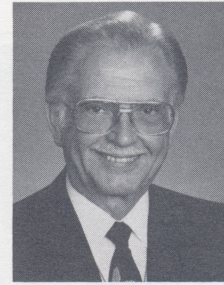

## P.S. PROJECT SHARE IS LAUNCHED

What a fast-moving semester we have already had! And what a time of inspiration, blessing and instruction for the collegians!

The semester opened with a 28 percent increase in the Freshman class. Early in the term we held the marvelous Youth Ministers Conference with almost 300 Youth Ministers present from all over the Northwest Region and beyond. So many of them were alumni now serving in churches. And the current students were deeply involved, too. At the same time we had a moving Fall Revival with Rich Wilkerson, our Vice President at Large. Student commitment to serve Christ with "Whatever it Takes" was the challenge.

And then there was the great Alumni and Friends Banquet October 2nd. It was filled with many touching times of reminiscing and projection for the future. That's what the banquet is all about--looking back and looking ahead.

At the banquet we announced our new funding effort for N.C. for the next two years--Project Share. Share stands for Student Help and Residence Expansion. Our goal is \$300,000. The funds will go in two directions. To "pay down" on twelve new apartments for married students with children. (Almost all of our units have only one bedroom.) By paying a sizable payment down on each unit we can keep the rental at an affordable rate for the students. What a help that will be! Housing costs keep going up around the college and its "tough" for students with children. We need to help them and we can in this way.

And then there is the need for more endowed scholarships to help stu-

dents who can't otherwise make it financially in college.

Just today--as I pen these lines...I heard of a student who had to drop out because of financial problems. We most urgently need to help such students.

We need to build the scholarship endowment fund so we can!

Our goal is \$300,000. We have prayed and asked God to help us reach the Friends and Family of N.C. with the need. We are praying they will respond.

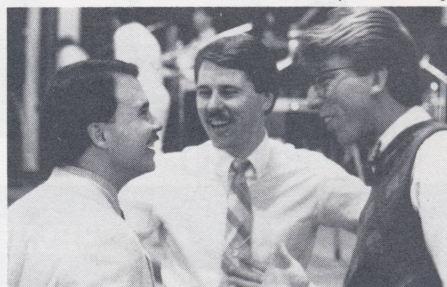
It is just that simple and I am just that straight forward about it. I have found that when I present the need...the opportunity to share, with the friends of N.C., they do respond and we reach our goal. We have done it again and again. That's why N.C. is what it is today!

In the months ahead we will be contacting all the Friends & Alumni of N.C. to give them an opportunity to join in Project Share.

By the way...we received over \$40,000 in cash gifts and pledges during the banquet. We're on our way. With God's help we believe we will reach the goal.

## NORTHWEST REGIONAL YOUTH WORKERS CONFERENCE-1987

We brought nearly 300 youth workers from a number of states (obviously

a majority from Oregon, Washington, Alaska, and California) here to Northwest College, and I believe they saw first-hand that God is moving by His Spirit on this campus. I had youth directors say to me, "I never realized that there was such a flow of God's Spirit here--the worship is dynamic." I



had a person tell me just this morning in chapel, "I came to this school (this was not a youth worker, but a student) from Hawaii, and I have only been saved for two years--I did not even know how to worship, I did not know about kneeling down and praying." I had one youth pastor, who came from Canada, say to me, "I came to this conference to go home and resign--I was going to quit the ministry entirely--and I began to realize at this conference that God is calling us to deny everything. To deny all of our own personal ambitions and follow after Christ, no matter what He says, no matter what people say to me, no matter what the response out there, if there is a call of God on my life, I have got to go with it." He said, "I am going home revolutionized, I am

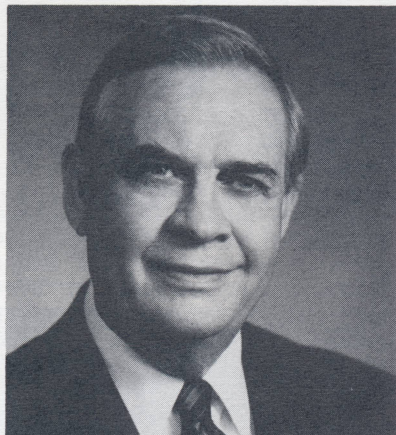


## TRIBUTE TO AN ALUMNUS

### CLIFFORD HOBSON: A MAN WITH A PASTOR'S HEART

Clifford Hobson came to Northwest College in September 1940 and graduated in May 1943. He served on the Board of Directors of the college for sixteen years. As a distinguished alumnus of N.C., he represented its cause and purpose in a most exemplary way. He was called home suddenly on June 6, 1987 after a one day illness. His memorial service was conducted in the chapel of the college he loved and supported.

Few men have expressed a heart for the pastoral ministry in more practical ways than Clifford Hobson. His early ministry was "down in the ranks" of the pastorate, including a home-missions pastorate. He pastored for twenty-eight years in the Yakima valley...Richland A/G, Stone Church, goldendale A/G, Union Gap A/G, and Mabton A/G before coming to the District Office where he served for sixteen years.

Brother Hobson's heart for the small home-missions church and pastorate led him on many an arduous trip to the out-of-the-way places to minister and to encourage pastors and their congregations. Often he would stop and spend time in small towns when driving through to spend an afternoon encouraging young and older pastors who labored in difficult and perhaps unglamorous fields.

Though he labored across a broad spectrum of duties from college boards to presbyteries, commissions, and committees, Clifford Hobson's heartbeat was the same as that of the Good Sheperd, our Lord Jesus Christ, who focused on the needs, the concerns, the encouragement, and the well-being of pastors and churches off the beaten path. His memorial request expressed that heart-beat. It was a memorial fund in behalf of home-missions. Could this come from anything less than a man with a sheperd's heart? Clifford Hobson was a shepherd with a shepherd's heart. "And when the Chief Shepherd shall appear he shall receive a crown of glory that fadeth not away." (1 Peter 5:5).

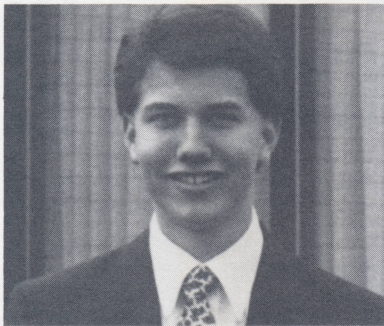
Only time and eternity will tell what the results of these meetings will be in and through the lives of the students at Northwest College during the week of September 28-October 2, 1987.

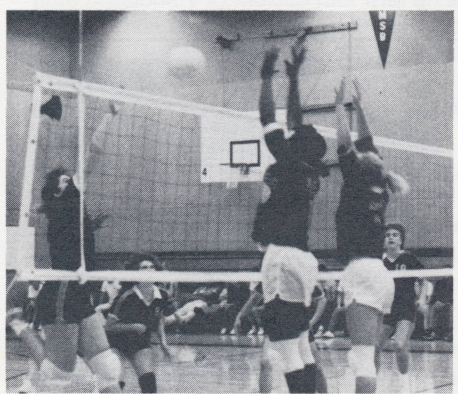
