

TRANSFORMED

"Be ye transformed by the renewing of your mind . . ." is a powerful injunction. The goal and the means are both embodied in the one charge. Do it! Let it be! Don't obstruct it! Work at it!

The word suggests complete change in appearance and substance. It's a metamorphosis . . . like the change the caterpillar experiences when it turns into a butterfly. Now, that's more than a chameleon does when it changes color and blends into its surroundings. The chameleon only appears to change. The caterpillar's very nature is changed. It no longer crawls; it flies!

For the Christian, renewal of mind is critical to his change. The renewal of mind involves what is received and absorbed, how it is mixed and how it is dispensed - mental and spiritual ingestion, digestion and 'egestion."

This sounds so "expensive," so forbidding, so academic. But it's really not so. It's basic to the development of the Christian life and is what NC

NC is more than an academic setting. NC is a laboratory for the development of the whole spiritual life through experiential learning. Study it and then do it, is the guiding "light."

This is true in the classroom, the chapel and the dorm. It's true in Christian service, in social relationships.

We have courses in prayer and worship, in evangelism (the sharing of one's Christian life), as well as Bible, theology, and doctrine.

I'm deeply pleased with the content of the curriculum at NC. It is designed to build the student's life, to provide full opportunity for the change Paul enjoined. And we're always working at the "packaging," the way in which the curriculum is put together and the way in which the professors teach.

I'm deeply pleased, too, with the quality of NC's faculty. They're trained (never been better) and they're committed. And they work at it, developing their skills in "in service training."

I'm especially pleased with the product of NC, the students who have graduated and are serving our Lord and our church across the Northwest and throughout the world. I've been at Bible College work long enough — now my 21st year at NC — to have seen the students come, enjoy great change - yes, transformations - and go out prepared to change their world . . . wherever He places them. I watched a record number of grads go out last year. I've visited the grads at home and abroad and I'm impressed with the job that has been done.

Christian formation is a watchword at NC. It's part of transformation and it's going on right now.

STUDENT MINISTRIES

When students enter Northwest College they desire to be prepared for future ministry for the Lord, whether that be in professional or lay ministry. Alongside the excellent academic training they will receive at NC is the very practical preparation they can receive by being

involved in student ministries. The Associated Student Body has three Vice Presidents, one of which is the Vice President of Student Ministries, who works with his advisor in encouraging and guiding all our students into opportunities of ministry while they are at NC. Seven ministry groups are available for their participation: Campus Ministry, Children's Ministry, Community Ministry, Evangelism Ministry, Youth Ministry, and Servicemen's Ministry. Through these ministry groups and in other opportunities for practical Christian service, such as local church involvement, each student has the opportunity to minister for the Lord Jesus Christ in the "whitened harvest fields," while getting their academic training.

Many students are able to minister in practical ways as part of their requirements for graduation. Summer and Spring internships are available in the pastoral ministries, youth ministries, missions, sacred music, and Christian Ed majors. Practicums are also available in the Behavioral Science, and Elementary Education Majors, as well as in the Pastoral Care Minor. This gives students the opportunity to work alongside experienced people in their field to gain on-the-job training and experience.

Each year 15 to 25 students spend their summer traveling in ministry for the school in Summer Ministry Teams. Through music, drama, preaching, counseling, and one on one relationships, they are able to minister for the Lord in camps and churches throughout the Greater Northwest.

All of these student ministries give the opportunity to serve the Lord now as well as prepare the person experientially for ministry upon graduation.

STUDENT MISSIONS

While students are preparing academically and through student ministries, they are also given tremendous exposure to missions. The ASB Vice President for Missions with his advisor coordinate weekly missions chapels to acquaint our students with a variety of mis-

sionary outreaches, expose them to missionary guest speakers, and to give them a heart and burden for the work of missions. Prayer groups have been started by students to support through prayer various mission fields, individual missionaries, or a specific missionary endeavor. One group this past year met and prayed regularly for people throughout the world who were ministering to Buddhists.

The NC faculty have a great vision for missions and express it not only through their teaching but in their lives. Many faculty members have been involved in overseas missions work where they have spent weeks or months during the summer teaching in foreign Bible schools or institutes. Three of the newest faculty members at the College have a combined total of 48 years of missionary service in the Assemblies of God, which has a great impact upon the students sitting under their ministry.

During the summer students interested in Missions, particularly those in the Mission's Major, may participate in a Missionary Internship. Spending a summer on the Mission field, experiencing cultural shock, and working alongside a veteran Missionary sparks a fire in the heart of the student for Missions, that many times burns for a lifetime.

The large globe spinning slowly in the southwest corner of Butterfield Chapel with its flickering lights representing various missionaries throughout the world, is a constant reminder to NC students that we can help them carry the message of the gospel through our support in prayer and finances even while attending Northwest College.

PLACEMENT

Recent placement studies show that nearly two-thirds of the graduates surveyed in the 1986 graduating class entered some form of ministry or went on to seminary or graduate school. Another 21% entered teaching in Christian or public schools. The remaining 15% entered lay ministries or business vocations. Though the survey does not account for all of the 1986 grads, information was available on the majority (60%) of the

grads. Similar results were obtained on the 1985 class. They join hundreds of other NC grads around the world who have entered varying kinds of ministry.

The college makes a systematic effort to help its graduates find positions through its bulletin service and through its "senior profiles" which are published and made available to pastors, churches, district officers and others who seek staff personnel for their churches.

Because of the centrality of the Bible in Northwest College, we believe that we offer a unique educational opportunity for all fields of study.



In all areas of study the Bible is the textbook!


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

THE MAJORS AT NORTHWEST COLLEGE ARE DESIGNED TO PREPARE YOU FOR SERVICE AND LIFE:

BIBLICAL LITERATURE

The Biblical Literature major will (1) aid YOU in acquiring a broad knowledge of the background, content, and meaning of the Bible and (2) develop skills for further study and communication of the Bible.

BEHAVIORAL SCIENCE

The Behavioral Science major will provide the foundation for entrance into helping ministries such as the ministry of Pastoral Care and prepare YOU to enter graduate professional education as necessary for fulfilling the requirements for ministries such as Chaplaincy.

CHRISTIAN EDUCATION

The major in Christian Education provides YOU with the background necessary to serve the local church in the variety of Christian education ministries: minister of Christian Education, adult ministries, children's pastor and others.

ELEMENTARY EDUCATION

The major in Elementary Education will provide YOU with the knowledge and competency to work effectively in both public and private educational settings. The major requirements lead to Washington State Teacher Certification (K-8th grade).

MISSIONS

The major in Missions will develop YOUR understanding and appreciation for the mission of the Church in worldwide evangelism and equip YOU to engage in cross-cultural missions. The major will prepare YOU to meet the ministry requirements for missionary appointment.

PASTORAL MINISTRIES

The Pastoral Ministries major will prepare YOU for the ministry of pastorteacher by providing training in Biblical and theological studies and applied ministries skills, and by aiding YOU to develop a philosophy of ministry for pastoral service.

RELIGION AND PHILOSOPHY

The major in Religion and Philosophy will provide YOU with the educational background necessary for graduate education in a seminary or graduate school of religion that will be necessary in order to enter ministries such as military chaplaincies and Biblical and theological teaching.

SACRED MUSIC

The Sacred Music major will enable YOU to develop YOUR talents for the ministry of music in the local church, either in the leadership of the music ministries of the church or in specialized performance skills used for ministry to the church.

YOUTH MINISTRIES

The major in Youth Ministries will prepare YOU for ministry to youth in the local church and in the community by developing and integrating the Biblical, theological and psychological foundations necessary to actively minister to and evangelize-disciple junior high, high school and college students.

STUDENT LIFE

Students come to Northwest College from all over the world. While at NC, they establish friendships that are a source of encouragement and strength for a life time. Being surrounded by a caring faculty and student body makes adjustment to College much easier.

Student life at NC is exciting and stimulating, and many opportunities for involvement are provided. The ASB Vice President for Student Activities coordinates a myriad of fun events where students can fellowship and interact. Besides the organized All-School Picnic, Harvest Social, Olympic Night, and All-School Banquet, there is intramural sports, playing games in the dormitory lounge, going "burging," singing around a piano, or just talking, and more.

Competitive team sports at NC include: men's basketball and soccer, and women's basketball and volleyball. Northwest College is a member of the NCCAA Division II, as well as the NAIA District I for men's basketball.

The greater Seattle area also affords the student unlimited opportunities whether it be sports in the Kingdome or Coliseum, waterskiing on the many lakes, or snow skiing in the nearby Cascades. The metropolitan area also provides ample cultural and educational opportunities.

PUTTING THE FINANCIAL PUZZLE TOGETHER

PARENTS

Parental contribution in support of the student is one of the most significant parts of the financial package. Some save for many years, others include it in their monthly budget to provide college education for their children.

GRANTS

Northwest College is accredited by both AABC and the NASC — this means that our students are eligible for government grants in aid. These are significant in the overall package of many students who meet the financial need requirements. For

example, the PELL GRANT (Basic Federal Grant) has been increased for the next year from \$2100.00 maximum to \$2300.00 maximum. Other types available include the Washington State, and Oregon state, need grants; and the Supplemental Education Opportunity Grant.

SCHOLARSHIPS

A variety of scholarships are available through Northwest College and other organizations. Information is available through the NC Business Office.


