We looked at the reports for last year and then we stopped. We just had to take time to *praise God!*

When we started the year we needed \$258 per student in additional subsidy in order to balance the books and once again close the year in the black. We set a goal of \$150,000 and called it Mission 600. We shared the need with the friends of Northwest College, openly and precisely.

Hundred of friends responded...individuals and churches. Some gave subsidy for one student...some for two...some for four. Many gave \$25, \$50 or \$100. When we totaled the gifts we discovered we had a total of \$151,408.19. We made it!

What's more, our initial calculations were correct and we were able *because you responded* to close the year in the black...once again!

In a day when colleges are struggling..and some are even closing their doors...it can be said that NC is alive and well.

So we owe all of our friends who prayed...and who gave...a great big "Thank You." And we want you now to Praise God with us!



And We're Looking For Another Great Year!

Now we look to next year. The students are coming back...and hundreds more new students will join them.

What an *exciting time* those first days are...as well as the entire year.

Friends see each other again. New roomates are met. Class schedules are set. Jobs are found. And in many cases tearful good-byes to parents are



said. There are thoughts of orientation...of academics...of prayer and devotion times...of Fall Revival...and hundreds of other things...including new friends and perhaps even "someone special". So it is exciting.

But what have we planned for the students?

The Administrative Council met in a two-day retreat at the first of June. We call the retreat "Dream Days." We prayed and talked. In one prayer time two hours sped by. Its been sometime since I was in a prayer time like that one. We cried and called on God.

Then we talked of the special things planned for next year, of the Fall Revival with Vice President Rich Wilkerson. Of the youth ministers conference and the hundreds of youth workers who will join us for it. Of the missions convention and Rick Seaward

who will preach it and the 5,000 member church he started in Singapore ten years ago and the great missions work of that church. Of Paul Goodman, who will lead our pastors workshop. Of Bill Menzies and his special week on the great issues of life, of Dick Eastman and his School of Prayer. Of the worship teams and the great worship we experienced in the chapel last year and our hopes for the same this year. And we talked of much more.

And we selected a theme for next year, too. It is: "Whatever It Takes." It speaks to commitment and challenges one to probe the depths of his spiritam I willing "whatever it takes?" I am praying the students will feel the challenge of this...all year...and on.

In the midst of all these activities of enrichment each student will be in a fine, very special quality academic program preparing for a life calling...many of them for full-time church ministry.

As we left the retreat we felt good about next year. We have a great year planned for the students!

We said, "Now let's go put all that in motion."

So, Friend of Northwest, I ask you to join with us in prayer...even now as you read these lines mention NC (as the Apostle Paul would say) "before the throne of God". Ask with us that God will move by His Spirit on the students and make it a great year. Without His moving presence all our efforts are empty. "Unless the Lord build..." there's nothing. But when He does, great things are accomplished!



to Retire

Rev. Owen S. Hodges has announced his retirement and will pass on the responsibilities of the Vice President for Business Affairs to his successor Mr. Richard H. Garrison in August.


Rev. Hodges, a twenty-year veteran at the college, has held this post since 1967. Prior to that for fourteen years he served on the College's governing board while serving as District Secretary-Treasurer for the Montana District Council of the Assemblies of God. He has given thirty-four years to NC.

Though Mr. Hodges is retiring as Vice President for Business Affairs, he will continue with the college on a part-time basis as Director of Campus Maintenance, currently one of his duties.

The son of a Methodist minister who crossed the threshold into the Pentecostal movement, Rev. Hodges belongs to a vintage of Assemblies of God ministers that has "pioneer" roots in the movement. His early ministry was largely developed in Colorado and Montana. It was in Montana that Rev. Hodges was elected to one of the District's top executive positions as Secretary-Treasurer of the District, a post in which he served fourteen years. The Montana District Council was distinguished as the first district outside of the Northwest District Council of the Assemblies of God to join in the regional governance of the College.

Commenting on the significance of Brother Hodges and his long record of association and service to Northwest College, College President D.V. Hurst said..... "I have often characterized Owen Hodges a princely man. He manifests total sterling character, beautiful loyalty and commitment at all times. His long tenure speaks for itself. He is deeply appreciated by all who have served with him."

New Vice President for Business Affairs Selected




Mr. Richard H. Garrison


