many as would listen. My hope for the young women of Northwest College is that their love for the Lord Jesus Christ will deepen with each day they live. I pray that they will leave this place with a passion to share the gift of Love while on their journey of life.

Mike began his basketball coaching career fifteen year ago as an assistant in the women's program at Sammamish High School in Bellevue Washington. He spent twelve years with the Sammamish women's program, two with the men's program and one year as an assistant at Mount Si High School.

Mike has also been involved in football programs at Sammamish, Eastlake and Renton high schools. He has coached the fast-pitch softball team at Sammamish for the past sixteen years, the last six as the head coach.

Mike has a great gift to see the potential in an athlete and help them reach their best. He brings a passion for coaching and a love of the Lord. Our team and Northwest is fortunate to have him.

FEATURE -

Kristi Brodin is one of the key people in the history of Northwest College Athletics. She is a person who has been a leader, encourager, worker, servant, coach, teacher, and pillar of strength in the last thirty years for Northwest College. We proudly and affectionately honor her in this publication.

In spring of 1970, President D.V. Hearst and Academic Dean Frank Rice learned of a senior PE major and two-sport standout athlete at Seattle Pacific, who, with her strong Christian heritage, might consider a part time position teaching Physical Education oat Northwest College. The interview process convinced them that Kristi Brodin was the woman for the job: little did they realize that legacy they were helping to begin.



Commuting from Olympia two to three days a week that first year, 22 year old Kristi took the opportunity to form a women's volleyball team to compete at a one day tournament in Portland for the league of small Christian colleges of which Northwest was a part. Borrowing her parents' car to transport the team, Kristi and her players financed everything on their own in those early years, from team shirts to meals and travel expenses. Within a couple of years, this endeavor grew to regular season competition, which began with matches played as a prelude to men's basketball games.

Having completed her master's degree in Counseling and Guidance in 1976, Kristi became a Resident Counselor in the residence halls, as well as teaching and coaching two sports. The surge of interest in women's athletics during the mid-seventies enabled the league to bring in women's basketball during the 1977-78 season, moving volleyball to the fall. Kristi led her new basketball team to the first ever conference tournament championship in the inaugural season.

In 1984, having won the basketball league, Kristi was pleased to learn that her request to take the team to the National Christian College Athletic Association Division II national tournament would be granted. The team traveled to Tennessee Temple University in Chattanooga and won tow of three games to place fifth. After a strong 3rd place finish the next time they went to nationals, 1988 saw the beginning of a stretch of five national titles over seven years. Kristi was honored as national Coach of the Year in 1989.

Meanwhile, the volleyball team was flourishing as well. Breaking into the NCCAA national tournament in 1989 and placing third, they qualified again in 1992, and in 1993 placed 2nd in the nation, narrowly missing the championship in a grueling five game match.


The demands of two-sport coaching atop teaching responsibilities prompted Kristi to turn the volleyball program over to the more than capable hands of Ross Johnson. Meanwhile, as basketball coach and as a recognized leader in the NCCAA, into whose Hall of Fame she was inducted in 1995, she helped to guide Northwest during the first year of full participation in the NAIA, the team made its first appearance ever at the Division I NCCAA nationals, and logged its first NAIA conference victory.
