TO: STUDENTS OF NORTHWEST COLLEGE OF THE ASSEMBLIES OF GOD

Following is an outline of benefits for which you are eligible while an enrolled student, provided the applicable fee has been paid by you or on your behalf:

- 1. Treatment by a physician or surgeon (M.D. or D.O.), hospital and nurse (R.N.) for those reasonable and customary expenses incurred up to a maximum of \$1000.00 for any one accidental injury. This coverage extends to injuries sustained while participating in intramural sports including "Church League" basketball.
- 2. Treatment by a dentist for those reasonable and customary expenses incurred up to a maximum of \$500.00 for any one covered accident for injury to sound, natural teeth. (Maximum for repair or replacement of any one tooth is \$100.00).
- 3. For illness that has its origin after the effective date of coverage the following benefits will be paid:
 - a. 30 days hospital care in a general, non-governmental hospital up to \$15.00 per day for board and room plus \$150.00 for miscellaneous hospital extras.
 - b. Surgical care in accordance with the schedule up to a maximum of \$300.00.
 - c. Doctor visits in the hospital up to \$3.00 per visit while eligible for board and room.
 - d. Ambulance service up to \$15.00.

This is a brief outline of your benefits and not a contract. The Master Policy is on file with the College Office and is available for reference upon request.

In the event of an injury covered under the program, <u>notify the School promptly</u>. The School will furnish you information on how to present your claim and a claim form.

This plan does not cover eye refractions, eyeglasses or prescriptions; dental expense; non-commercial air travel; injuries caused by war or act of war; hernia; injuries occurring during any period you are on vacation; service or treatment rendered as a part of the school services by a physician or any other person employed or retained by the School; skiing; football; care in a government hospital; or injuries sustained while employed.

This plan also provides an accidental death benefit of \$1000.00.
