

FAITH PROMISE GIVING

Faith promise giving to missions is an adventure with God. It involves a commitment made in faith. You promise to give what God provides. It is an agreement between you and God. No one will attempt to collect it. Your promise represents a personal goal of what you want to attempt for God, by His help. A faith promise involves believing God to supply funds that you as a good steward can give toward reaching the world with the Gospel. Faith promise giving allows you to participate in what God is doing in our world through the missionary endeavor of the church. Faith promise giving emphasized not what you have to give, but what you can believe God to supply. If your faith is weak, you have every right to ask God to increase it.

We encourage each person to consider a faith promise of at least \$10 per month, that's \$120 for a year. If 650 of us would do this, we could give \$6,500 per month to missions. By this simple plan we could give as much as \$78,000 per year to missions.

A faith promise is a means of giving to God when we don't have anything else to give. How much can you trust our Heavenly Father to channel through you to reach the millions whom He loves.
