MEN STUDENTS: Those who drop below the minimum full-time load of 12 credits or those who fail to earn enough credits during the school year to gain advanced student classification in keeping with the Selective Service Normal Progress definition may expect difficulties in retaining their student deferments. This appears all the more imminent in view of expected changes in the Selective Service laws. To be on the safe side, men students are advised to keep their academic loads up to the normal 15-credit-hour level at all times.

If you are definitely interested would you please sign the paper provided at the college reception desk in the Administration Building.
