SPECIAL HONOR REV. OWEN HODGES





DRAMA CLUB: makes a play for




SPRING PICNIC '86 A TIME OF FELLOWSHIP AND RELAXATION




BACK AND LOOKING FORWARD







For the first several weeks there seemed to be constant tension in the office as we struggled to put pictures and pages together, sometimes till early in the morning.



















BOOKSTORE






DEANS & RC'S "MODEL . . . STEWARD DISCIPLER ... FROG-'KISSER'


NEW FACES-NEW FRIENDS

Meeting and making good friends is one of the most important concerns for all of us, especially for new students. Sure, our prime objective is to study and learn, but it's the close friends who help us make it through.



Spiritual emphasis week was held at N.C. from October 6th through the 10th. The guest speaker was evangelist Dave Roever. The emphasis: commitment and true holiness.

Any artist will tell you that the first step to a successful painting is the atmosphere. Without the proper setting the work will be slow and tedious. So it is with the Master Artist. Before He started His work at N.C., He created an air of expectancy. Moreover, His spirit was preparing hearts, making them pliable and open to His touch. As one visitor said, "This campus is an oasis in the middle of a dry world."






NC Olympics

This year Northwest College played host to approximately 900 high school students. Campus days broke away from the norm and held the 3-day event in the fall to accommodate the new semester schedule.








CHARACTER EXPRESSION


I have had some trials in my life, and I have learned and grown through them. But I am finding that once we are

EAGLES GO 6-0 IN LEAGUE-"THANKS"



"Well, I wanted to take a few minutes to tell you a few things. The first is that I wanted ya'll to know that you are the BEST! Yep, that's right, the BEST!










STUDENT MINISTRIES


MARRIED STUDENTS

The summer of 1985 was the hottest Washington State forest fire season in twenty years. I was a two-year-old Christian on a ten-man fire crew, sent east of the mountains to fight fire.

As the twelve-to-eighteen hour work days dragged by, I started questioning God's wisdom in my being there. The men on my crew were irritable, swore, and told crude jokes. They also ridiculed me for my faith in Christ. I resented them.

And the work! Hand digging miles of trail around fires, carrying hundreds of feet of hose up and down mountains, and packing portable water bags on my back until I became exhausted. I was hot, smelly, and black; I felt like a half-charred presto-log.

Then there was the danger. Already, a helicopter dropped 500 gallons of water on me; furthermore, I was almost crushed by a rolling log, and there were rattlesnakes and

cliffs. "Surely you've made a mistake, Lord!" I would whine.

However, one afternoon as I stood overlooking a beautiful valley, I began to praise God for His creation. I saw an eagle, a deer - and what a variety of insects! Oh, how I loved God's creation!

But my heart called me a hypocrite. How could I say that I loved God's creation, while I rejected the men on my crew, the epitomy of His work!

"Were those scales, blinding pride, the broken Saul of Tarsus cried?"

I repented, quite literally, in dust and ashes.

From then on, God opened doors of witness for me to the entire crew. In the midst of tribulation, He worked His heart for the lost into mine.
