SELECTIVE SERVICE: Some clarification on the Selective Service qualification tests coming up next month is given as follows:

1. They are NOT required.
2. They COULD BE USEFUL to II-S students IF they are:
 - 1st year students in lower half of their class in grade rank (among men students only).
 - 2nd year students one lower 1/3 of their class in grade rank (men students)
 - 3rd year students in lower 1/4 of classes in grade rank.
3. A score of 70 or more on the tests will qualify a student for deferment, if he does not qualify according to the scale in No. 2 above.
4. This does NOT apply to ministerial students. Ministerial students must maintain satisfactory load--and performance levels with the college, however.
5. If there are JC students who feel they could BENEFIT by taking the tests, they should do the following:
 - (1) Pick up application from a Selective Service office.
 - (2) Send it in to the testing service.
 - (3) Take the test at the time and place designated by the testing service.

Some of this information is based on information from State Selective Service Headquarters and some on press reports.

A MATTER OF EXPLANATION: Since the College is a public-testing center for the General Educational Development Tests, not infrequently non-students will appear on the campus to write the tests. The understanding and courtesy of our students toward them is appreciation.
