No disappointment!! Much was in store.

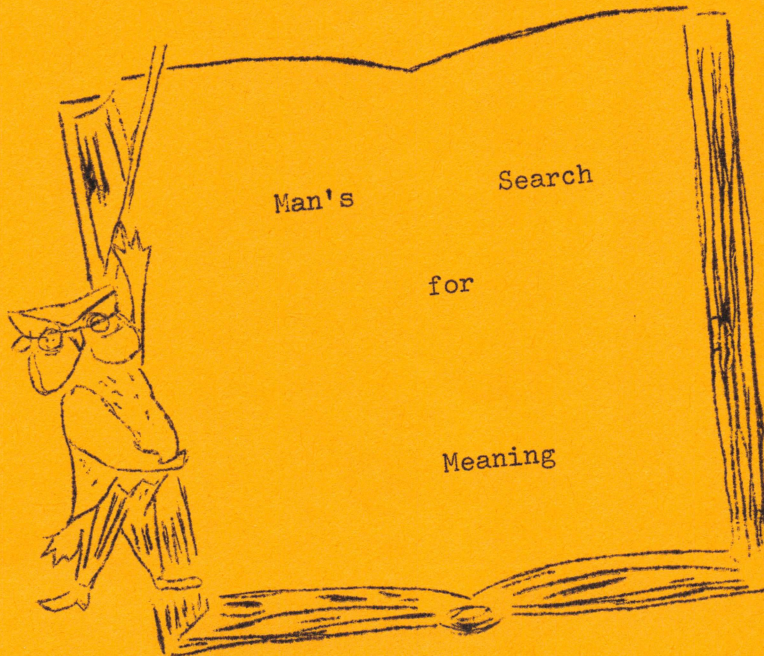
