
Born on August 8, 1947, In Lynwood, California, J. Melvyn Ming was raised in a Pastor's home in the Southern California District.

He attended Southern California College and graduated in 1969 with credentials in Secondary Education.

His ministry prior to coming to Northwest included serving as Campus Pastor and teaching history at Monte Vista Christian High School in Watsonville, California; Youth Pastor at First Assembly of God Fairbanks, Alaska; Youth Pastor at Walnut Hill Assembly of God in Dallas, Texas; Associate Pastor at Capital Hill Assembly of God in Oklahoma City, Oklahoma; and Associate Pastor at First Assembly of God in Grand Junction, Colorado.

He and his wife, Martha, were married in June of 1971 and now have two daughters, Hannah Marie, born in September of 1977, and Rebekah Ann, born in November of 1979.

Dr. Ming came to Northwest in 1976 as a teacher of Evangelism and Christian Education. He later developed the Youth Ministries Program. In 1981 he received his Doctorate of Ministries. His Thesis was on Time Management for Assemblies of God Ministers.






In 1984 he was appointed to serve as Academic Dean for Northwest College, the position he currently holds.

Campus Days 1985


For three days, March 28, 29, and 30, approximately 700 high school students from all over the Northwest lived in the dorms and experienced life at Northwest College.






MORNING STAR—The Story of Esther


So it was with weary bodies, sunburned skin, we all went home, knowing that next year, we would return, to picnic once again!


Foreign Student Banquet






Open Dorms




Expectations are high for another winning team next year. Seasoned players are looking forward to returning and are excited about the rookies who have expressed interest so far. "If God be for us, who

Basketball






5-K Run






Up And Coming Disc Jockeys

The finished site will consist of three football fields, a 40,000 sq. ft. training and office facility, streets, parking, and sidewalks. Two of the fields will be of natural turf and one will be astroturf, bubble covering. The college will have use of the astroturf, bubble-covered field for its soccer and intramural programs during certain times of the year. The Seahawks are leasing the property for twenty years with two five-year renewal options. They are spending four to five million dollars towards this development, which will revert to the college at the end of the lease period.

The impact of the addition of the Seahawks to our college campus is immense, both in financial help and in the interaction we will have with the team. Just think, the entering in of this relationship started with a casual conversation between our coach John Brown and Jim Witsel, a Seahawk trainer.





















SLAM!

public school system.


