## GOING TO BE AROUND THANKSGIVING?

For those who must be on campus or in the area over the Thanksgiving Holiday break, why not plan to attend the "Turkey Day" Basketball Tournament at Northwest College! This will be the first appearance of the year for the NC Eagles and three other colleges from the Northwest and Canada will be participating.

Games will be played at 6:00 and 8:00 p.m. on both Friday, November 27, and Saturday, November 28, 1970. First round pairings pit Northwest College against Trinity at 6:00 on Friday evening followed by the Northwest Christian-Puget Sound contest at 8:00. On Saturday evening Friday night's losers will play at 6:00 with the championship to be decided at 8:00. Admission will be \$1.00 for adults and \$.50 for high school and college students with ID. Children under 12 will be admitted without charge. All games will be played in the Northwest College Pavilion on the NC campus.

Yes, students can watch all the games, both nights, for just 50 cents. And, you can bring or invite all the friends you want. This will be an exciting way to spend Thanksgiving vacation. Don't miss it!

### Particulars on schools involved:

**NORTHWEST COLLEGE** - Coming off a strong third place finish in their league the Eagles rely on aggressive defense and a controlled fast break led by 6'-1" senior Dennis Lalance, a three-time All-Conference selection. The Eagles are coached by Jim Hillbrick and Leroy Johnson. Enrollment stands around 500.

**PUGET SOUND COLLEGE OF THE BIBLE** - The co-hosts for the tourney are also members of the Pacific Northwest College Conference. The Anchormen depend on defensive quickness and a firehouse fast break led by 5'-9" Randy Wheeler (3rd leading scorer in the PNCC last season) and Don Orr. Rugged 6'-6" post man Steve Burriss provides solid rebounding and inside scoring punch. The Anchormen are coached by Jim Laddux and Barney Wimer. Enrollment was a new high last year with 150.

**NORTHWEST CHRISTIAN COLLEGE** - From Eugene, Oregon, the second place finisher in the PNCC last season, the Crusaders feature rugged rebounding and balanced offense. Main cogs in the attack are 5'-11" senior guard Dave Lipp, 6'-3" senior forward Jan Clements and 6'-4" sophomore post man John Richardson. NCC enrolls about 400, and is coached by Duane Cox.

**TRINITY JUNIOR COLLEGE** - From Langley, B.C., come the Spartans with exceptional outside shooting paced by returnees Pat Lee (6'-2" sophomore), Harvey Engbrecht (6'-3" sophomore) and Jeff Thomas (6'-2" sophomore). Lee was named to the All-Star Provincial JC team last season. Coached by Jake Braun the Spartans campus enrolls about 350 students.
