

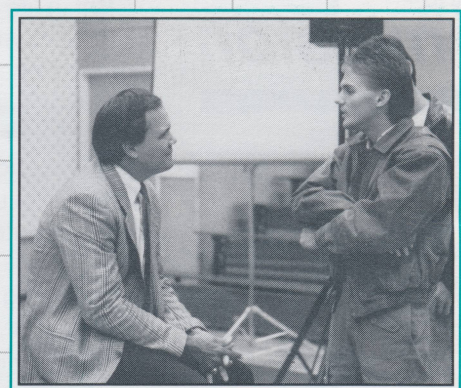

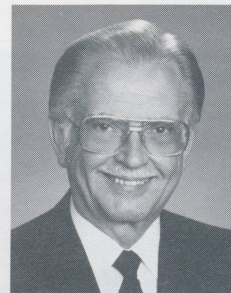

Chosen To Serve

This year's theme is "Chosen To Serve". The chapel banner keeps it before the student body all year.

Chapel messages, devotionals and other means have been used to focus attention on this all-important fact throughout the year. It's a theme that goes right to the heart of N.C.'s mission and the reason the students choose to attend N.C. in place of a state school or some other institution.

This is a theme that moved through the Apostle Paul's entire ministry. He was chosen to serve...chosen to suffer and glorify Christ in it (Acts 9). It was the message Ananias was called on to deliver to Paul at the time of his conversion. The words seem almost contradictory--"Chosen"-to-"Serve." Usually one would think of being chosen to rule, to excel or for some "lofty" purpose.

But in life and message Jesus made it clear that the truly lofty position was one of service. Prophetically he was called "the suffering servant." In life He fulfilled that calling...that choice. In message He said, "Take up your cross..." and "To be the greatest...serve!"

DEDICATION OF PROJECT SHARE APARTMENT COMPLEX

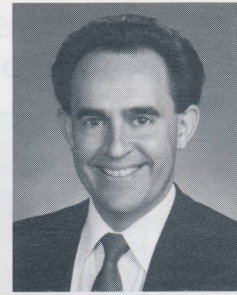

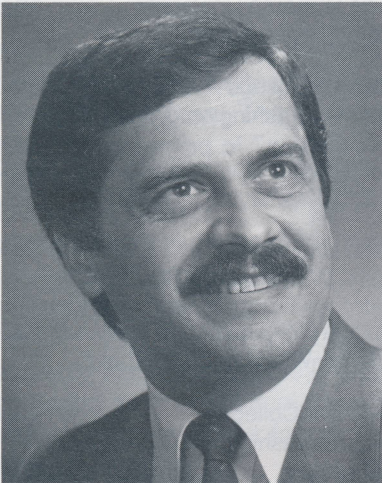

MISSIONS CONVENTION FEATURING PETER KUZMIC

Dr. Peter Kuzmic will be the featured speaker at the 1990 Missions Convention here at N.C., to be held February 5-9. Dr. Kuzmic, a native Yugoslavian, is the foremost evangelical scholar in that nation and is considered an authority on the subject of Christian and Marxist dialogue.

Dr. Kuzmic, who is fluent in several languages, is a graduate of a Bible college in Erzhausen, Germany; Southern California College (B.A.), Costa Mesa, California; Wheaton College Graduate School (M.A.), Chicago, Illinois; and the Catholic Faculty of Theology in Zagreb, Yugoslavia (Ph.D.), completing all of his studies summa cum laude.

Dr. Kuzmic's impact on this part of the world reaches beyond his normal pastoral duties:

- He founded and currently directs the Biblical Theological Institute in Osijek.
- He is on the executive committee of the Fellowship of European Evangelical Theologians.
- He is a member of the Lausanne Committee for World

Evangelization and its Theology Working Group.

- He is on the advisory board of the World Vision International.
- He is the first Pentecostal to head the Theological Commission of World Evangelical Fellowship.
- He is the author of several books.

Peter is currently pastoring a growing Pentecostal church in Osijek, serves as an adjunct professor to Fuller Theological Seminary's School of World Missions, and travels extensively as a lecturer. We are pleased to have him here at N.C. as our Missions Convention speaker this year.

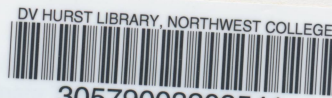
