## TO JUNIOR COLLEGE STUDENTS

Re: Tests

The following is a digest of information recently received from Selective Service Headquarters relative to retention or reclassification of registrants now in Class II-S (regular college).

- 1. Selective Service qualification tests will be administered throughout the country in May and June as described below.
  - These tests are optional, and the results will be used by local boards in considering classification eligibility.
- 2. The results of the tests would be used in addition to other criteria now or about to be used by boards (full-time satisfactory academic work, class rank).
- 3. If you feel that it would be to your <u>advantage</u> to take the tests for the purpose of attaining or retaining your II-S classification, <u>take</u> note of the following:
  - a. Dates to be given: May 14, May 21, June 3.
  - b. How to sign up for them:
    - 1) Secure application from any local board of <u>Selective Service System</u> (can write in for them).\*/
    - 2) Send application to Science Research Associates

It should be postmarked no later than April 23, 1966.

3) Tests will be administered on the above dates in the local area at two centers: a) Seattle University; b) University of Washington.

The assumed advantage to be gained from taking the tests would be to establish additional data to your local board by which to gain or retain a college deferment, i.e., students who do not qualify by class standing may be deferred by a satisfactory score in the test.

## TO MINISTERIAL STUDENTS

If you are a ministerial student and have so declared yourself, you should insist on classification IV-D, which is a distinctive classification not to be confused with the regular college deferred status of II-S. An appeal letter should be directed to your local board requesting reclassification if you are in this category.
