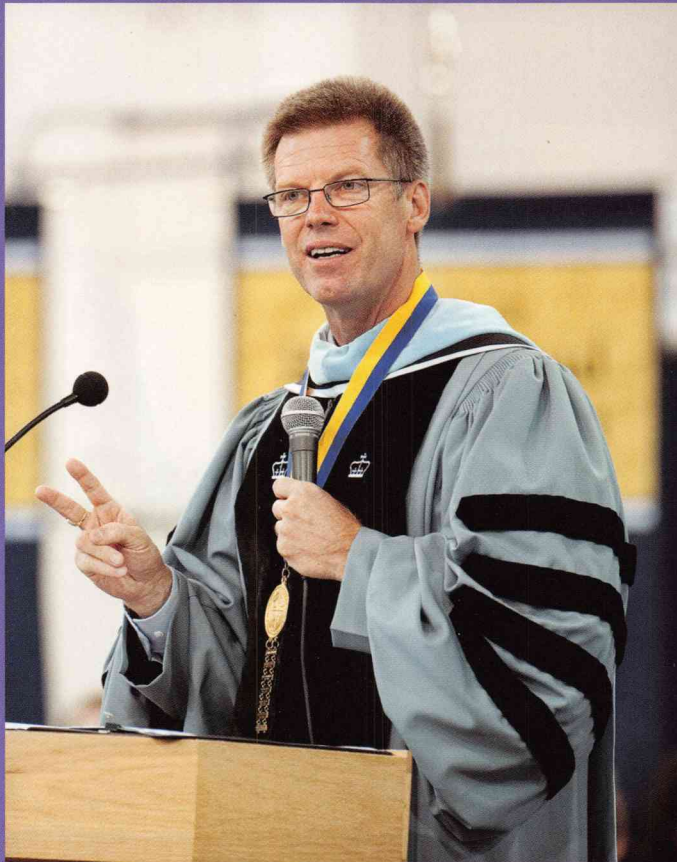

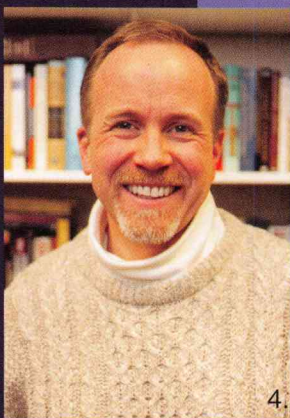

Look What's NU!

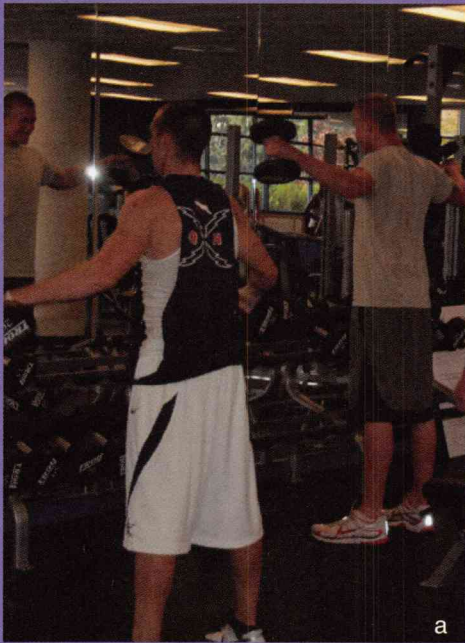

# 75<sup>th</sup> Anniversary

1934-2010



## a 1930's

**1936:** February 6, a "Parade for the Gospel's Sake" of banner-waving students marches the main streets of Seattle, escorted by police, with the NBI band playing, "There is Power in the Blood." A young man considering suicide follows the enthusiastic parade to church, gets saved, and becomes a Northwest student

**1938:** "Scatter Night" students hop school busses to minister in slums, churches, or street evangelism meetings

## 1940's

**1943:** Of 1000 students enrolled to date, only eleven had dropped out, six had died, five were unaccounted for and thought to be POWs, and forty-two had served in the military

**1945:** Fitness is important: female students lined up outside the church for weekly calisthenics... in dresses of course

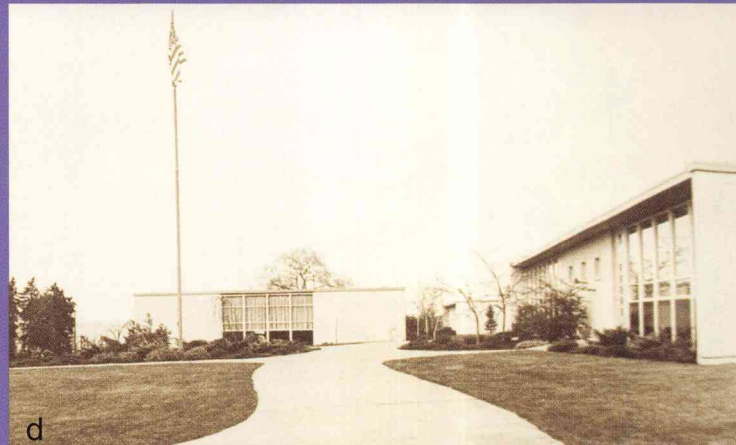
**1948:** The Karisma yearbook was first published

## 1950's

**1954:** Basketball "Eagles" appear under the leadership of coach Harry Leid, but they don't enter league play until 1958

**1957:** The rumor is the class had no yearbook because an administrator got upset at student behavior

**1959:** H. J. Secrist moves his young family to Kirkland to manage the building of the new campus. They work hard and eat sparingly when money is short. According to the yearbook, the tallest student is 6'7", and the shortest is 4'7"



**1963:** The Gymnasium "Pavilion" goes up. The cafeteria and first men's dorm is also built around the same time  
**1964:** "Doc" Pecota becomes Dean of Students, Esther takes over the bookstore from Edith Butterfield, and Duke the dog is everyone's friend on campus  
**1965:** Butterfield Chapel is built  
**1966:** Dr. DV Hurst becomes president, sets up a campus master plan, and builds Guy, Gray, and Crowder Halls

1960's

**1971:** KCNC (Keeping Christ in Northwest College) radio begins broadcasting, playing religious and easy-listening hits  
**1972:** Students begin school-wide participation in World Outreach Missions, and create MIGs, Ministry Interest Groups, or Evangelism, Missions, and other ministries  
**1973:** Northwest gains regional accreditation  
**1977:** NC hosts "Sharing Secrets" fall fashion showcase, featuring attire for brides, grooms, and maids of honor

1970's

**1980:** Summer ministry teams are named 'Wings of Happiness', 'Dayspring', 'Sweet Harmony', and 'Radiant Love'  
**1981:** An unofficial self-defense sports team is formed, sporting 33 members, and 10 are on the co-ed tennis team  
**1986:** Roomies weekend is airplane themed, and named 'Come Fly the Friendly Skies with Me'  
**1986:** The Seattle Seahawks begin to develop 12 acres of land on the NC campus for a cool \$4 million.  
**1989:** Major construction is done around campus including a new entrance

1980's

**1990:** Dennis A. Davis becomes president  
**1992:** The floor known as Crowder 200 (now Crowder 500) is named "The Convent", while Gray 600 is "The Monastery"  
**1998:** Don Argue becomes president

1990's

**2005:** Northwest College becomes Northwest University  
**2006:** Women's Soccer added to NU sports  
**2007:** Dr. Joseph Castleberry becomes NU president and the Health and Science Center is completed  
**2009:** Cafeteria remodeled and Eagle Fitness Center opened

2000's

We are 75 years old. How many students have passed through the halls of Northwest Bible Institute, Northwest Bible College, Northwest College, and now Northwest University! At Alumni Chapel in October, Ruth Cox, student in the first class of Pioneers (1934), donated and rang the Pioneer Bell to commemorate her class at NBI, the founding president, Rev. Henry Ness, and the staff she worked with during the early years. Many pastors and missionaries trained for Christian engagement in the first half-century. As youth, music, and education programs were added in the 1970s and 80s, alumni began to study for school classrooms and diverse ministries. More recently, business, nursing, education, arts and sciences, psychology, and ministry schools work together to send alumni to serve across the world.

All My Sons tells the story of Joe Keller, a successful, middle-aged, self-made man who has done a terrible and tragic thing: during World War II, rushing to meet an order from the Army, he knowingly sold them defective airplane parts which later caused the planes to crash and kill 21 men. ### In His Own Words

“A few experiences in my life stand out as those that I believe have helped me form who I am today. In senior year of high school, I climbed to the summit of Jiri Mountain, the highest mountain in the southern half of the Korean Peninsula. This experience tremendously increased my confidence, which was further amplified when I survived the notoriously tough Korean army. When I landed at the San Francisco International Airport at 9:12 a.m., September 15, 1969, I had only one checked-in luggage, a carry-on handbag, and one hundred dollars. Since then I have never had money sent to me from my family in Korea, which was still poor after decades of Japanese occupation, World War II and the Korean War. My education at Stanford University taught me what excellence is and what excellence requires. I was born in a Confucian family and my public school education taught me that Jesus was only one of several greatest teachers in human history. In Jinju High, a public school, a lesson in English textbook was titled “The Sermon on the Mount.” I was impressed by Jesus’ teaching. His teaching dealt with matters from a viewpoint fresher to me than that of Confucius, digging the essence of thoughts and feelings out of the bottom of human heart and spread out for all to see. His teaching much appealed to me. Nonetheless, the rejection of the notion of virgin birth and resurrection, and so divinity of Jesus always remained in my mind and heart many more years. My science has been an obstacle to my salvation. In time, though, God’s grace triumphed. One day in September 1977, when I was a graduate student at Southern Methodist University in Dallas, Texas I was attacked by a very, very severe, needle-piercing headache. I was miraculously freed from the pain the next morning when someone prayed for me over the phone. This experience immeasurably intensified my curiosity about who God is and how the Holy Spirit works, as well as my thankfulness to him, and led me to diligent reading of the Bible and praying. On a beautiful Saturday in October 1977 I was home alone and my Bible reading reached John 14 and, lo, I met Jesus and surrendered my life to him. The truth of the inerrancy of the Bible simply descended and fully occupied my heart and mind. Knowing Jesus is the greatest experience of my life and truly liberated me. Since then my science has been strengthening my faith, which I share with students from time to time.”

The Northwest University School of Business & Management is an excellent way to develop business skill competencies in the context of a Christian perspective. Our curriculum is designed to prepare students for leadership positions in the business community, church and related ministries, government and non-profit institutions. All of our Business & Management students take a series of core courses in the fundamentals of economics, accounting, management, marketing and finance. Students then select a business field to focus on for advanced courses in either, Management, Marketing, Accounting & Finance or general Business Administration. At the end of the junior year, students travel with their classmates to a foreign county to study International Business. This year and last, we took students to Sydney, Australia for 18 days. Finally, in the senior year, students work in a business internship, allowing them to apply academic training to a real-world experience. Our recent graduates have found positions at Costco corporate headquarters, Microsoft, Expeditors, Clock Tower Marketing, City of Seattle and the U.S. Navy, among other employers.

# school of education

This year, one-hundred twenty undergrads are preparing to teach in public and independent schools. Within four years, they will earn a bachelor's degree in one of fourteen specialties: elementary education all levels (health/fitness, English language learning, theatre arts, or music) or secondary education (5-12 social studies, English, biology, or mathematics). Aspiring elementary teachers also qualify for middle-level endorsements (4-9 humanities, science, or math). Every education major receives academic advising from School of Education professors and faculty members in supporting disciplines, such as music, history, and science. Once students satisfy prerequisites, usually by the end of the sophomore year, they apply for the professional sequences, which includes theoretical and methods courses, as well as practice teaching in K-12 classrooms. Currently, Northwest University partners with a dozen school districts and several private schools to provide hands-on teaching experience. Field placements range from Lake Stevens to Renton and from North Bend to Shoreline. For persons holding bachelor's degrees, the university offers an 11-month intensive program leading to certification and the Master in Teaching (MIT) degree. Thirty-two candidates will finish in July.

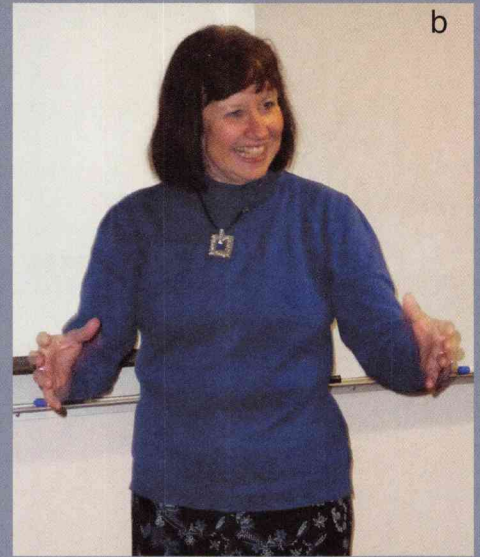

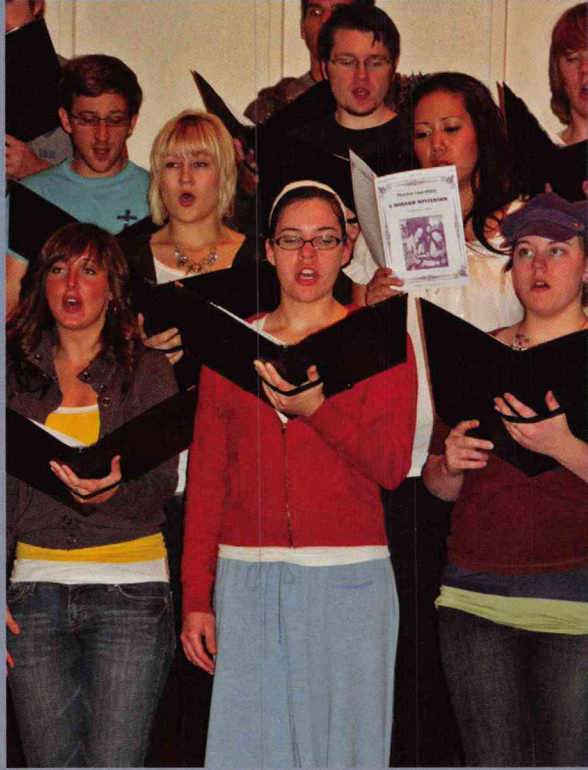

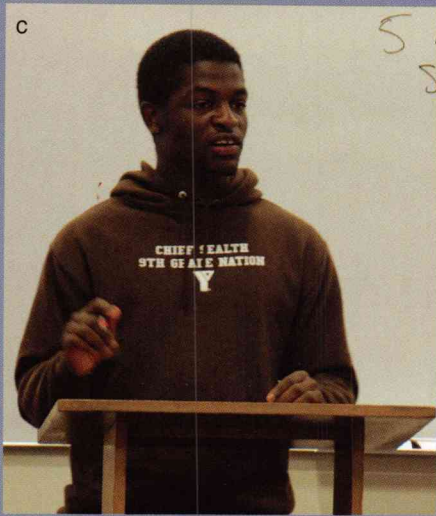

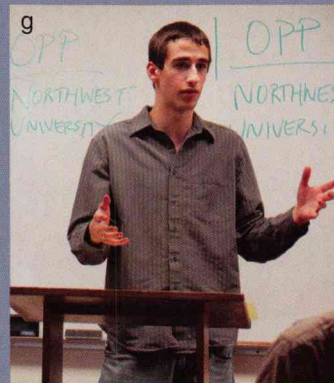

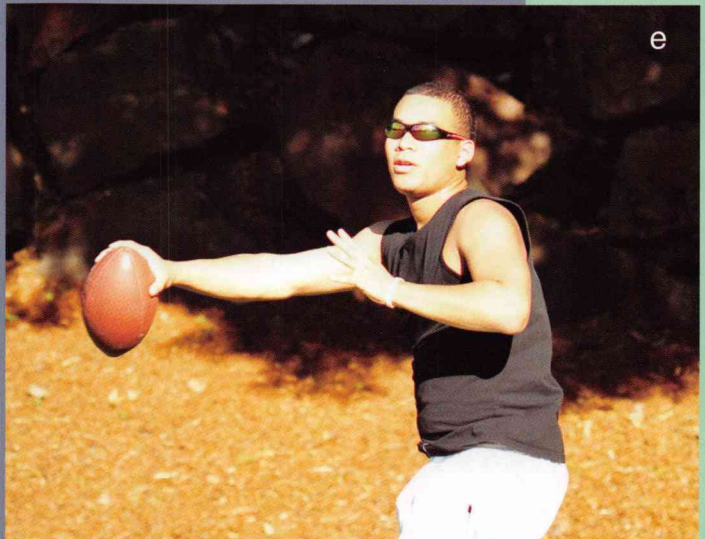
