## FRESHMAN INITIATION ACTIVITIES

The following is a list of the activities each Freshman will have to go through during the Freshman Initiation Week. Each day one activity will be added.

- MONDAY            EACH FRESHMAN SHALL wear a beanie, either home-made or otherwise. A grand prize will be awarded to the person with the most original beanie.
- TUESDAY           EACH FRESHMAN SHALL carry all his/her books, papers, pencils, pens, combs, mirrors, etc., in a pillowcase.
- WEDNESDAY        EACH FRESHMAN SHALL wear miss-matched socks. (Socks must be visible--nylons do not count.)
- THURSDAY         EACH FRESHMAN SHALL wear miss-matched shoes.
- FRIDAY            EACH FRESHMAN SHALL have one painted black eye. The paint for such will be located in each of the restrooms of the Residence Halls and in the Chapel restrooms. This activity will be self-inflicted.
