WHAT SHOULD WE DO?

On May 5th I was contacted by a coalition of associated student body presidents for world peace. The purpose of this coalition was to organize a "peace march" in downtown Seattle on Sunday, May 10th. The purpose of the march was to protest the slayings at Kent University and the United States' involvement in Cambodia.

The committee for world peace contacted me hoping that I would help in the organization of this march and that I would urge my student body to participate. However, because of my strong convictions based on our biblical principle of respecting those who have authority over us, and because of my strong convictions against the Communist involvement in Indo China, I informed the committee for world peace that the students of Northwest College support the policy of the President of the United States. We will not participate; neither will we support the march protesting U. S. involvement in Cambodia.

What should we do? As Christians our duty is to pray. We must pray for spiritual renewal in our own lives and we must pray for God's help in our world of political turmoil and sin. Many students sense a need for a time of real soul searching. The Scriptures say, "They that wait upon the Lord shall renew their strength." For this purpose, Tuesday, May 12th, will be a day of prayer and fasting lasting from 1:30 p.m. to 6:30 a.m. the following morning. I urge all interested students and faculty to participate.
