
In the midst of darkness, the light shining afar off is a promise of hope. What a difference it makes to the weary, confused traveler!

Perhaps it has been experience that taught Professor Fee to be the great counsellor and friend to the student. He has pastored churches in Oregon and California. In Port Angeles, Washington, he pastored several years. There he saw through to the finished product of a new church.

In the Northwest District, Professor Fee served on the Presbytery during his Port Angeles pastorate. During the years, 1949-1951, he was on the Northwest Executive Committee. He had the position of chairman for the National S. S. Convention Housing Committee in 1949.

1953 marked the year that he joined the faculty of NC. He served as the Dean of Men for a while here and at the same time, served as instructor in Bible and Pastoral Studies. Today, Professor Fee is reknown as a Bible teacher throughout the Pacific Northwest region.

The completion of the work for his baccalaureate degree was done at NC and the UW. He went on to seminary at Winowa Lake School of Theology in Indiana. There he received his M.A. degree in Theology.

The NC student has found a relevant, interested, and consistent, guiding hand in Professor Fee. There are no airs about him; every student is important to him. Students find that he relates to them on their own level, regardless of what is being discussed. He truly has a delightful sense of humor. If there is one word that could describe Professor Fee, it would be "loveable."



WORLD OUTREACH MINISTRIES

Probably one of the most exciting organizations of young people in Christian circles today is that known as World Outreach Ministries (W.O.M.). Every student at the college is a member of W.O.M. and contributes by giving his time, talent, and financial assistance throughout each school year. World Outreach Ministries is administered by a council of students. The council consists of executive members: Dan Cook. Chairman; Grant Hill, Vice-Chairman; Mary Shellberg, Secretary; and Birdie Ballenger, Treasurer. The leaders of the seven Ministry Interest Groups (M.I.G.'s) are: Wayne Sommers and Sue Beaman, Campus Mig; John Tobin, Evangelism Mig; Sandra Britt, Community Service Mig; Emily Carpenter, Children & Youth Mig; Blair Overturf, Missions Mig;

Allen Menaker, Servicemen's Mig; Roy Owings, Gospel Team Mig; and Darilyn Bennett, Publicity Chairman.

What makes W.O.M. so exciting? The students. Because of their constant activity and involvement, their attitude of wanting to do something for God, and their awareness that they are doing God's will, they have been a blessing to many people - on campus and around the world.

The activities of W.O.M. have taken students to SEA-TAC Airports, through the Evangelism Mig, where weekly witnessing to passers-by has seen men and women won to Christ. The Community Service Mig has seen students walking the halls and visiting rooms in local convalescent homes. There they share with the elderly the eternal hope and salvation of the Gospel. Groups of

students involving special music. speakers, and songleaders have been sent by the Gospel Team Mig to churches throughout the Northwest corner of the United States, allowing members to gain experience and feel the thrill of conducting services and presenting Christ. Students in the Children/Youth Mig have been involved in Sunday School programs and have Bible clubs in conjunction with local churches. They have seen the lives of youth changed by the power of God. Numbers of men in the Armed Forces have had an encounter with the living God as students involved in the Servicemen's Mig have given their Saturday night and often their Sundays to work in the servicemen's center in downtown Seattle. Many have gone overseas to serve their country with a bright new hope and a confidence of knowing

Christ as their Savior. The arm of outreach has expended beyond Seattle, even the Northwest region, and has gone around the world via the ministry of the Missions Mig. They have invited guests to our campus such as: Rev. Greissen, Missionary from Hong Kong, and Rev McCalley, Missionary to Nigeria. They have been seen working on buildings for Home Mission churches as well as sending several thousand dollars to areas all over the world for the cause of missions. Every dollar comes from the students.

All this activity of the Student Body of Northwest College would be in vain were it not the attitude with which they perform their ministries. This attitude of deciding to work for God is something which is kindled within the heart of every man. For this reason, the W.O.M. council members have given themselves to the min-

istry of encouaging each student to first develop his own relationship to God so that this will produce the desire to work for Him. This work is emphasized in the Campus Mig. Within the structure of the Campus Mig, the students in the residence halls participate in floor prayer meetings at least once a week. In these meetings as many as thirty students will gather on each floor for a short time of devotion together. In addition to these meetings, smaller groups of students gather at given times during each week in what is called a "prayer and share" group. All of these activities are encouraged to promote a deeper relationship between each student and his Lord. When one considers these desires of the students, it is easy to see a characteristic attitude of wanting to work for God. It also brings an awareness that the

individual is doing God's will for his life.

It is the responsibility of every Christian to be actively involved in ministry for God. The question asked of Peter by Jesus is handed to us today, "Lovest thou me?" The response then came, "Feed my sheep." The students at Northwest are taught this, not only in the classroom, but wherthey find opportunity through World Outreach Ministries. They learn first to advance their love for God at home and on campus, then endeavor to feed the sheep as they work together in areas of W.O.M.

W.O.M. is a vital part of the total program at Northwest College. God has blessed it and given the increase. We thank God for the blessing He has given through World Outreach Ministries.




Looking back over the activities of the year, not many will forget the annual AMS/AWS Christmas Party.
