Dr. Rice loves people, has a great sense of humor and wit, and enjoys nature and the out-of-doors.

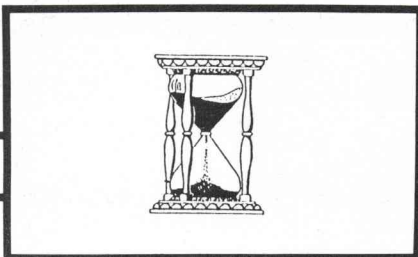
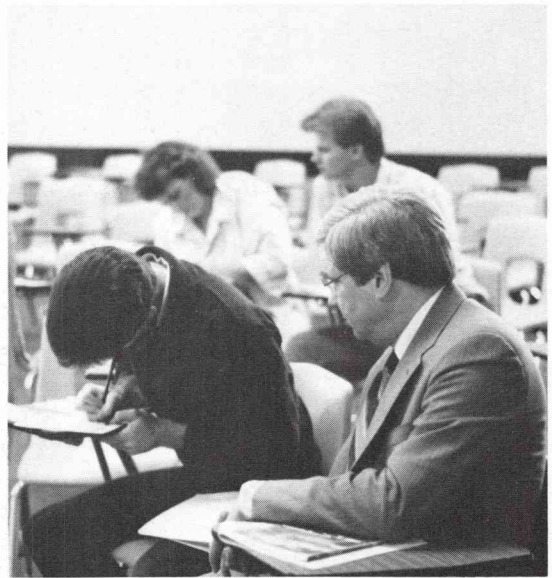
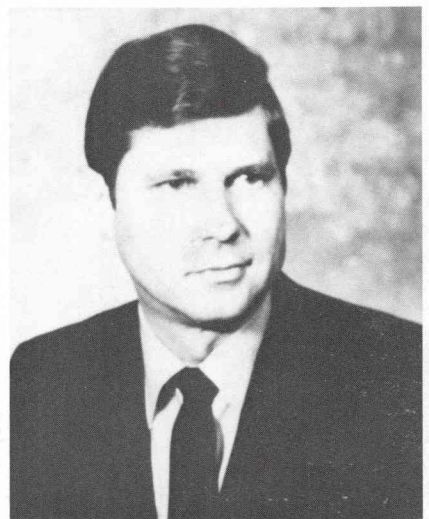
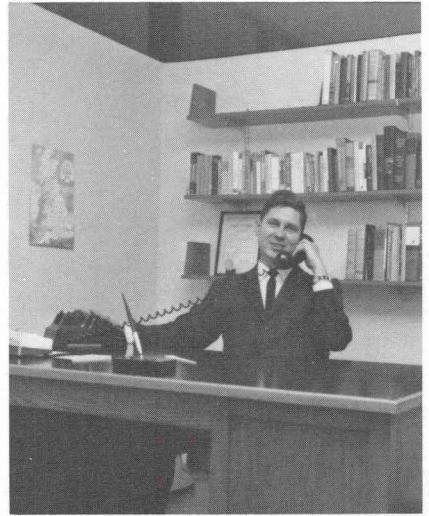
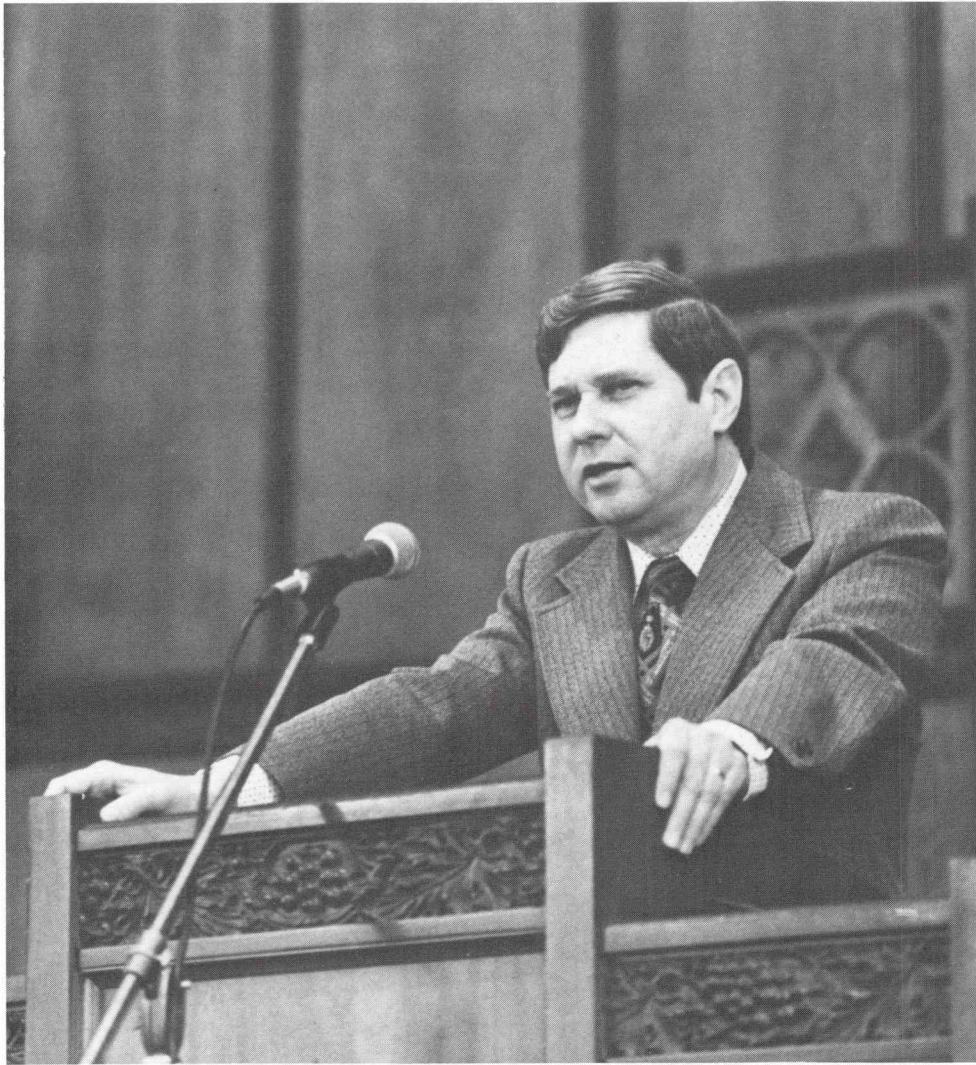
He is noted for an orderly office and an uncluttered desk, which bespeaks his lifestyle of self-discipline . . . a good steward of his time and talent.

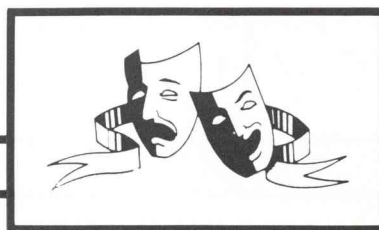
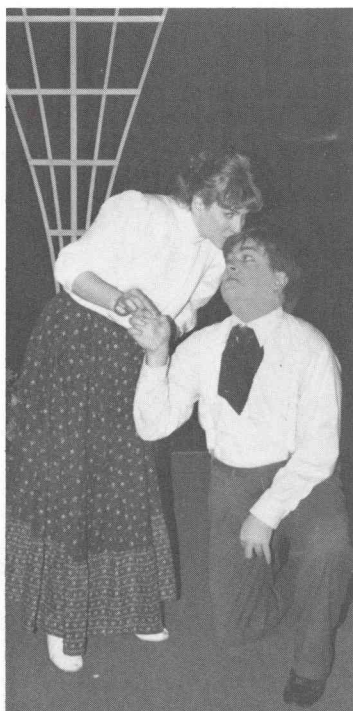
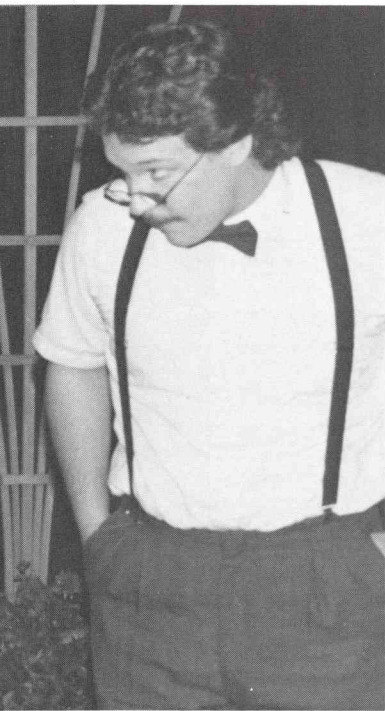


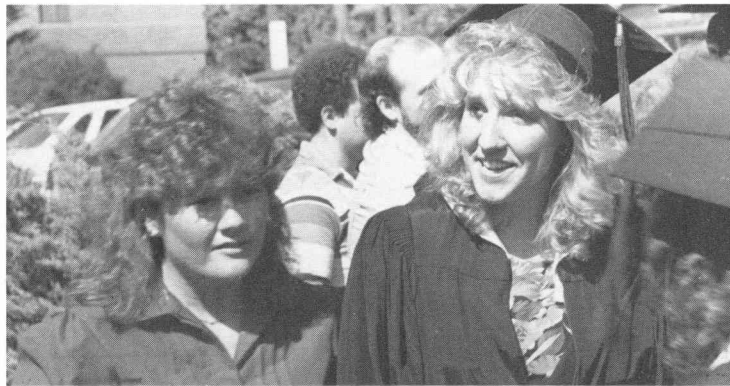
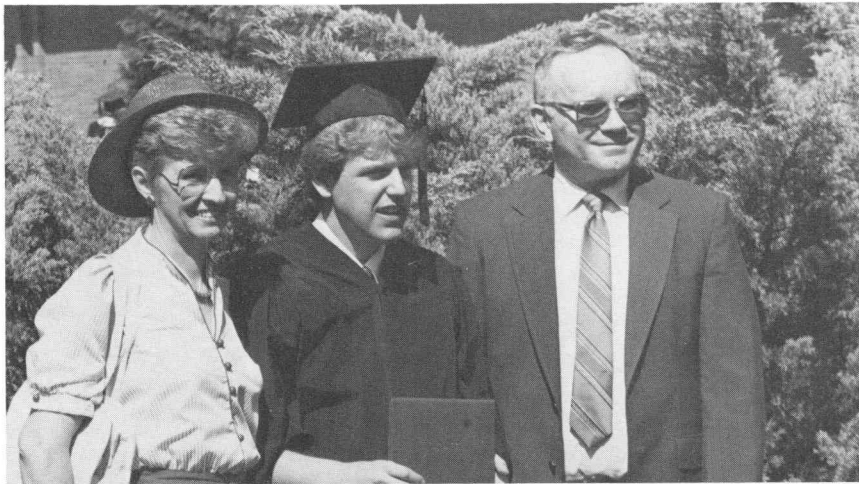
OUR TOWN

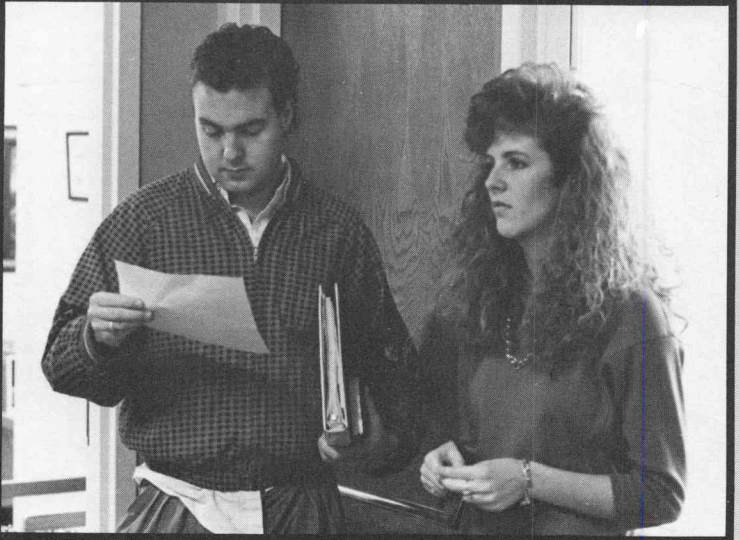
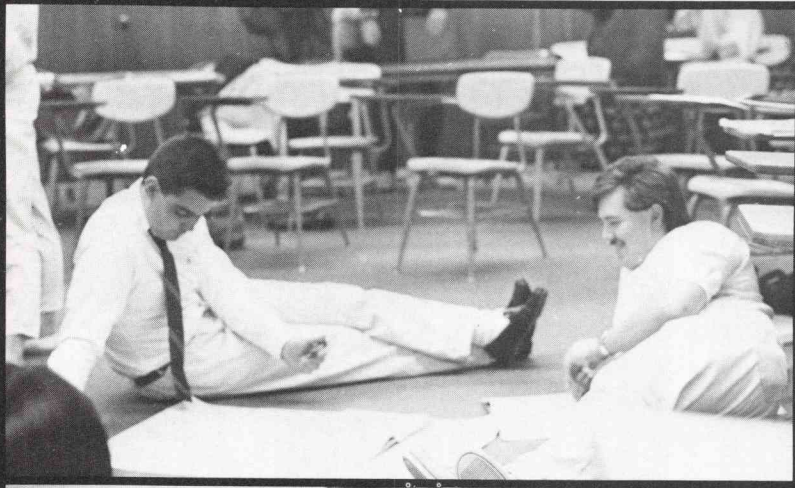
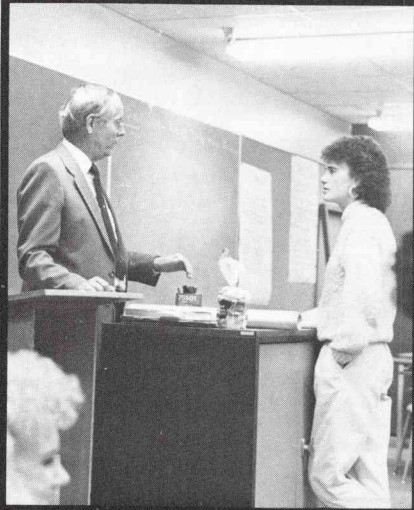
Special guest speaker for the occasion was the Reverend Everett Stenhouse, Assistant General Superintendent of the Assemblies of God.

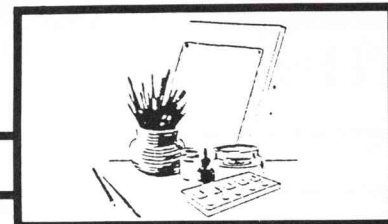
Youth Ministry

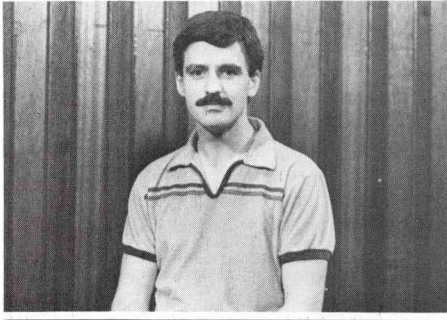

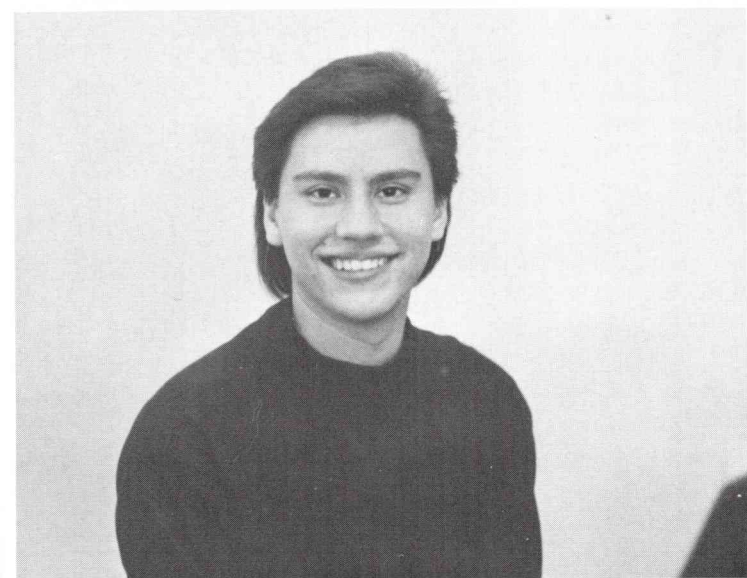
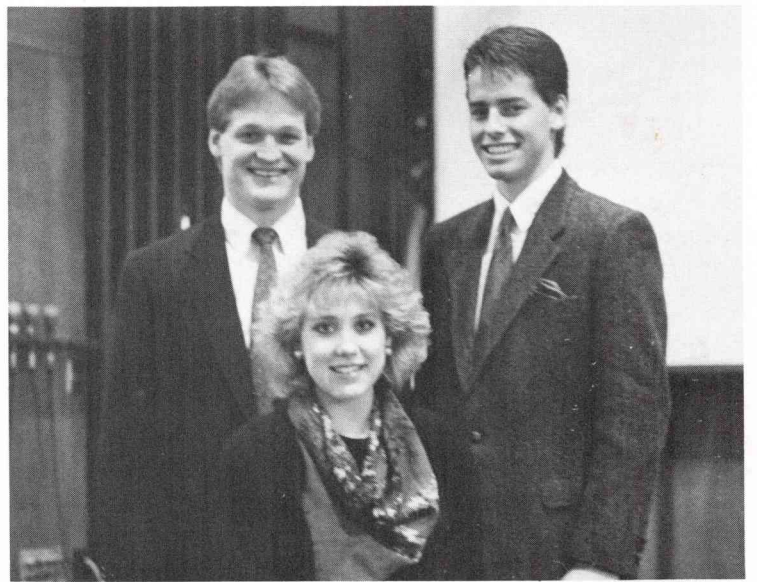


"Instead of focusing your attention on a person's crime, past, surroundings, physical appearance, or behavior, look at the whole person with love and acceptance."

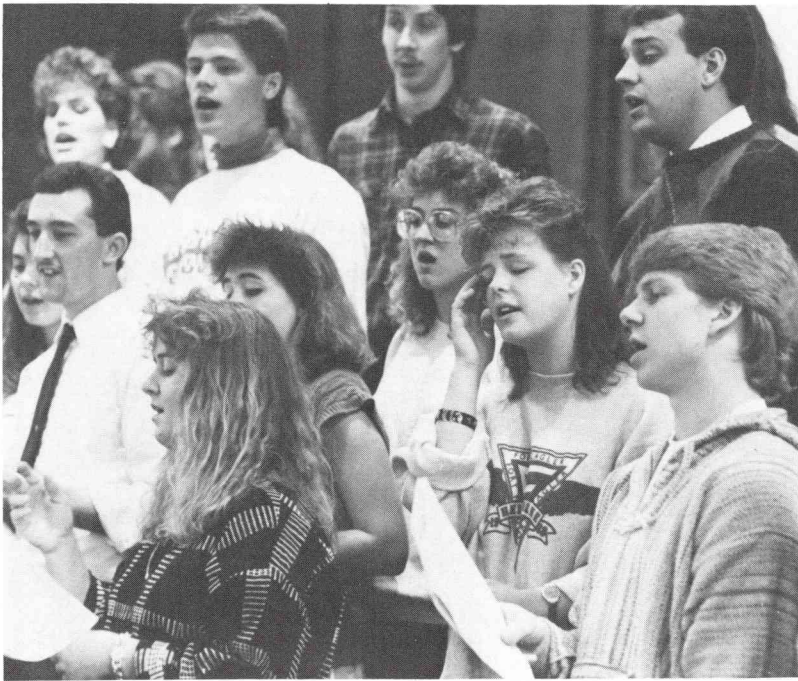






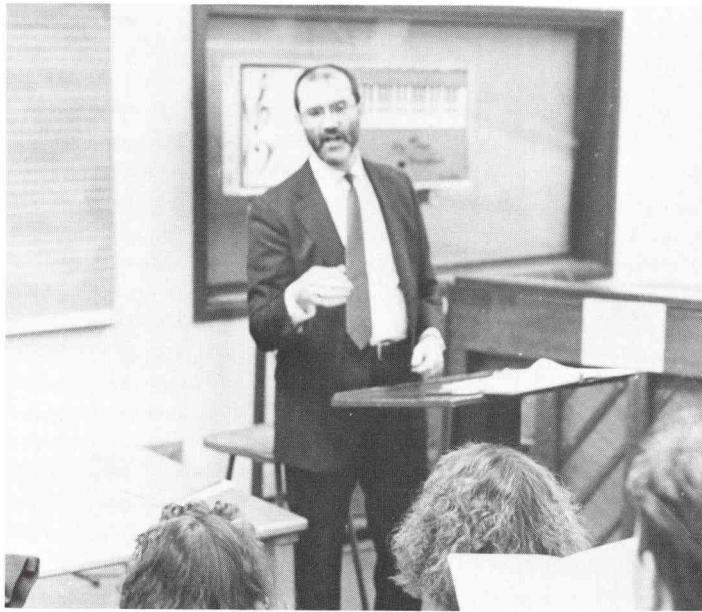
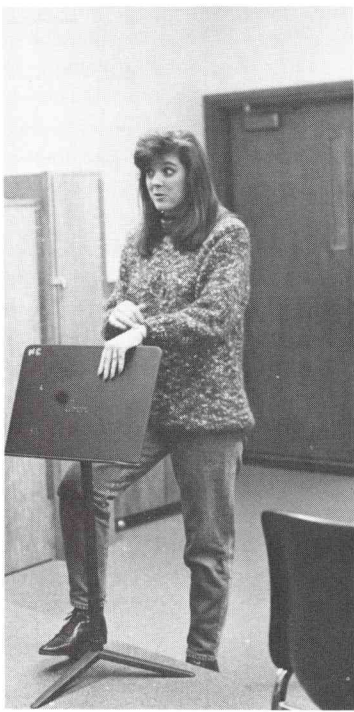


King's Choralons

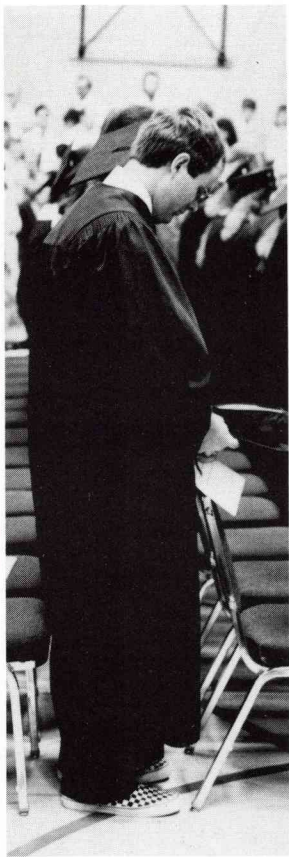
SCHOOL PLAY 1989



The Diary of Anne Frank, an emotional, gripping drama, was chosen as the school play for 1989. The play, given on April 13-15, and 21-22, was directed by Doug Gentry and sponsored by the Northwest College Drama Club.

Although set in Amsterdam during the World War II Holocaust, this play is not without humor. Anne Frank (LeAnna Baty) writes, with the high spirits of a fifteen year-old girl, of the daily occurrences in the hidden rooms shared by her family and four other Jews. In one memorable scene, Anne is taught by Mrs. Van Daan (Deanna Stone) how to speak to visiting boyfriends. "Remember Mr. So-and-so, remember, I am a lady!"

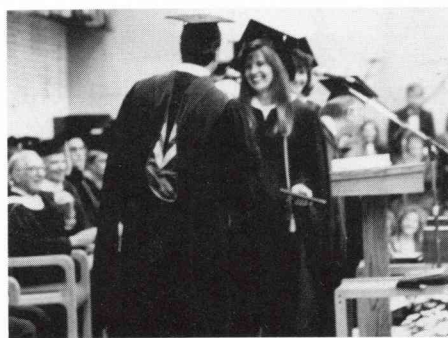
In the scenes leading up to the final capture by the German police, the actors put on a commanding performance of the mounting terror that each character must have felt. They emphasize the reality of the Jewish Holocaust, and cause people to remember so that it will never, ever happen again.



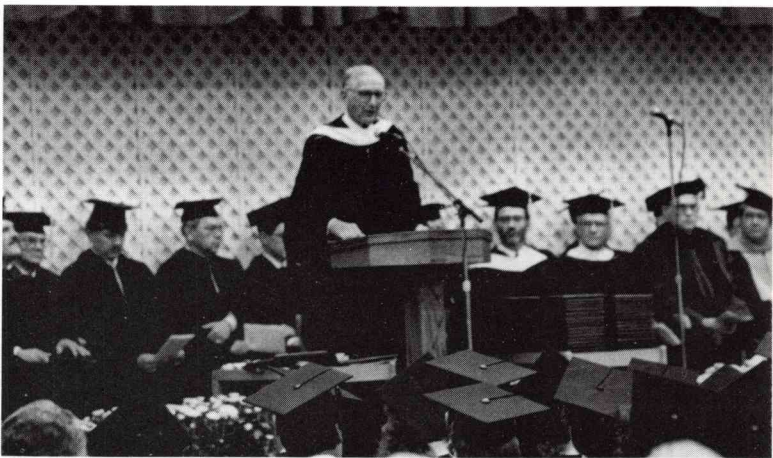

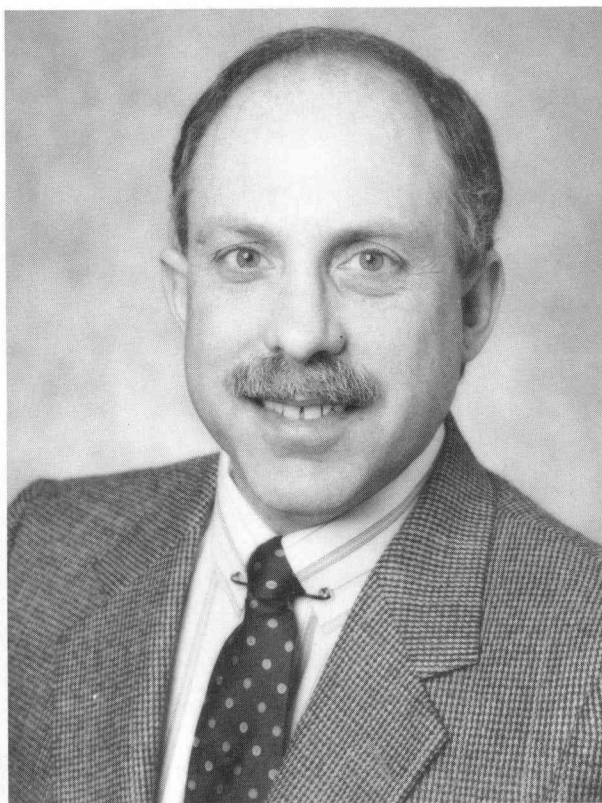
GRADUATION 1989
