HOLIDAY DATE CHANGES AFFECTING THIS YEAR

Due to a Congressional act fixing the date of certain national holidays on a fixed pattern of falling on Monday, it should be noted that Washington's Birthday will be observed this year on February 15<sup>th</sup>. In the interest of concluding the school year as early as possible, it had been our plan to have Memorial Day as a day off on the college calendar in the Spring. However, since under the new date pattern Memorial Day would fall on Monday, May 31<sup>st</sup>, it was decided by the faculty to seek an expression from the students as to their preference. You will be asked to indicate your preference in a chapel hour. They are:

1. Would prefer NOT to observe Memorial Day as a holiday in the school calendar in order to get out of school one day earlier in the spring term. (Final exams would be scheduled for the morning hours of that date.)
2. Would prefer to have Memorial Day observed as a holiday and extend the quarter by one day.
