




Letter From

PRESIDENT CASTLEBERRY

There is an old hymn, "On Christ the Solid Rock I stand." that declares: "I dare not trust the sweetest fame, but wholly lean on Jesus' name." The hymn recognizes that we can build our lives on all kinds of mental schemes or frames of mind, but in the end there is a truth that stands over and above all our thinking. Frames of mind can never fully account for reality. The whole truth is too complicated for any of us to grasp completely. Yet we yearn for such a grasp, and we routinely try to simplify the world by reducing it all to something we can get our heads wrapped around. Just like a person who holds up an empty frame, looks through it and says, "Here is the world!" we tend to devise mental frames and pretend that they explain everything. For some people, a political ideology becomes their window on the world. For others, a religious program is the telescope that defines their reality. Others see the world through the microscope of selfinterest and pettiness. Others train their magnifying glass on their circle of friends, their family, their job or academic discipline, their technology interface, or some other frame, game, or meme. While all of these things are real, none of them is adequate to serve as

the basis for their lives and futures.

One of the crucial benefits of a broad liberal arts education-something we insist upon for every Northwest University student--is that it gives students a variety of lenses or epistemologies through which to view their world. No lens is powerful enough to explain everything. We believe that God's Word is Truth, but with Matthew Arnold we also know that if you know only the Bible, you do not really even know the Bible. The more ways of knowing we take to the task of seeing the world, the more fully we will see it.

Years from now, we will all look back on these Northwest years through the lens of greater experience. Much of what we thought will have been amended through graduate study in the School of Hard Knocks. Yet no matter who we are, no matter what our calling has been, no matter what frames of mind we have tried. treasured, and trashed, there is one Truth that remains beyond all perspective--that Jesus Christ, the living God, "is Savior of all people, and especially those who believe" (1 Timothy 4:10, NIV). If we make the One who framed the world our frame of reference, interpreting all things through Christ Himself, we will truly find a Solid Rock of Truth.


















Chuck Steinhilber




Sciences
















Women's Volleyball



















Men's Soccer



Stephanie was also named a third team NAIA All-American selection as a defender. The combined effort of this dedicated team brought NU multiple shut-out victories, one of which earned them the title: Verizon Team of the Week. The Eagles ended the season with a 11-4-4 record, placing 3rd at Conference, and just missing a trip to the National Tournament by 1 goal in a game against Concordia, a team who has competed at Nationals now for the 11th year straight. NU fought hard to the end; they have a bright future ahead.












Country







Domi Mendezona earned honorable mention honors. The Eagles graduate Jackson as well as Ebany herd and Valerie Jordan, but look forward to coming back strong next year.




















Talent Show










Pursuit and NUMA




The Stump




100:Roos & Brumbies
