This fall concert is the second concert performed this year. The fall instrumental recital is Tuesday, November 25 at 7 PM in the chapel. The vocal recital is Tuesday, December 2 at 7 PM in M-1. The Christmas concert is on Saturday, December 6 at 7 PM in the chapel.

The Northwest Music Department, a Division of Humanities, offers four degree programs (B.A. or B.F.A.)-music, music education, music industry, and music ministry. Students may also minor in music. The department has four full-time professors, eight adjunct professors, and fifty-eight music majors. The music education program is certified through the State of Washington.

Performance groups include the Concert Choir, Jazz Band, Northwest Choralons, Vocal Jazz, and Wind Ensemble. Auditions are held the first week of the semester and membership in the groups is open to all students, regardless of major. All groups perform in at least one major concert per semester and perform in other venues throughout the year.
